

2018 Tennessee Drug Overdose Deaths Annual Report

Key Findings:

- Over the past 5 years, drug overdose deaths in Tennessee have consistently increased.
- Tennesseans who died of a drug overdose were more likely to be white and male.
- Deaths involving opioids identified as "pain relievers" (those typically obtained through a prescription) have decreased for the past two years, while deaths involving illicit drugs (like heroin, fentanyl, and methamphetamine) have increased.

Drug overdose deaths in Tennessee are at an all time high.





All drug overdose deaths and deaths involving an opioid continued to increased in 2018. **Opioids include:**






Deaths involving illicit drugs are on the rise.
