TCAP (Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program) Achievement Test	3-8	This test is given to comply with Every Student Succeeds Act § 1177 and Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) §49-1-602.	TCAP assessments measure students' skills in English-Language Arts, math, science and social studies. Test results are used in teacher, school, and district accountability with the State of Tennessee and the Federal Government. Results also count for 10% of a student's final grade in those subjects.	April 17 – May 5, 2017	"Quick score" results are typically available soon after the test is given so teachers can calculate final grades. Later the state releases more detailed individual student reports. These are distributed by district office staff to schools and then shared with families.

These assessments measure a student's skills in high school English, Integrated Math, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Biology I, Chemistry, and U.S. History. Test results are used in teacher, school, and district accountability with the State of Tennessee and the Federal Government. Results also count for 25% of a student's final grade in those subjects.	November 28 – December 16, 2016  April 17 – May 5, 2017	"Quick score" results are typically available soon after the test is given so teachers can calculate final grades. Later the state releases more detailed individual student reports. These are distributed by district office staff to schools and then shared with families.

TCAP Alt-Portfolio Assessment	3-11	This assessment is given to comply with Every Student Succeeds Act §1177 and Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) §49-1-602.	This assessment is designed for students with significant intellectual disabilities. It is based on a different set of content standards than the TCAP test. Students only take the alt-portfolio assessment when parents/guardians and education decide it is appropriate according to the students' needs.	March 6 – May 12, 2017	The state releases individual student reports with details of performance. These are distributed by district staff to schools and then shared with families.

U.S. Civics Exam	9-12	This test is given to comply with Tennessee Code Annotated §49-6-408.	Students graduating after January 1, 2017, are required to take a United States civics exam composed of questions administered as part of the civics test administered by the U.S. citizenship and immigration services to persons seeking to become naturalized citizens. Students may attempt the test multiple times during their high school career. Passage of the test is not a requirement for high school graduation.	School schedules as necessary	Results are available soon after the test is given. School staff decide when and how to share the results with students and parents.
<b>College &amp; Career Readiness</b>

ACT	11-12	This test is given to comply with Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) §49-6-6001 (b).	The ACT is a college readiness test utilized by hundreds of colleges and universities. It also helps determine which students are eligible for the HOPE scholarship from the state.	April 19 – May 3, 2017 Make-up Date: May 3, 2017	Student-level reports are provided 3-8 weeks after the test is administered.
<b>Screenings for Academic Support</b>					
Response to Instruction and Intervention (RTI <sup>2</sup> ) Benchmark Universal Screener	K-12	This test is given to comply with the Individual with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) of 2004 34 CFR 300.8(c)(10) and TN Special Education and Services Act 0520-01-09 Rule 0520-01-09-12.	RTI <sup>2</sup> (Response to Instruction and Intervention) is a multi-tier approach to the early identification and support of students with learning and behavior needs. The RTI <sup>2</sup> process begins with high-quality instruction and universal screening of all children in the general education classroom. It includes periodic assessments to identify each student's specific needs in reading, writing and math so they can get the appropriate level of instruction.	January 9 – 27, 2017 May 8 – 24, 2017	Student-level reports should be shared with parents by the school. Students who take part in intervention will receive regular progress reports for parents and guardians.
WIDA ACCESS for English Learners	K-12	This test is given to comply with the Every Student Succeeds Act §1177.	This assessment evaluates language proficiency of English Learner students.	March 6 – April 21	The state releases individual student reports. These are distributed by district office staff to schools and then shared with families.
