Dear Mr. Cannon,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review that included a limited number of unannounced on-site monitoring review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Our Daily Bread of Tennessee, Inc. (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-059, beginning on April 27, 2020. Additional information was requested and provided on July 30, 2020 and provided on July 31, 2020, requested and provided on September 24, 2020, and additional documents were provided on October 26, 2020. Our scope of the review was for reimbursement made to the Sponsor for March 2020.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had 257 active centers and 242 active homes for a total of 499 sites operating during the review period. We used a randomizer to select sample sites as follows:

The Academia Preschool, Aunty K's Child Care (Aunty K's), Bearly Tots Enrichment Center Inc.(Bearly Tots), Breath of Life Preparatory Preschool (Breath of Life), Brookside Learning Center LLC (Brookside), Country Home Day Care (Country Home), Cradles to Crayons, Creative Scholars Inc. Academy (Creative Scholars), Crossroads Academy, Discovery Learning Academy, Growing Minds Learning House (Growing Minds), Horn Lake Road Day Care Center Inc. (Horn Lake), Jaymes Academy #1, Jungle Town Daycare & Early Learning Center (Jungle Town), Kiddie Kingdom, Kinder Academy Learning Center II, LLC (Kinder Academy II), Lily Pad Learning Center II (Lily Pad II), Little Tikes, Littlebug's Learning Leaf (Littlebug), Meg Meg's Learn and Play Center, LLC (Meg Meg), Presbyterian Day School (Presbyterian), Red Rover Preschool (Red Rover), Sweet Pea's (Sweet Pea), Tate's Totz N Teenz Child Development (Tate), and The Village Learning Academy (The Village) child care centers were selected as part of the sample. Additionally, MTSU Child Care Lab and The Growing Patch Learning Academy #2 were randomly selected as sample sites, but the Sponsor did not claim for these sites; therefore, they were not included in this report. Additionally, there were complaints filed against Discovery Learning Academy, Sweet Pea, and Tate; therefore, these centers were reported on separately to repot the results of the review

regarding the complaints filed.

The homes of Aundrea Allen, Maggie Brashers, Marla Breedlove, Melinda Brown, Brandi Cheatham, Laquita Dandridge, Cybil Dorsey, Timolin Glenn, Chasyti Goodwin, Tracy Herman, Carolyn Holloway, Becky Holmes, Kimberly Holmes, Kimberly Hurst, Candus Johnson, Chasity Lopez, Alice Perkey, Clarice Ross, Barbara Starks, Joy Wells, Karen Williams, and Jessica Young were selected as part of the sample. Additionally, the home of Deloris Benton was randomly selected as a sample site, but the Sponsor did not claim for this site; therefore, the site was not included in this report.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmission of documents. We also, obtained confirmation from the feeding sites and Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the CACFP. Prior to the COVID 19 outbreak, we observed meal services at the following child care centers: Aunty K's, Country Home, Cradles to Crayons, Crossroads Academy, Horn Lake, Jaymes Academy #1, Lily Pad II, Littlebug, Presbyterian, and Red Rover and the following day care home providers: Aundrea Allen, Timolin Glenn, Kimberly Hurst, Candus Johnson, Clarice Ross, Barbara Starks, and Jessica Young.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation. Also, to determine if the Sponsor complied with the applicable *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Background

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) to seek reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for March 2020 and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements.

Our review of records for March 2020 disclosed the following:

1. The Sponsor reported the number of meals claimed for reimbursement incorrectly

Condition

Unaffiliated Centers:

Jungle Town – sample center

Based on our review of the Claim for Reimbursement for the March 2020 for **Jungle Town**, the Sponsor claimed 819 breakfast meals, 916 lunch meals, and 847 supplements. However, based on our review of available documents, we noted that there were 798 breakfast meals, 917 lunch meals, and 850 supplements served, prior to any meal disallowances.

As a result, 21 breakfast meals were overreported and one (1) lunch meal and three (3) supplements were underreported. (See Exhibit N)

Daycare Home Providers:

Barbara Starks – sample center

Based on our review of the Claim for Reimbursement for March 2020 for **Barbara Starks**, the Sponsor claimed 312 breakfast meals, 361 lunch meals, 144 supper meals, and 417 supplements. However, based on our review of available documents, we noted that there were 333 breakfast meals, 361 lunch meals, 144 supper meals, and 501 supplements served, prior to any meal disallowances.

