Call to Order

Dr. Simpson called the meeting to order at 9:02 AM CST. A roll call of the Board Members and Board staff present was initiated by Ms. Wallace, Unit 3 Director. Mr. Mark Cole was introduced as the new advisory attorney for the Board.

Public Comments

Ms. Wallace provided notice that the Board would hear public comments during this meeting and gave instructions for doing so by signing the registry at the door. It was announced that individuals may present any applicable question or comment to the Board, however, the Board may only take action on items that are published on the agenda for this meeting. The Board then has the option request to add an item to a future meeting agenda regarding any new topic introduced by way of a public comment if they believe action may need to be taken on that particular subject.

Approval of Minutes

Dr. McInturff made a motion to approve the Minutes from the April 7, 2021, Board meeting, as written, with a second by Dr. Loxley. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Leonard reminded the Board and the public that letters of warning and letters of concern are not reported to the National Practitioners Data Bank as formal discipline.

Financial Report

Finance Director, Ms. Alicia Grice informed Ms. Wallace ahead of this meeting that they do not have anything new to report to the Board at this time, and they anticipate having the 2021 fiscal year reports available for presentation at the next meeting.

Discuss legislation and take action if needed

Ms. Olivia Spears, Legislative Liaison, presented the summary of 2021 Public Chapters applicable to this Board, as follows:

Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners Legislative Update 2021

Public Chapter 10

This act extends the board of veterinary medical examiners to June 30, 2026.

This act took effect March 23, 2021.

Public Chapter 37

TN Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners Meeting Minutes - August 12, 2021 Page 3 of 23 This act prohibits agencies subject to sunset review from promulgating rules or adopting policies to exempt members solely by virtue of their status as members.

This act took effect March 23, 2021.

Public Chapter 136

This act was one of the Department of Health's legislative initiatives, relative to the Controlled Substance Monitoring Database (CSMD). First, the act authorizes the state's chief medical examiner, or county medical examiner, to allow designees to approve death investigations. Next, this act allows deidentified CSMD data, rather than only aggregate, to be shared, with the intent of improving information access. Additionally, this act allows for CSMD data to be shared with additional state, county, or federal agencies outside of Tennessee. Lastly, this act decreases the quorum requirements of the CSMD committee by one member, but still have a majority of members present to conduct regular committee business (6).

This act took effect April 13, 2021.

Public Chapter 153

This act creates a new definition of "store-and-forward telemedicine services" to include the use of asynchronous computer-based communications between the healthcare provider and the patient for the purpose of diagnoses, consultation, or treatment of a patient at a distant site where there may be no in-person exchange.

This act took effect April 13, 2021.

Public Chapter 179

This act authorizes unlicensed graduates of certain medical training programs to provide telehealth services, provided they maintain the same existing standards for telehealth that licensed providers must meet.

This act took effect April 20, 2021.

Public Chapter 230

This act revises the definition of marijuana to clarify that it does not include a product approved as a prescription by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

This act took effect April 22, 2021.

Public Chapter 242

This act authorizes records custodians to petition a court for injunctive relief from individuals making frequent public records requests with the intent of disrupting government operations,

following a fifth (5th) public records request. A records custodian can only petition a court if they notify the person in writing stating the specific conduct may constitute intent to disrupt government operations, and that the person continues to do so. The individual upon a court enjoinment would not be able to make public requests at the agency for up to one (1) year.

This chapter took effect April 28th, 2021 and will sunset July 1, 2025.

Public Chapter 291

This act requires the attorney general and reporter to not approve an emergency rule if the emergency rule does not meet the statutory criteria for adoption of the rule.

This act took effect July 1, 2021.

Public Chapter 328

This act requires that starting December 1, 2023, state agencies submit a report of their effective rules to the chairs of the government operations committee every eight (8) years. The report is required to include a brief description of the department's operations that each chapter affects, as well as each rule and its administrative history, which would include the original promulgated date and the dates the rule was last amended, if applicable. Additionally, the report would include a determination of each rule on whether it is adheres to current state or federal law or court rulings, should be amended or repealed, reviewed further, or continue in effect without amendment. Lastly, if there are any intentionally false statements in the report, the government operations committee would have the ability to vote to request the general assembly to remove a rule or suspend the department's rulemaking authority for any reasonable period of time.

