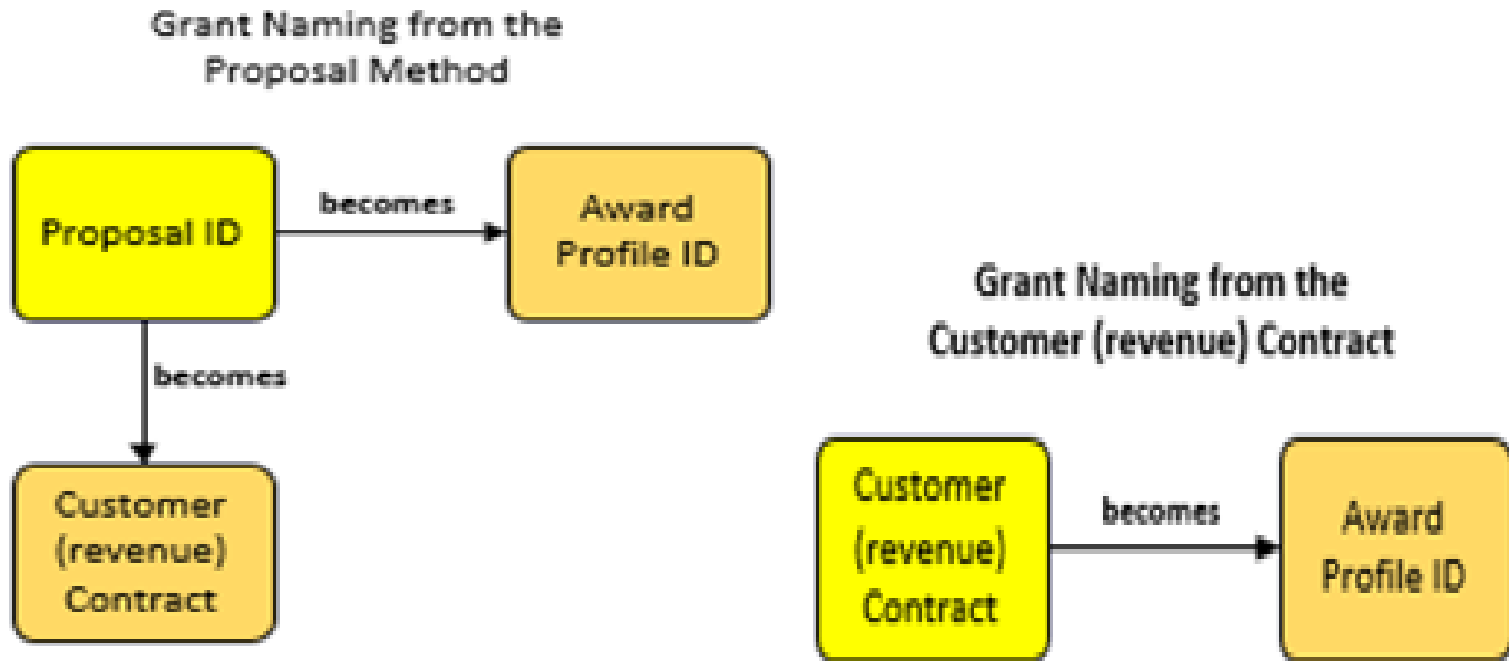
Elements of Grant Setup

Grant Naming

- Free form field
- Should be no more than 15 alpha/numeric characters
- No special characters or commas to be used
- Name of Customer (revenue) Contract/Award Profile ID can't be changed once entered
- Unique ID
- Uniform naming recommended if recurring grants received every year (2016 JAG ... 2017 JAG)

Elements of Grant Setup

Project ID Naming

- First two alpha characters are agency specific and pre-assigned
- Free form field
- Should be no more than 15 alpha/numeric characters
- No special characters or commas to be used
- Unique ID – no duplicates allowed
- Multiple projects to one Customer Contract need consistent naming (HSCS%17)

Elements of Grant Setup

GL Business Unit vs PC Business Unit

- Most of the time the GL (general ledger) BU will be the same as the PC (project costing) BU
- Exceptions to the rule:
 - Capital projects
 - System development

Elements of Grant Setup

Sponsor/Customer

- Every Customer (revenue) Contract/Grant must have a sponsor/customer
- Each Sponsor/Customer has a specific Customer Type
- Both Customer/Sponsor and Customer Type can affect billing and accounts receivable processing

Project Type – alpha/numeric characters

- **Most commonly used for informational and reporting needs**
- **Can play a part in prompting billing if configured to do so**

