Extending Contracts for Directors of Schools

QUESTION

May a school board legally extend the term of its contract with the director of schools during the contract term?

OPINION

Yes, a school board may extend such a contract in accordance with Tenn. Code Ann. 49-2-203(a)(14)(C).

ANALYSIS

This opinion request concerns a question previously addressed by Tenn. Att'y Gen. Op. 01-102 (June 22, 2001), concerning the authority of a school board to extend the contract of a director of schools during the contract term. The previous opinion correctly stated that, at that time, Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-2-203 did not provide for such authority.

However, the statute has since been amended to permit the extension of such contracts, providing in relevant part as follows:

No school board *shall extend* the contract of a director of schools without giving notice of the intent to do so at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the scheduled meeting at which action shall be taken... Notice of extension ... of a contract of a director of schools shall include the date, time and place of the meeting, and shall comport with all other requirements of §§ 8-44-103 and 49-2-202(c)(1). The proposed action shall be published as a specific, clearly stated item on the agenda for the meeting. Such item, for the convenience of the public attending the meeting, shall be the first item on the agenda;

Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-2-203(a)(14)(C) (emphasis added). Accordingly, school boards may now legally extend the term of a contract with the director of schools during the contract term, provided that all of the requirements set forth in Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-2-203(a)(14)(C) are satisfied.
