APR Local Determinations Overview

- As required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 34 C.F.R. § 300.600, states must monitor the implementation of IDEA in each LEA.
- Tennessee monitors LEA implementation on 14 indicators.
 - Compliance indicator targets are set by the federal government.
 - Results indicator targets are set by TDOE.
- LEAs earn points for each indicator based on meeting the target and/or demonstrating year-to-year improvement.
- Total weighted points earned are divided by total possible weighted points to make the overall determination.

Indicator 1: Graduation Rate



Indicator 1: Graduation Rate

- Definition—Percent of students with disabilities (SWDs) graduating with a regular diploma.
- Source—The FINAL Exited Student Report Table 4 (PDF) New 09 generated in EDPlan/EasyIEP on September 1.
- Calculation—Using SWDs from the FINAL Exited Student Report Table 4 (PDF) New 09 who are ages 14-21:

SWDs who graduated with a regular diploma **OR** received a special education diploma **OR** reached maximum age **OR** dropped out **OR** graduated with an alternate academic diploma



Calculating Indicator 1 for your LEA

- Request the report titled FINAL Exited Student Report Table 4 (PDF) New 09 in EDPlan/EasyIEP
- For the 2021-22 school year:
 - Enter July 1, 2021 as the Report Begin Date
 - Enter June 30, 2022 as the Report End Date
 - Enter July 1, 2021 as the Student Active Date

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Calculating Indicator 1 for your LEA


- Locate the number of student graduating with a regular diploma (the numerator)
- Add up the total students, excluding those who transferred, died, or moved (the denominator)
- To investigate specific students, scroll down to the "Students included on Report" section.

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Graduation Rate Targets

The target for the 2021-22 determination year (2020-21 SY data) will be 79.25% or more.

Indicator 2: Dropout Rate

- Definition—Percent of SWDs dropping out.
- Source—The FINAL Exited Student Report Table 4 (PDF) New 09 generated in EDPlan/EasyIEP on September 1.
- Calculation—Using SWDs from the FINAL Exited Student Report Table 4 (PDF) New 09 who are ages 14-21:

Indicator 13: Secondary Transition with IEP Goals



Indicator 13: Secondary Transition Goals

- Definition—Percent of youth aged 16 and above with IEPs in place that have appropriate, measurable postsecondary goals which are annually updated and based on transition assessment and transition services.
- Source—The IEP Monitoring Results Report generated and distributed by the Division of Federal Programs and Oversight and pulled by the Office of Districts and Schools on <u>September 1</u>.
- Calculation—Using students from the monitoring report who are age 16 or older:

Students who were determined to have acceptable postsecondary goals

Monitoring Indicator 13 for your LEA

- Monitor the transition page in EasyIEP to ensure the appropriate information is entered for all SWDs ages 16 or older during the life of the current IEP.
- A sample of IEPs are selected through an algorithm to be included for Indicator 13.
- Indicator 13 is a compliance indicator; therefore, the target is always set at 100%.

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Indicator 14: Post-school Outcomes



Indicator 14: Post-school Outcomes

- Definition—Percent of youth who are no longer in secondary school, had IEPs in effect at the time they left school, and were either:
 - enrolled in higher education within one year of leaving high school;
 - enrolled in higher education or competitively employed within one year of leaving high school; or
 - enrolled in higher education or some other postsecondary education or training program, competitively employed, or in some other employment within one year of leaving high school.
- Source—Student survey administered by districts.
- Calculation—Using students who responded to the survey:

Students who report falling into each relevant category of post-school outcomes

Indicator 14 Sampling Plan

- Districts with less than 50,000 total students are required to conduct the post-school outcomes survey on a four-year cycle.
- Districts with more than 50,000 total students are required to conduct the post-school outcomes survey annually.



Indicator 14 Outcome Categories

- 1. **Higher education:** Students who enrolled in higher education within one year of leaving high school, enrolled in a 2-year or 4-year school or training program, and completed at least one semester or trimester of school.
- 2. **Competitively employed:** Students who were employed in a paying job within one year of leaving high school, worked at that job for at least 90 days, and worked over 20 hours a week. Students must have earned at least minimum wage. The employer could be the military, community employment, or other.
- **3. Post-secondary education or training:** Students who enrolled in a postsecondary education or training program since leaving high school. These programs include vocational or technical school, a college program for intellectual and developmental disabilities, vocational rehabilitation, GED or high school completion document program, and/or short-term education or employment program.
- **4. Other employment:** Students who were employed in a paying job and have worked at least 90 days.
- 5. Not engaged: Students who were not enrolled in an educational/training program or currently not employed. These students do not meet the criteria for other categories.





Post-school Outcomes Targets

Indicator 14 has three categories, each with its own target:

- **14A** = youth in higher education (26.93%)
- 14B = youth competitively employed + 14A (63.69%)
- 14C = youth in some other postsecondary education or training program or in some other employment + 14B (75.31%)