P	Pending	>	Cannot be used in a Customer (revenue) Contract
		>	Cannot incurred pre-encumbrances, encumbrances, or expenditures
O	Open	>	Can be used in a Customer (revenue) Contract
		>	Can have encumbrances
		>	Can have expenditures
		>	Can have associated revenue
H	Hold	>	Is temporary until removed
		>	Cannot have expenditures to process against
C	Closed/Final	>	Expenditures will fail budget checking
		>	can be reopened
T	Closed to Procurement	>	can have general ledger and accounts payable expenditures not associated to PO's
		>	cannot use project in PO's or Req's
X	Cancelled/Withdrawn	>	Expenditures will fail budget checking
		>	can be re-opened



Elements of Grant Setup

Project Start and End Date

- **Dates play a major role in system controls**
- **Transactions cannot be assigned before start date**
- **Transactions cannot be assigned after end date**
- **Dates for Commitment Control can only be changed by Edison GL/Commitment Control**



Elements of Grant Setup

Project Budget Items and Budgets

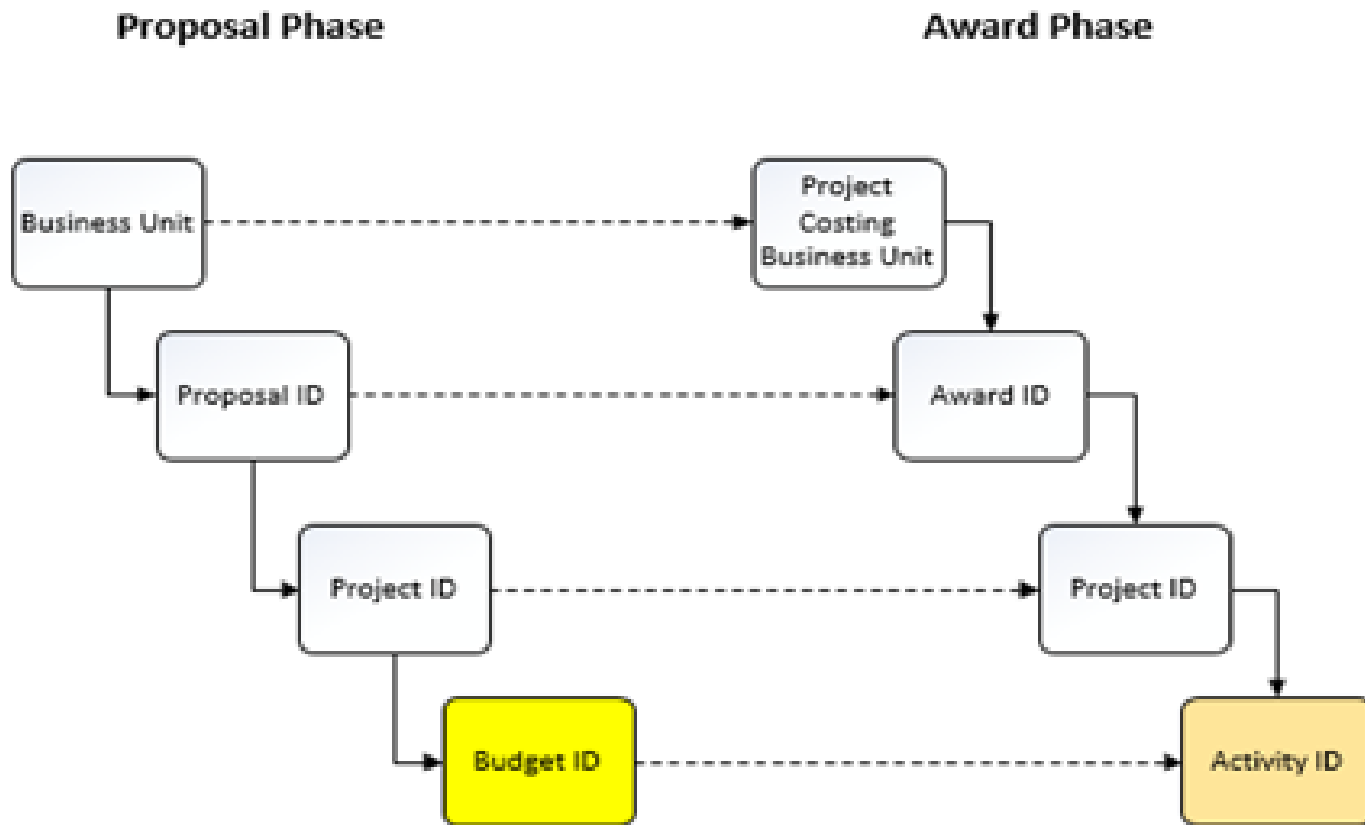
- **A project budget must have no less than one budget item**
- **Budget items are five digit account codes**
- **Have to exist to be able to have transactions to process on the Project budget**
- **Only Payroll and Fringe 70100 and 70200 can overspend a project budget**

