Building Career Knowledge and Navigation Skills along the WBL Spectrum

Students need the opportunity to practice Career Knowledge and Navigation Skills prior to starting a capstone experience. This chart provides course standards from <u>Work-Based Learning: Career Practicum (6105)</u> in the left column. To the right, examples are provided of ways in which students may demonstrate that skill through earlier activities at the Industry and Career Awareness, Career Exploration, and Career Preparation and Training Levels. These are provided as examples only and do not reflect Career Practicum course requirements.

Standard #2 from Work-Based Learning: Career Practicum (6105): Plan and navigate education and career paths aligned with personal goals: Observe and analyze organizational culture and practices, e.g., how to interact with supervisors, clients, and co-workers, and how to recognize and address health, safety, and sustainability issues. Seek information from supervisors and other employees about appropriate methods of finding and securing employment in the industry and what knowledge, skills, and educational credentials are required. Use the learning experience to review and update the student's long-term education and career goals based on the knowledge and feedback acquired. Proactively identify areas of strength and opportunities for professional growth, encourage and act on feedback from peers, supervisors, and customers, and seek and use resources and support to improve skills.	Through exposure to career speakers and tours, provide at least five examples of career options that exist in the career area of interest. Prepare questions for speaker or tour hosts on the following: Career options in the industry or field represented Career options in the specific company or organization represented Education credentials required Workplace culture and norms Safety issues at the workplace Skills required for entry-level employment and long-term success. Provide at least three examples of career options in the industry or field represented. Describe the academic and educational requirements for one of the careers. Complete a preliminary resume based on career awareness and career exploration activities, listing skills and accomplishments. Modify and refine list of career options identified in career awareness experiences based on deeper understanding of those careers gleaned from career exploration activities like an informational interview or job shadow, and a self-appraisal of strengths as well as interests. Prepare questions working professionals interviewed or shadowed: Nature of work Education and skills required Long-term employment outlook Salary and earning potential Sources of satisfaction and frustration Health and safety issues Share preliminary resume with peers, teachers, and working professionals and ask for feedback. During the immersion experience, e.g. internship, school-based enterprise, service learning, or industry-informed project: Conduct interviews with supervisor, HR director or industry mentor about career options within the industry and the appropriate methods for seeing employment in that industry (e.g. networks and electronic tools used). Analyze organizational culture and practices within the workplace environment. Demonstrate understanding of workplace practices and safety issues. Demonstrate understanding of how to interact with supervisors, clients and co-workers (understanding of office hours, appropriate use of email and social media, team norms, etc.). Document the knowledge, skills and educational levels of at least three employees in the organization or field. Enlist support of supervisor and colleagues through request for letters of recommendation or inclusion in appropriate professional networks. Explore future opportunities with the same organization or others in the same or a different field. Enlist support as needed to complete applications to appropriate postsecondary institutions, including apprenticeship programs and certificate programs, as well as 2- and 4-year degree programs. Complete reflection and thank you letters identifying the most important things learned.

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Standard #3 from Work-Based Learning: Career Practicum (6105): Develop and implement a personalized learning plan: Develop a Personalized Learning Plan specific to the student's placement or project, in accordance with approved policies. Participate in ongoing review and communications to determine progress against the plan with relevant stakeholders where necessary. a. Select and apply appropriate technical skills to accurately solve problems and perform expected tasks related to the work-based learning experience as outlined by the student's elective focus. b. 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Standard #4 from Work-Based Learning: Career Practicum (6105): Reflect on experiences through creation of a personal portfolio: Create a personal portfolio, or similar collection of work, that illustrates mastery of skills and knowledge outlined in the Career Practicum course standards and the personalized learning plan. Identify and collect artifacts and/or work products that reflect the skills developed and knowledge gained through the WBL experience. Assess personal growth through thoughtful reflection and accurately self-assess to identify opportunities for further growth and development in the future.