This act took effect July 1, 2021.

Public Chapter 453

This act requires public or private entities or businesses that operate a building open to the general public to post signage regarding public restroom access in certain situations. Specifically, this applies to entities or businesses that have restroom policies allowing either biological sex to use any public restroom within their building. The act includes requirements for language, size, location, and even color for the signage. The act excludes unisex, single occupant restrooms or family restrooms intended for use by either sex.

This act took effect July 1, 2021.

Public Chapter 461

This act requires TDH licensing authorities, upon learning a healthcare prescriber was indicted of certain criminal offenses (controlled substance violations or sexual offenses), to automatically restrict the prescriber's ability to prescribe Schedule II controlled substances until the case reaches a final disposition. The restriction shall be removed upon sufficient proof of acquittal or dismissal/nolle prosequi. The act further requires licensing authorities to automatically revoke the license of a practitioner that is convicted of those same criminal offenses. A new license shall be granted if the conviction is overturned or reversed (but shall be restricted related to prescribing if the case has not reached final disposition). In addition, the act requires the licensing authority to suspend the license of midlevel practitioner (APRN/PA) upon finding the healthcare professional failed to comply with physician collaboration requirements. Finally, this act requires facility administrators to report certain disciplinary actions concerning licensed personnel to the professionals' respective boards.

This act took effect May 18, 2021.

Public Chapter 513

This act prohibits the Governor from issuing an executive order and a state agency, department or political subdivision from promulgating, adopting, or enforcing an ordinance or resolution that requires a person to receive an immunization, vaccination, or injection for the SARS-CoV-2 virus or any variant of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. It also deletes the previous override during an epidemic or immediate threat of an epidemic of an objection against vaccination that was made on the basis of religious tenets. The law prohibits requiring the COVID-19 vaccine to attend k-12 schools. The prohibition against requiring vaccines does not apply to governmental entities subject to federal or state statute or rule that prohibits the entity from requiring medical treatment for those who object on religious grounds or right of conscience.

The law also does not apply to students of a public institution of higher education delivering healthcare services when the student is participating in/fulfilling requirements of a program in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or another healthcare profession.

This act took effect May 25, 2021.

Public Chapter 531

This act limits an agency's authority to promulgate rules without a public hearing. There are exceptions to the public hearing requirement. These exceptions include emergency rules, rules that are nonsubstantive modifications to existing rules (like clerical updates), rules that repeal existing rule, or rules that eliminate or reduce a fee described by an existing rule.

This act took effect July 1, 2021.

Public Chapter 532

This act authorizes the joint government operations committee to stay an agency's rule from going into effect for a period of time not to exceed ninety (90) days. If the government operations committee determines that subsequent stays are necessary, then the joint committee may issue consecutive stays, each for an additional ninety (90) day period, so long as such stays do not extend beyond the fifth legislative day of the year following the year in which the rule is filed with the secretary of state. The initial stay may be done by either the house or senate government operations committee, but subsequent stays must be by agreement by the committees of both chambers. A stay is effective when the respective committee files written notice with the secretary of state, and the respective committee shall specify the length of effectiveness of the stay.

This act took effect May 25, 2021.

Public Chapter 577

This public chapter establishes the medical cannabis commission which is administratively attached to the department of health for purposes of budgeting, audit, use of IT systems, HR support, clerical assistance and administrative support. The commission is composed of 9 members. The Governor appoints 3 members (1 from each grand division), the Lt. Governor appoints 3 members (1 must be a physician and 1 a pharmacist), and the Speaker of the House appoints 3 members (1 must be a physician and 1 a pharmacist). The commission must be impaneled and hold its first meeting by October 1, 2021. The commission is required to meet at least once every two months prior to March 2023. The commission shall appoint an executive director.