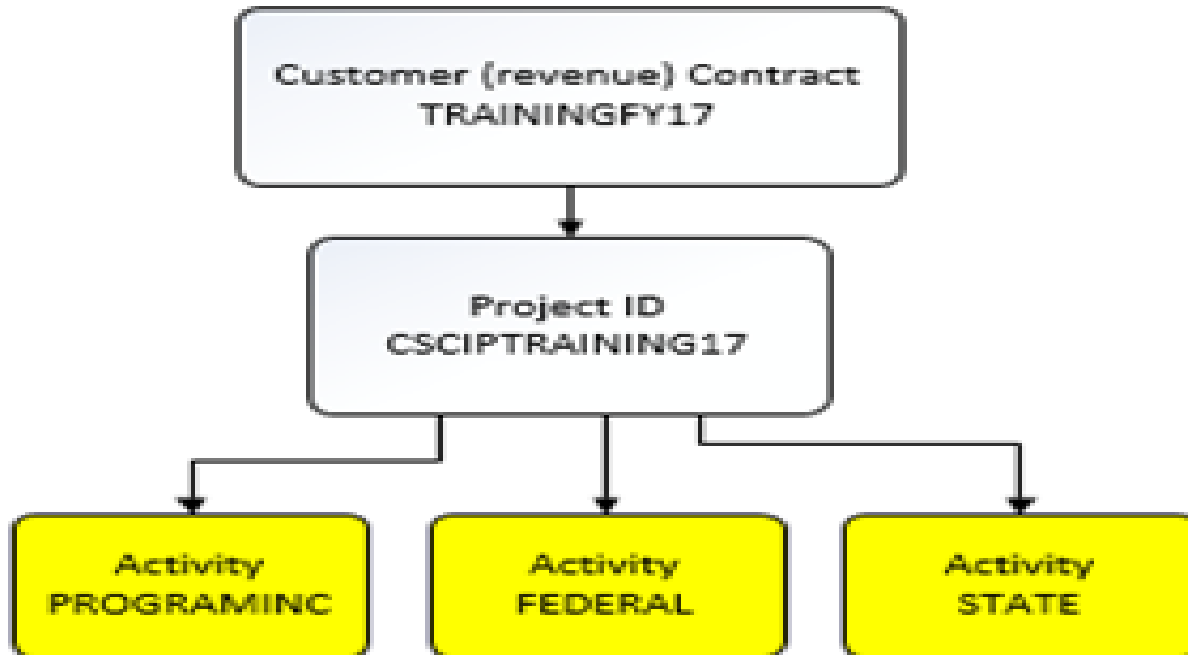
Elements of Grant Setup

- **Activity (Funding Source)**
 - **INTERFED** – Federal dollars passing from another state agency to you
 - **INTERMATCH** – The other state agency’s state allotment dollars passing on to you
 - **INTERLOTRY** – Lottery dollars passing through
 - **INTERFOUND** – Foundation dollars received by another agency passing through to you
 - **INTERLOCAL** – Local dollars received by another agency passing through to you

- **Some Activity’s are “NOT STANDARD”**
 - **AGENCY SPECIFIC**
 - **Example: 32701 Environment and Conservation has “cleanup” projects which have many funding sources including multiple Federal grants – the Grant name becomes the Project Activity**
 - **CAPITAL PROJECTS SPECIFIC**

