Dear Mr. Hood,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted an unannounced on-site monitoring review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Kuddles for Kids Child Care Center (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-373, on February 20, 2020. The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with the *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreement, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Background

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements. In addition, we observed a lunch meal service on December 4, 2019.

Our review of the Sponsor's records for December 2019 disclosed the following:

The Sponsor reported meal counts incorrectly

Condition

Based on our review of the Claim for Reimbursement for December 2019, the Sponsor reported 662 breakfast meals, 530 lunch meals, and 791 supplements served. However, based on our

review of available documents, we found there were 684 breakfast meals, 552 lunch meals, and 813 supplements served, prior to any meal disallowances.

As a result, 22 breakfast meals, 22 lunch meals, and 22 supplements served were underreported. (See Exhibit)

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated August 7, 2017

<u>Criteria</u>

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.10(c) states, "… In submitting a Claim for Reimbursement, each institution shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support that claim…."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that claims for reimbursement are completed correctly and based on accurate supporting documents.

<u>Note</u>: Our observation of the lunch meal service on December 4, 2019, revealed no significant deficiencies.

Technical Assistance Provided

During our monitoring visit on December 4, 2019, technical assistance requested by the Sponsor and provided regarding the updated And Justice for All poster and the USDA crediting handbook and food buying guide.

Corrective Action

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:

• Prepare and submit a corrective action plan to address the deficiencies identified in this report. The corrective action plan template is attached. Please return the corrective action plan to:
