DEER

- Statewide bag limit: 2 antlered deer. No more than 1 per day. See the *2017-18 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide* for deer units, county listings, and the new definition of antlered deer.

A **Sept. 23-Oct. 27, Oct. 30-Nov. 3**
Antlerless bag: Units A, B, C, D=4; Unit L=3/day, no season limit

G/M/A **Young Sportsman (ages 6-16):**
Oct. 28-29, Jan. 13-14, 2018
Antlerless bag: Units A, B, C, D=2; Unit L=3/day

M/A **Nov. 4-Nov. 17**
Antlerless bag: Units A, B=2; Units C, D=1
Unit L=3/day

G/M/A **Nov. 18-Jan. 7, 2018**
Antlerless bag: Unit A=2; Units B, C, D=1
Unit L=3/day

G/M/A **Unit L - private lands: antlerless only; Jan. 8-12, 2018: 3/day; no antlered deer**

ELK (QUOTA HUNT)

A **Sept. 30- Oct. 6**
7 permits, 1 antlered elk/permit

G/M/A **Young Sportsman (resident only, ages 13-16):**
Oct. 7-13; 1 permit for 1 antlered elk

G/M/A **Oct. 14-20**
7 permits, 1 antlered elk/permit

BLACK BEAR

Bag limit: 1 per license year. Cubs under 75 lbs. are prohibited.

A **No dogs: Sept. 23-Oct. 20**
Zones 1, 2, 3, 4, Transitional

G/M/A **Dogs allowed: Sept. 25-Oct. 1** **Zone 2**

G/M/A **Dogs allowed: Sept. 30-Oct. 8** **Zone 3**

G/M/A **Dogs allowed: Oct. 2-6** **Zone 1**

G/M/A **No dogs, Young Sportsman (ages 6-16):**
Oct. 28-29 **Zones 1, 2, 3**

G/M/A **Dogs allowed: Oct. 30-Nov. 3** **Zones 1, 2, 3**

G/M/A **No dogs: Nov. 18-21** **Zones 1, 2, 3**

G/M/A **Dogs allowed: Nov. 27-Dec. 10** **Zone 3**

- Bag Limit: 1 turkey, either sex, per county, only in counties open to fall turkey hunting. See the *2017-18 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide* for listing.

S/A **Young Sportsman (ages 6-16): Mar. 24-25, 2018**
Daily bag: 1 bearded bird per day. Counts toward spring season bag of four (4).

S/A **Mar. 31-May 13, 2018**
Bag limit: 4 bearded birds. No more than 1 per day.