As a result, 21 breakfast meals and 84 supplements were underreported. (See Exhibit AQ)

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.10(c) states, "... In submitting a Claim for Reimbursement, each institution shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support that claim..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that claims for reimbursement are completed correctly and based on accurate supporting documents.

2. The Sponsor reported the number of meals served for observed meals incorrectly

Condition

During our monitoring visits completed during the review period, we observed meal services. We completed the Sponsor review via Skype on April 27, 2020, during the virtual conference, we requested meal count documentation for the sample centers. Based on our review of the meal counts provided, the following centers reported incorrect meal counts based on the number of meals observed during our on-site monitoring visits:

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As a result, there were 14 breakfast meals overreported and nine (9) lunch meals underreported. (See Exhibits)

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.10(c) states, "... In submitting a Claim for Reimbursement, each institution shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support that claim..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that meal count forms are completed correctly and accurately.

3. The Sponsored centers and homes served not creditable meals that observed during the on-site visits

Condition

During our on-site monitoring visit at **Aunty K's** on March 9, 2020, we observed a lunch meal service. There were five (5) participants served water instead of milk. There were no medical statements on file for the participants stating that water should be served instead of milk.

As a result, five (5) lunch meals were disallowed. (See Exhibit C)

During our on-site monitoring visit at **Jaymes Academy #1** on March 9, 2020, we observed a breakfast meal service. There was one (1) one-year old participant served chocolate milk.

As a result, one (1) breakfast meal was disallowed. (See Exhibit M)

During our on-site monitoring visit at the home of **Barbara Starks** on March 3, 2020, we observed a breakfast meal service. There were seven (7) participants served cereal and milk. There was no vegetable or fruit component served.

As a result, seven (7) breakfast meals were disallowed. (See Exhibit AQ)

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20..."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.18(d) states, "Each day care home participating in the program shall serve the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20. Menu records shall be maintained to document compliance with these requirements. Meals shall be served at no separate charge to enrolled children."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(a)(1) states, "Fluid milk must be

served as a beverage or on cereal, or a combination of both, as follows: (i) Children one year of age must be served unflavored whole milk. (ii) Children two through five years old must be served either unflavored low-fat (1 percent) or unflavored fat-free (skim) milk...."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(c)(1) states, in part, "Fluid milk, vegetables or fruit, or portions of both, and grains are required components of the breakfast meal."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(c)(2) states, "Fluid milk, meat and meat alternatives, vegetable, fruits, and grains are required components in the lunch and supper meals."

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 14-2017 Modifications to Accommodate Disabilities in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u> outlines the requirements for CACFP sponsors to provide reasonable modifications to Program meals or the meal service to accommodate children or adults (participants) with disabilities.

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that meals served meet the USDA meal pattern requirements.

4. The Sponsored daycare home provider did not have required documents or information available during the on-site visits

Condition

During our on-site visit to the home of **Barbara Starks** (feeding site) on March 2, 2020, the feeding site staff did not provide us with the attendance and meal count records. The Sponsor, however, subsequently provided the requested meal count records for March 3, 2020.

Based on the records provided by the Sponsor and the number of meals reported for the observed meal, we noted the number of meals claimed for reimbursement were correct. Therefore, no meals were disallowed. (See Exhibit AQ)

Additionally, there were daycare home providers that did not have enrollment information on file for participants:

- During our monitoring visit on March 12, 2020, at the home of **Candus Johnson**, enrollment information was not on file for three (3) participants.
- During our monitoring visit on March 12, 2020, at the home of **Timolin Glenn**, enrollment information was not on file for one (1) participant.

The Sponsor, however, was able to provide documentation supporting enrollment of the participants for both daycare home providers. As a result, no meals were disallowed.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.18(e) states, "Each day care home must maintain on file documentation of each child's enrollment and must maintain daily records of the number of children in attendance and the number of meals, by type, served to enrolled

children...."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.18(g) states, "Each day care home shall comply with the recordkeeping requirements established in §226.10(d) and in this section. Failure to maintain such records shall be grounds for the denial of reimbursement."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that day care home providers record and maintain all required documents for three years.

