Frequently Asked Questions

General Redelivery Questions

Will the digital materials cover all grades levels and content areas?

Yes, you have access to the digital materials for all grade bands and content areas in the "Redelivery Materials" folder.

Where do I find the standards document?

Can I share the digital materials with others in my district?

Is there a significant difference between the information being provided to the various grade levels?

Yes, each grade level will work with different standards; however, the actives and structure are largely the same.

Are the examples modified to specific grade bands?

Yes, each presentation and Participant Manual references examples and activities that address grade-specific standards.

Are the presentations and notes printable?

Yes, you may download the presentations to print them with the included notes.

Will the end-of-year assessments be aligned to these standards?

Can you clarify "I can statements" vs "essential questions?"

"I can statements" are statements a student should be able to make upon mastery of the standard. An essential question is a question to ask in order to determine mastery. Both must be aligned to the intent and purpose of the standard.



ELA Specific Questions

Should we use different texts in order for students with various reading levels to meet the standard?

Yes, texts should be selected based on qualitative measures, quantitative measures, and the skills of the reader. Multiple texts should be intentionally sequenced to have a progression of text complexity that will aid in student comprehension.

What format do you recommend for our redelivery training?

You may use any format you would like. The statewide trainings will take place over two days in group settings. If you would like to consolidate the training into one day, or incorporate the content into existing professional development sessions, please feel free to do so.

Compared to previous years' standards, there appears to be more focus on grammar. What is the balance between grammar and reading skills?

Grammar and reading should be taught in an integrated manner. The skills taught in the standards support each other across grades and within a single grade.

Will the texts be included in the materials?

Yes, all texts are included in the Participant Manuals.
