	tabled for the next meeting. Further discussion on trauma center
	Designation, Verification and Disciplinary Action was held. Legal
	made the decision that they were going to review this and address
	wording such that the state's rules replicated in this section only
	address pediatric trauma and not adult trauma. This will then be
	further reviewed at the next meeting.