The commission is to examine federal laws and other states' laws regarding medical use of cannabis, including issues relating to patient qualification, patient registration, role of practitioners in recommending/prescribing, establishing guidelines for acceptable medical uses, development of a standard of care, etc.

This act took effect May 27, 2021.

These are general summaries of legislation. For more detailed information and all specifics/requirements, please review the links to each public chapter.

Dr. McInturff asked for clarification on Public Chapter 179. Ms. Elizabeth Foy, Legislative Liaison, assisted with the response, stating that the intent was in regard to delays in the licensure process after graduation and this was primarily for nurses, but they will look at the exact language and the Board would need to discuss this with their advisory attorney on its applicability to the Vet Board. Mr. Cole stated he would follow up. Dr. Simpson stated that veterinarians cannot have VCPR via telehealth, so it shouldn't apply.

Ms. Wallace reminded the Board Members that as their term of service comes to an end, they are asked to continue to sit on the Board and continue those duties until either the Board Member is reappointed to the Board or a new Board Member is appointed in their place.

OGC Report Report

Mr. Cole gave the Office of General Counsel Report to the Board. The OGC currently has twenty-four (24) open cases, one being a facility. There were no cases set, nor any orders to present in this meeting.

Agreed Citations

Nika Cantrell, DVM License #6897

Respondent is licensed as a Veterinarian in the State of Tennessee by the Tennessee Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, license number 6897.

Respondent has failed to timely renew the license in violation of Tenn. Code Ann 63-12-121, and Tenn. Rules and Regs. 1730-01-09.

Respondent agrees to pay civil penalties in the amount of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for practicing in this state on a lapsed license.

Respondent admits to practicing on a lapsed license for a period of ten (10) months.

A motion was made by Dr. Loxley to approve the Agreed Citation for Nika Cantrell, DVM, as written, with a second made by Dr. McInturff. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Orders of Compliance

Scott Gables, DVM

Dr. Gables submitted a request that his license be taken off probation per the Order of Compliance that was submitted in 2016. Mr. Cole presented the Order of Compliance. Dr. Gables was present to give a brief statement how thankful he was to the Board for the work that they do. He was grateful to the TMF for working with him and helping him regain his family, finances, and career. Mr. Robert Cramer, attorney for Dr. Gables was also present on Dr. Gables' behalf.

Dr Baron, Director for TMF, stated to the Board that he had been working with Dr. Gables since January 2016. He mentioned everything that Dr Gables did to complete his Order of Compliance and that in April 2021, Dr. Gables completed his 5-year monitoring agreement. TMF supports Dr. Gables getting his license back.

Dr. McInturff made a motion to approve the reinstatement of license for Scott Gables, DVM, with a second by Ms. Wereszczak. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Applicant Interview/File Review/Waiver

Megan May, DVM - Reciprocity CE Requirement Waiver Request

Dr. May is applying for TN licensure by Reciprocity, which by rule, requires submission of 60 hours of CE completed over the prior 5 years, unless otherwise waived by the TN Board on a case-by-case individual basis. Dr May has submitted a total of 42 CE hours with her application.

Dr. May was originally licensed in Texas and they do not require any CE hours to be completed the first year after completing internship, which Dr. May completed in 2017, so Dr. May did not complete any CE hours for 2017-2018. Due to the pandemic and the many conference cancellations for 2019-2020, the Texas Veterinary Board allowed some variance to their regularly required number of CE hours.

Dr. May is requesting a CE waiver for the remainder of the 60 CE hours that is required to apply to TN by Reciprocity.

Per Rule 1730-01-.04(2)(f) in order to apply by reciprocity a veterinarian must "provide proof of completion of a minimum of sixty (60) hours of continuing education in the five (5) years preceding application."

Per Rule 1730-01-.04(2)(f)(1) "the Board may grant a waiver of the need to attend and complete the required hours of continuing education".

