Dear Ms. Gray,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Kiddieology Inc., The Village at St. B. and EEC, Application Agreement number 00-538, during the period of April 22, 2020 through May 13, 2020. Our scope of the review was for reimbursement made to the Sponsor for February 2020. The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with the *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreement, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmission of documents. We were able to obtain information from the feeding sites during the unannounced site visits completed in January 2020 and from the Sponsor's staff via telephone and/or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the CACFP.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had three (3) feeding sites operating during the review period. The Village of St. B (Site 0003) and The Village of Woodlawn (Site 0002) affiliated centers were selected as the sample.

#### Background

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements. In addition, we observed a breakfast meal service at The Village of St. B on February 26, 2020 and at The Village of Woodlawn on February 27, 2020.

Our review of the Sponsor's documentation for February 2020 disclosed the following:

#### 1. The Sponsor had one center operating without a working thermometer for the freezer

#### Condition

During our monitoring visit at The Village of Woodlawn on February 27, 2020, we observed the temperature in the freezer was 10°F. The thermometers for the freezer were found to be broken or not reporting the temperature properly. As a result, we were unable to verify that frozen foods were kept within a safe temperature range.

#### <u>Criteria</u>

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(I) states "Institutions and facilities must ensure that in storing, preparing, and serving food proper sanitation and health standards are met which conform with all applicable State and local laws and regulations. Institutions and facilities must ensure that adequate facilities are available to store food or hold meals."

The USDA *Basics for Handling Food Safely* states, "The refrigerator should be at 40 °F (4.4 °C) or below and the freezer at 0 °F (-17.7 °C) or below."

#### Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure food items are properly stored, and working thermometers are checked to ensure refrigerators and freezers are safely storing perishable and frozen foods.

# 2. The Sponsor did not ensure that the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) information was distributed to participating parents or guardians of enrolled children

During our monitoring visits at The Village of St. B on February 26, 2020, we determined WIC program information was not distributed to the parents or guardians of the enrolled children. After our review, the Sponsor posted the WIC information on the parent information board

#### Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.15(o) states, "Each institution must ensure that parents of enrolled children are provided with current information on the benefits and importance of the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) and the eligibility requirements for WIC participation."

#### Recommendation

The Sponsor should implement internal controls to ensure that the WIC program information are communicated to the parents of enrolled children.

#### **Technical Assistance Provided**

During our monitoring visit at Village of St. B. on February 26, 2020 technical assistance was requested and provided regarding the updated "Justice for All" poster, WIC information and listing menu substitutions.

During our monitoring visit at Village of Woodlawn on February 27, 2020, technical assistance was requested and provided regarding the updated "Justice for All" poster.

#### **Corrective Action**

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:
