Dear Mr. Elliott,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Community Development Institute Head Start (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-739, during the period of May 14, 2020 through May 29, 2020. Our scope of the review was for reimbursement made to the Sponsor for February 2020.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmission of documents. We were able to obtain information from the feeding sites during the unannounced site visits completed in February 2020 and from Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the CACFP.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation. Also, to determine if the Sponsor complied with the applicable *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had 12 Head Start locations operating during the review period. The centers selected for the sample were **Head Home Head Start**, **Shalom Zone Head Start**, and **Smyrna Head Start**.

#### Background

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal count sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed for reimbursement to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also reviewed documentation of the Sponsor's financial transactions including, but not limited to, purchases of food. In addition, we observed meal services during the test month at the sample centers.

Our review of the Sponsor's records for February 2020 revealed no significant deficiencies.

#### **Technical Assistance Provided**

Technical assistance regarding infant meal patterns and menus was provided on May 29, 2020.