5. The Sponsor did not provide documentation to support sufficient quantities of milk were purchased for all meals reported

Condition

Based on the number of meals served with milk as a component, the Sponsor was required to purchase a total number of ounces of milk that were not supported by inventories and receipts for provided for the sponsored centers. The noted amount of milk for centers that resulted in shortages were as follows:

As a result, 6,199 breakfast meals, 1,298 lunch meals, and 512 supplements were disallowed. (See Exhibits)

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20...."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20 (c)(1) states, in part, "Fluid milk, vegetables or fruit, or portions of both, and grains are required components of the breakfast meal."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(c)(2) states, "Fluid milk, meat and meat alternatives, vegetable, fruits, and grains are required components in the lunch and supper meals."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(c)(3) states, "Serve two of the following five components: Fluid milk, meat and meat alternates, vegetables, fruits, and grains. Fruit juice, vegetable juice, and milk may comprise only one component of the snack. ..."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(a)(1) states, "Fluid milk must be served as a beverage or on cereal, or a combination of both, as follows: Children one year of age must be served unflavored whole milk. Children two through five years old must be served either unflavored low-fat (1 percent) or unflavored fat-free (skim) milk. Children six years old and older must be served milk that is low-fat (1 percent fat or less) or fat-free (skim). Milk may be unflavored or flavored from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019 (school year 2018-2019)."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(e)(1) states, "When emergency conditions prevent an institution or facility normally having a supply of milk from temporarily obtaining milk deliveries, the State agency may approve the service of breakfast, lunches, or suppers without milk during the emergency period."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.16(f)(6) Temporary unavailability of milk. If emergency conditions prevent a sponsor normally having a supply of milk from temporarily obtaining milk deliveries, the State agency may approve the service of breakfasts, lunches or suppers without milk during the emergency period.

Recommendation

The Sponsor should perform a month-end inventory for milk and maintain all receipts for food purchases to verify the required amount of milk was purchased and served.

6. The Sponsored childcare centers had parent or guardian statements or medical statements on file for participants with special dietary needs that did not meet the requirements

Condition

We requested statements from a parent or guardian and/or medical statements for any participants enrolled at the sponsored centers and homes that received meal substitutions due to special dietary needs or disabilities. The Sponsor stated that participants marked as having special dietary needs on the meal count forms provided did not necessarily result in a meal substitution being provided but was to bring attention that a substitution may have been requested one point. Therefore, we only concluded on meals served to participants where a statement was provided, and the statement(s) did not meet the USDA requirements, or the Sponsor stated no statement was available due to the participant no longer enrolled.

The results of our review are as follows:

- There was one (1) participant enrolled at Aunty K's during the review period substitutions for special dietary needs that had a parent statement on file. However, the statement indicated that almond milk was to be served. Almond milk is not a creditable substitution for cow's milk.
- There was one (1) participant enrolled at **Jungle Town** during the review period substitutions for special dietary needs that had a doctor's statement on file, but the statement did not specify the substitution to be made.
- There were two (2) participants enrolled at Littlebug during the review period that
 received substitutions for special dietary needs that did not have a statement on file.
 The Sponsor stated the participants were no longer enrolled and statements were not
 kept on file.
- There was one (1) participant enrolled at **The Village** during the review period substitutions for special dietary needs that had a doctor's statement on file, but the statement did not specify the substitution to be made.

Technical assistance was provided regarding this finding and no meals were disallowed.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(g)(1) states, "Exceptions for disability reasons. Reasonable substitutions must be made on a case-by-case basis for foods and meals described in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this section for individual participants who are considered to have a disability under 7 CFR 15b.3 and whose disability restricts their diet. (i) A written statement must support the need for the substitution. The statement must include recommended alternate foods, unless otherwise exempted by FNS, and must be signed by a licensed physician or licensed health care professional who is authorized by State law to write medical prescriptions. (ii) A parent, guardian, adult participant, or a person on behalf of an adult participant may supply one or more components of the reimbursable meal as long as the institution or facility provides at least one required meal component."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(g)(2) states, "Exceptions for non-disability reasons. Substitutions may be made on a case-by-case basis for foods and meals described in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this section for individual participants without disabilities who cannot consume the regular meal because of medical or special dietary needs. (i) A written statement must support the need for the substitution. The statement must include recommended alternate foods, unless otherwise exempted by FNS. Except for substitutions of fluid milk, as set forth below, the statement must be signed by a recognized medical authority.