Dr. McInturff made a motion to approve the Reciprocity CE Waiver for Dr. Megan May contingent upon receiving internship documentation either from a completion certificate or by confirmation from the director of the internship program, with a second by Ms. Wereszczak. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Alexa Powers, DVM - Reciprocity Active Practice Waiver Request

Dr. Alexa Powers is applying for licensure in TN by Reciprocity. She graduated from school in 2012 and worked as a full-time veterinarian for the next 5 years. She left her job after having her first child and since then has only been working as an occasional relief veterinarian, working less than 25 hours per week.

Dr. Powers is asking for a waiver for the active practice requirement as she would like to be licensed in TN to be able to work relief in the Memphis area.

Per Rule 1730-01-.04(e): a veterinarian must "provide proof of having engaged in active veterinary practice for three (3) of the five (5) years preceding application. Active veterinary practice, for the purpose of this section is defined as practice in the area of veterinary medicine as defined in TCA 63-12-103(10) for an average of twenty-five (25) hours per week in another state or jurisdiction. The Board may consider a waiver upon request."

Brief discussion was conducted by all Board Members on whether or not to grant the waiver.

Ms. Wereszczak made a motion to approve the Reciprocity Active Practice Waiver for Alexa Powers, DVM, with a second made by Dr. McInturff. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ratification of Licensure Files

Ms. Wallace informed the Board that the files presented on the Ratification List have been reviewed and found complete and in good order according to the rules for new licensure, reinstatement of license, facility premises permits and the closure of incomplete files.

Dr. Loxley made a motion to approve the Ratification List for new licenses, reinstated licenses, and closed/withdrawn files, as written, with a second made by Ms. Wereszczak. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The brochure also has dates listed of May 18-20, 2021 and June 15-16, 2021. The materials show that the training has been approved for 16 hours of AAVSB RACE approval.

There was a brief discussion by Board Members on if this training meets the requirements, referencing Rule 1730-06-.08. Dr. Simpson notes that it appears to be short in the area of marksmanship training. Ms. Wereszczak mentions that the materials do list marksmanship.

Dr. McInturff made a motion to have a representative from the course come and answer questions to the Board regarding the Chemical Capture Training Course, with a second made by Dr. Loxley.

Discussion on the motion: Dr Loxley thinks the request for this course should be denied.

Dr. McInturff amended his motion to table a decision on approval of the course until they have proper representation here to speak to the course, with a second by Dr. Loxley. There was no discussion on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Correspondence Review

AAVSB RACETrack - This is for informational purposes and discusses the allowance for the updated RACE Standards for the approval of CE credits. It also provides information on the CE tracking system that the AAVSB has named "RACETrack". This allows licensees to track their completed RACE approved CE within the AAVSB's system. Dr. McInturff commented that it is handy to have a single databank.

Fatal Plus Guidance - The Board received a letter from Dr. Becky DeBolt, Clinical Assistant Professor from the University of Tennessee, asking the Board questions regarding euthanasia drugs and the current shortage of pentobarbital.

The Board Members conducted a brief discussion on the limited supply issue. Dr. Simpson confirmed that Fatal Plus and other brands have the same active ingredient and there is a manufacturing issue with the drug, which has resulted in a global shortage.

Dr. McInturff suggested the creation of a Taskforce to present alternatives at the next meeting. Dr. Simpson stated that the next Board meeting was not until December.

Mr. Cole asked for a Board liaison to work on the preparation of emergency rules and discuss the need for it and a proposed solution due to the global shortage, and what alternatives can be recommended. There is a possibility the emergency rules could be implemented, if deemed appropriate.

Dr. Loxley notes that we need to hear from an anesthesiologist the discuss alternatives as the Board Members may not have the expertise needed to make recommendations.

Ms. Wereszczak made a motion to form a Taskforce, with a second by Dr. McInturff. Discussion involved Dr. Simpson and Ms. Wereszczak volunteering to be on the Taskforce and mentions of inviting an anesthesiologist, Shelter Med Expert, and a TVMA representative to the Taskforce meeting. The motion passed unanimously.
