



 - C. Make copies available to parents/legal guardians and students upon request






Rule 0520-01-17-.01: Maximum Class Size


- 1(f) "Remote Instruction" means instruction that takes place when teachers are not providing inperson instruction to students within the traditional school setting. Remote instruction does not include operation of a virtual school pursuant to T.C.A. Title 49, Chapter 16 and State Board rules.
- (12) Remote Instruction provided by a non-virtual public school, including a public charter school, pursuant to the LEA's or public charter school's approved CLP, shall be considered a virtual education program for purposes of compliance with T.C.A. § 49-1-104 (h).
- (13) For purposes of compliance with T.C.A. § 49-1-104 (h), the following class size standards shall apply to public virtual schools and virtual education programs for the 2020-21 school year:
 - (a) A public virtual school or virtual education program may increase the enrollment in virtual classes by up to twenty-five percent (25%) over the class size maximum established by T.C.A. § 49-1-104.
 - (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (13)(a), public virtual schools and virtual education programs shall continue to comply with class size and case load requirements for special education . . .

Grade Level	<u>Average</u>	Maximum Class Size
K-3	20	25
4-6	25	30
7-12	30	35
CTE	20	25





Rule 0520-14-01-.06: Charter Agreement Amendments

- \Box Change in governance structure (including, but not limited to, a change in the nonprofit entity governing the school), or addition of or changes to the charter management organization
- ☐ The addition or removal of a grade level or levels
- ☐ Changes in student enrollment which fall outside of the minimum or maximum enrollment thresholds set forth in the charter school's charter agreement
- ☐ The addition or removal of a plan to provide transportation to students attending the charter school
- ☐ Changes to the charter school's location, if outside the geographic area set forth in the charter agreement
- ☐ Changes to the charter school's academic focus set forth in the charter agreement
- ☐ Changes identified in the charter agreement as material modifications or amendments.
- \square Other material change not covered by any of the above categories.
- ☐ EMERGENCY Petition






Charter Agreement Amendments Timeline:

- > Fall:
 - Letter of Intent due September 1
 - Application due October 1
 - MUST use for increases in enrollment or adding grades
- Spring:
 - Letter of Intent due January 15
 - Application due February 14
- Emergency Petitions
- Charter Agreement Amendment Link
- Training through the TCSC on Tuesday, August 25 at 11 AM CT






TNCompass Educator Reporting

- Educators must be accurately reported in TNCompass for the "Year End Experience" report
- Purpose: Educators obtain experiential credit toward their licenses for the 2019-20 year
- Formerly: LEAs entered information for charters
- New: Charters must enter information directly into TNCompass
- Refer to the TNCompass Salary Management Guide in the Resources section of TNCompass: https://tncompass.org/Account/Login
- Pre-requisite: Complete the December 1 report








Remote Technology Grant: \$50 million


- 2:1 Match Program: TDOE Reimburses \$200 for every 3 devices purchased with state or local funds between March 1, 2020 and September 1, 2020
- Applies to any device = laptop or tablet. NOT connectivity/hotspots
- Applications are due September 1, 2020
- TDOE is prioritizing device purchases for grades 3-12










(5) Click on the **Edit Documents** to download or upload documents.




Grants - Connectivity

Connectivity Grant - \$15 million


- \$150 per household for providing internet connectivity to families
- MiFi devices and data coverage for the <u>first semester</u> <u>only</u>; schools should have a plan for funding these amounts sustainably
- TDOE will determine the total need and what percentage of that amount can be funded



Grants - LEA Reopening

Reopening & Programmatic Support Grants - \$11 million

- Supports purchases necessary to implement Sections 3, 5 and 6 of your Continuous Learning Plans
- A full list of allowable expenditures is located in the funding application found here. Note: No salaries.
- Each applying charter school will be allocated \$5,000
- Application deadline: September 18, 2020
- All reimbursements must be submitted in ePlan by December 1, 2020



Grants – LEA Reopening

- All Continuous Learning Plan Directors were automatically given the LEA Reopening and Programmatic Supports Director role; check your ePlan Address Book to see who has this role.
- Search Funding Applications -> LEA Reopening and Programmatic Supports Grant
- Draft Start, upload documents, Draft Complete
- Approvals by the LEA Fiscal Representative, LEA Authorized Representative, then TDOE





Grants - LEA Reopening

Requirements:

- Budget table section must be complete (line item, cost, and narrative description of the purchase and its alignment to the district CLP)
- 2. Assurances must be signed and uploaded under "Related Documents"
- 3. An approved CLP

Reimbursements:

- Can submit multiple line items for reimbursement at once
- Edison will make payment in 7-9 days