(ii) A parent, guardian, adult participant, or a person on behalf of an adult participant may supply one component of the reimbursable meal as long as the component meets the requirements described in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this section and the institution or facility provides the remaining components."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(g)(3) states, "Fluid milk substitutions for non-disability reasons. Non-dairy fluid milk substitutions that provide the nutrients listed in the following table and are fortified in accordance with fortification guidelines issued by the Food and Drug Administration may be provided for non-disabled children and adults who cannot consume fluid milk due to medical or special dietary needs when requested in writing by the child's parent or guardian, or by, or on behalf of, an adult participant. An institution or facility need only offer the non-dairy beverage that it has identified as an allowable fluid milk substitute according to the following table.

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 14-2017 Modifications to Accommodate Disabilities in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u> outlines the requirements for CACFP sponsors to provide reasonable modifications to Program meals or the meal service to accommodate children or adults (participants) with disabilities

The USDA Independent Child Care Centers – A CACFP Handbook, page 36, states, If the institution serves children that have disabilities or special dietary needs that lead to alterations of the meal pattern or the menu, ensure that these children are being served meals in accordance with their needs and confirm that the appropriate documentation has been obtained and retained to support claiming the meals. See Part 11, Attachment 1 for a prototype form for documenting a medical or special dietary needs substitution.

- Medical Statements In order to claim a meal that does not conform to the regulatory meal pattern, there must be a medical reason or a special dietary need and a signed statement on file.
- Disabilities If an institution is serving a child with a disability and that disability directly affects which foods the child can consume, the parent and/or guardian must submit a medical statement signed by a licensed physician. The medical statement must be kept on file, handled confidentially, and must describe:

- o The child's disability and an explanation of why the disability restricts the child's diet:
- o The major life activity affected by the disability;
- o The food or foods to be omitted from the child's diet, and
- o The appropriate substitutions.
- Special Dietary Needs If an institution is serving a child with special dietary needs (e.g., vegetarian), the parent/guardian may request substitutions by submitting a medical statement signed by a recognized medical authority, such as physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner or other professional specified by the State agency, listing the foods to be omitted and appropriate substitutions.

Note: Milk substitutions that are made due to special dietary needs that are not a disability must be nutritionally equivalent to milk, even if accompanied by a medical statement. The institution can make such substitutions at its discretion."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that parent or guardian statements and/or medical statements are kept on file for participants with special dietary needs or disabilities and that proper meal substitutions are provided for meals claimed.

7. Sponsored center served meals outside of the approved serving time

Condition

During our on-site monitoring visit at **Country Home Day Care** on March 12, 2020 to observe a supplement service, we noted that the supplement was served outside of the TIPS approved time. We arrived at 2:00 pm to observe the supplement service with an approved meal service time in TIPS for 2:30 pm to 3:00 pm. The assistant director on-site informed us that the supplement had already been served prior to our arrival. Since supplement was served prior to the monitor's arrival, we could not determine if the supplement served was creditable.

As a result, 55 supplements claimed were disallowed. (See Exhibit G)

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20...."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(9) states, "Each child care center must maintain daily records of time of service meal counts by type (breakfast, lunch, supper, and snacks) served to enrolled children, and to adults performing labor necessary to the food service."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that meals are served during the approved feeding site time.

8. Sponsored centers and homes did not serve a whole grain-rich component once per day as required

Condition

Based on our review of the menus provided, the Sponsor did not document a whole grain-rich component was served once per day for meals served to participants as follows:

Due to the new the CACFP meal pattern requirements and emphasis on providing technical assistance during the implementation process, there were no meals disallowed.