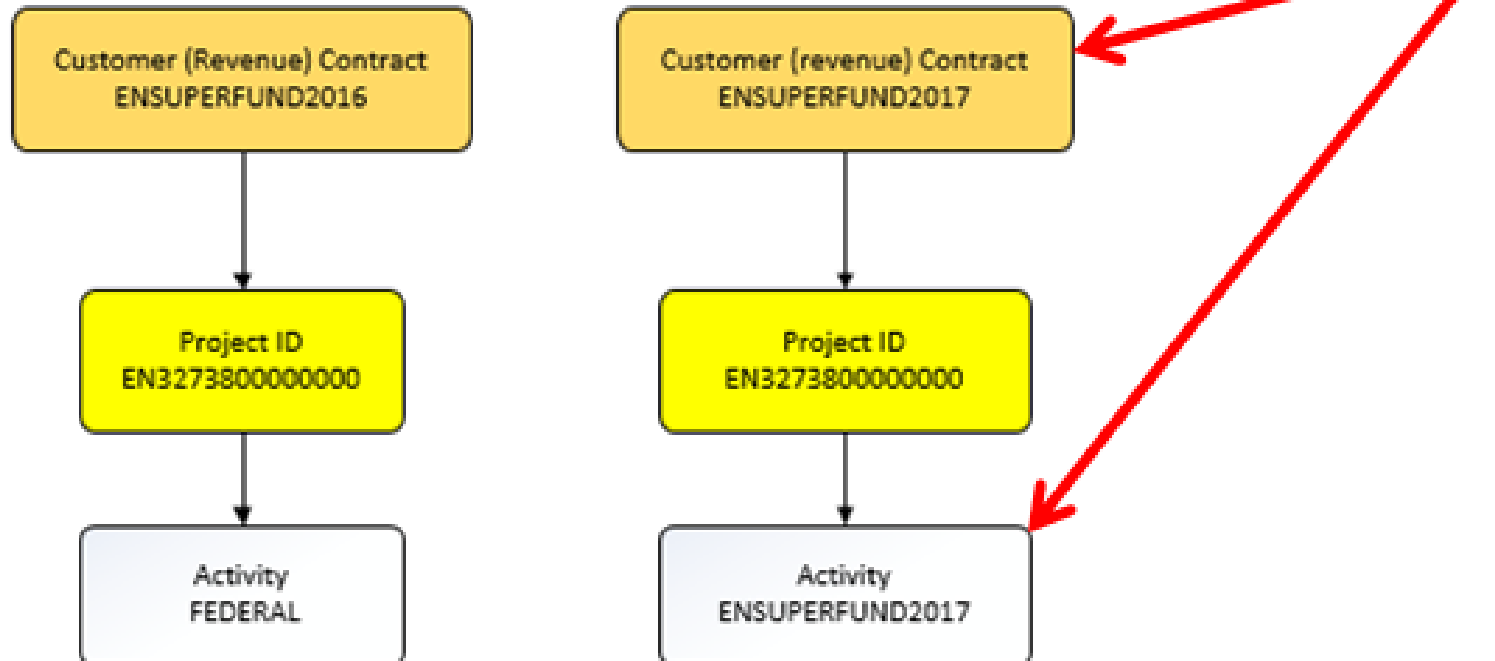

One Project ID but Multiple Activities



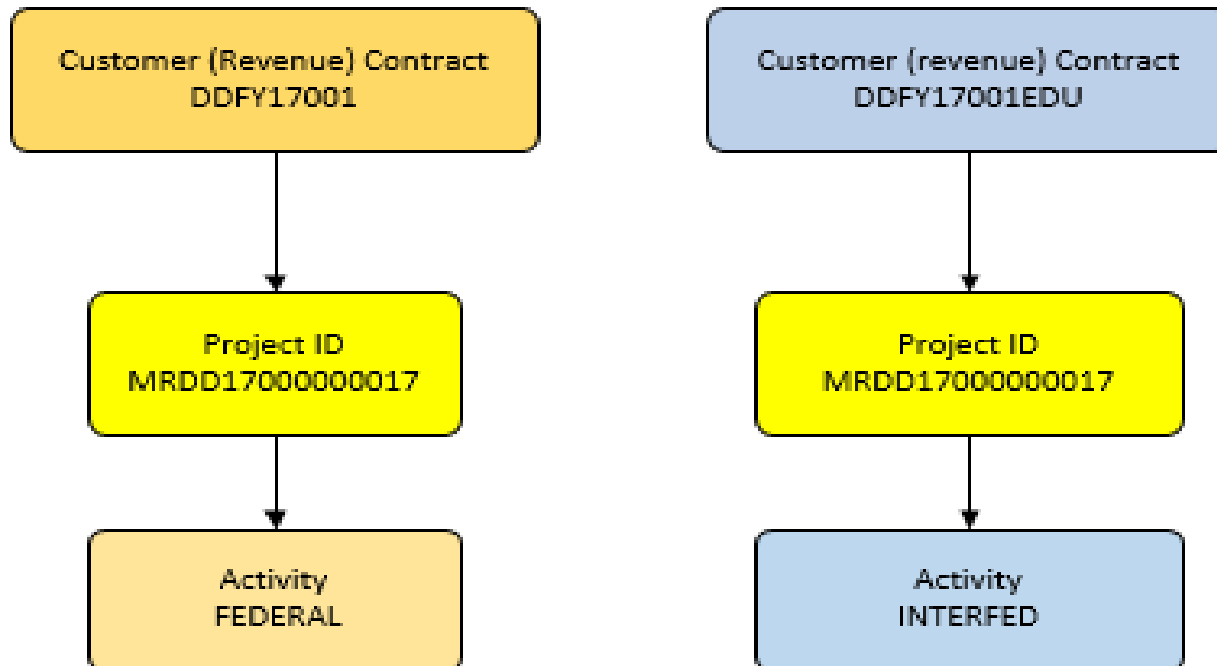

Attributes

- Assists with SEFA Reporting to the Customer (revenue) Contract/Grant Award

Attribute	Attribute Description	Attribute Meaning
ARRA	ARRA Funded	Denotes that grant is part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act money
C	Cash	Denotes Federal Funding is "cash"
F	Federal Government	Denotes Federal Funding
N	Other than Cash	Denotes Federal Funding is not "cash" (Surplus Property would use this)
R	Research	Denotes Research Funding
T	Pass Through	Denotes Federal funding passing through to a secondary agency



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