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(a)(4)(a)(b) states "At least one serving per day, across all eating occasions of bread, cereals, and grains, must be whole grainrich. Whole grain-rich foods contain at least 50 percent whole grains and the remaining grains in the food are enriched, and must meet the whole grain-rich criteria specified in FNS guidance."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.14(b) states, "In the event that the State agency finds that an institution which prepares its own meals is failing to meet the meal requirements of §226.20, the State agency need not disallow payment or collect an overpayment arising out of such failure if the institution takes such other action as, in the opinion of the State agency, will have a corrective effect."

Condition

The Sponsor should ensure menus meet the meal patterns established by the USDA.

9. Sponsored centers and homes purchased and/or served breakfast cereals that did not meet USDA meal component requirements

Condition

During our monitoring visit on March 10, 2020, we observed a breakfast meal at the home of **Kimberly Hurst**. We observed ten (10) participants were served Very Berry Cheerios, fruit juice, and milk. "Very Berry Cheerios" contains approximately 32 grams of sugar per 100 grams of dry cereal.

During our review of menus provided for **Discovery Learning Academy** for the review period, we noted Honey Nut Cheerios was served for breakfasts on March 13, 2020 and March 23, 2020. Honey Nut Cheerios cereal contains approximately 9 grams of sugar per 28 grams of dry cereal.

Also, during our review of the receipts provided for **The Village** we noted Honey Nut Cheerios had been purchased. Honey Nut Cheerios cereal contains approximately 9 grams of sugar per 28 grams of dry cereal.

Due to the updated CACFP meal pattern requirements and emphasis on providing technical assistance during the implementation process, there were no meals disallowed.

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(a)(4)(ii) states, "... Breakfast cereals must contain no more than 6 grams of sugar per dry ounce (no more than 21.2 grams sucrose

and other sugars per 100 grams of dry cereal)"

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.14(b) states, "In the event that the State agency finds that an institution which prepares its own meals is failing to meet the meal requirements of §226.20, the State agency need not disallow payment or collect an overpayment arising out of such failure if the institution takes such other action as, in the opinion of the State agency, will have a corrective effect."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure menus meet the meal patterns established by the USDA.

10. The Sponsor provided menus that did not name specific type of milk served

Condition

We requested menus and other records to support meals reported as served. The menus provided for **Discovery Learning Academy** and **Jungle Town** did not identify the specific type of milk served to participants for meals with a milk component listed.

There were no meals disallowed as it was observed the correct milk was provided to each age group and receipts were sufficient to identify the type of milk purchased.

This is a repeat finding from a previous report dated July 1, 2019.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20.... Menus and any other nutritional records required by the State agency shall be maintained to document compliance with such requirements."

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 17-2017 Documenting Meals in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u>, states, "CACFP centers and day care homes are required to demonstrate that they are serving meals that meet the meal pattern requirements. Centers and day care homes must keep records of menus...."

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 17-2016 Nutrition Requirements for Fluid Milk and Fluid Milk Substitutions in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u>, states, "In order to ensure compliance with the milk requirements outlined in 7 CFR 226.20(a)(1) and this memorandum, centers and day care homes must document the type of milk served on their menu. This includes listing the fat content (e.g. whole, low-fat or 1%, and fat-free or skim) and if the milk is flavored. It is the responsibility of the State agency or sponsor, as applicable, to further ensure that the correct type of milk is being served when conducting reviews."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure menus reflect and meet the meal patterns established by the USDA.

Note: Our observation of the meal services during the review period, revealed no significant

deficiencies at the following centers and homes: Horn Lake, Presbyterian, Red Rover, Clarice Ross, and Jessica Young.

Additionally, there were no significant deficiencies noted based on the review of documentation provided for Brookside and Kinder Academy and the homes: Marla Breedlove, Melinda Brown, Brandi Cheatham, Laquita Dandridge, Chasyti Goodwin, Tracy Herman, Carolyn Holloway, Becky Holmes, Kimberly Holmes, Candus Johnson, Chasity Lopez, Alice Perkey, and Karen Williams.

Technical Assistance Provided

During the exit conference conducted via Skype on September 24, 2020, the Sponsor requested technical assistance regarding parent or guardian statements and medical statements. Information was sent via email on September 26, 2020.

Disallowed Meals Cost

Based on the review, we determined that the Sponsor's noncompliance with the applicable Federal and State regulations that govern the CACFP resulted in a total disallowed cost of \$9,095.45
