RE: Notice of Serious Deficiency for the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Agreement Number 00-766 and Demand for Overpayment

Dear Ms. Partee:

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) for Alumni Music Incorporated (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00766, during the period of August 10, 2020 through August 19, 2020. Our scope of the review was for reimbursement made to the Sponsor for June 2020. We also reviewed documents to the support the claim for reimbursement for July 2020. The claim for July 2020 was not paid as of the date of this report. Therefore, the disallowed cost noted below is result of noncompliance for June 2020 claim for reimbursement.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification based on a review of the documents obtained from Sponsor via e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmission of documents. We also obtained confirmation from the Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the SFSP.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation. Also, to determine if the Sponsor complied with the applicable Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

<u>Important COVID-19 note</u>: Due the current outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to your organization personnel and our staff, all our staff are working from home with no or very limited access to the office. Therefore, we will not send a copy of this report via regular mail until further notice. Please confirm the receipt of this email as it is currently the option to communicate to you. Background

We inspected meal count sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed for reimbursement to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also reviewed documentation of the Sponsor's financial transactions including, but not limited to, purchases of food.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor was approved and operated 10 feeding sites during the review period of June 2020. Additionally, for the month of July 2020, the Sponsor was approved for 17 feeding sites of which 15 were listed as operating during the review period of July 2020. We reviewed the documentation to support the claims for reimbursement that the Sponsor provided.

SFSP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement (snack) meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The SFSP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements. In addition, we conducted a site desk reviews in July 2020 for the **0007 Youth Baptist Church, 0003 Morris Park, and 0005 Dunlap**.

SERIOUS DEFICIENCY DETERMINATION

Based on the monitoring review, DHS has determined that Alumni Music Incorporated is seriously deficient in its operation of the SFSP. In addition, DHS has identified Gabriel Partee, Executive Director, as responsible for the serious deficiencies in light of their responsibility for the overall management of Alumni Music Incorporated's SFSP.

If Alumni Music Incorporated does not fully and permanently correct all of the serious deficiencies and submit documentation of the corrective action by the due date specified at the close of this report, the Department will:

Propose to terminate Alumni Music Incorporated's agreement to participate in the SFSP.

The authorization for this action is found in Paragraph 2.m. of your SFSP Provider Agreement and in the SFSP regulations at 7 C.F.R. § 225.11(c). You may not appeal a finding of serious deficiency.

SERIOUS DEFICIENCIES AND REQUIRED CORRECTIVE ACTION

Our review of the Sponsor's records for June 2020 and July 2020 disclosed the following:

1. The Sponsor claimed more meals than what the documents supported

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

June 2020

The claim for reimbursement summary for June 2020 reported 1,864 lunch meals, 9,615 supplements, and 7,751 supper meals. However, our review of the available records reconciled zero lunch meals, 2,852 supplements, and 2,852 supper meals prior to any meal disallowances. The differences were based on the following.

The Sponsor over reported the number of supplements claimed for reimbursement by 4,899.

July 2020

The claim for reimbursement summary for July 2020 reported 3,668 lunch meals, 27,402 supplements, and 23,934 supper meals. However, our review of the available records reconciled zero lunch meals, 13,549 supplements, and 13,839 supper meals prior to any meal disallowances. The differences were based on the following.

The Sponsor over reported supper meals claimed for reimbursement by 10,095.

Note: Meal Counts for sample sites 0005 Dunlap and 0003 Morris Park were received during the July 2020 desk site reviews. We requested the meal counts to complete a 5-day reconciliation for sampled sites. The Sponsor did not provide additional meal counts for the sites. Only meal counts received by the deadline of August 17, 2020 were compiled.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.9 (d)(5) states, "... In submitting a claim for reimbursement, each sponsor shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support this claim. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served claimed during the period covered by the records in question...."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.15(c)(1) states, "Sponsors shall maintain accurate records justifying all meals claimed and documenting that all Program funds were spent only on allowable Child Nutrition Program costs. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served and/or administrative costs claimed during the period covered by the records in question. The sponsor's records shall be available at all times for inspection and audit by representatives of the Secretary, the Comptroller General of the United States, and the State agency for a period of three years following the date of submission of the final claim for reimbursement for the fiscal year."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure claims for reimbursement are completed correctly and based on accurate supporting documents.

2. The Sponsor overstated the number of meals eligible for reimbursement based on the Point of Service meal count sheets

Condition

The Sponsor claimed meals as served for which the meal count sheets indicted that more or fewer meals were served. Meals must be marked at the actual point of service. Meals were also disallowed due to no point of service being completed at all. Below is a summary of the overstated or understated meals:

As a result, 248 supplements and 43 supper meals claimed for reimbursement were disallowed for the month of July 2020.

Criteria

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 112 states, "Only complete meals served to eligible children can be claimed for reimbursement. Therefore, meals must be counted at the actual point of service, i.e., meals are counted as they are served, to ensure that an accurate count of meals served is obtained and reported..."

Recommendation

The Sponsors should ensure feeding site personnel are accurately completing daily meal count sheets to support the claim for reimbursement prior to submission.

3. Point of Service meal count forms were not signed by feeding site personnel

Condition

Point of service meal count forms did not have the signature of site personnel on any of the meal count sheets listed below. Meal disallowances are as follows:

Criteria

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 139 states, "All sponsors must use daily site records in order to document the number of Program meals they have served to children... Sponsors should collect these site records at least every week... When they collect the site records, sponsors should check for the site supervisor's signature..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure the site supervisors are trained on the completion of meal count forms and check to make sure each form is signed.

4. The Sponsor did not provide menus for meals claimed for reimbursement

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

The Sponsor did not provide a supplement menu for June 2020. A reimbursable supplement must contain two of the following four components: Milk, vegetables/fruit/100% juice, a grain, meat/meat alternate.

July 2020

The Sponsor did not provide a supplement, lunch or supper menus for July 2020. A reimbursable supplement must contain two of the following four components: Milk, vegetables/fruit/100% juice, a grain, meat/meat alternate. A reimbursable lunch/supper meal consists of milk, two or more servings of vegetables/fruit/100% juice, a grain and meat/meat alternate.

As a result, 13,301 supplements and 13,721 supper meals claimed for reimbursement were disallowed for July 2020.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.16 (d) (1) (2) (3) states, "Sponsors shall ensure that meals served meet all of the (meal pattern) requirements."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.9 (d)(5) states, "... In submitting a claim for reimbursement, each sponsor shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support this claim. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served claimed during the period covered by the records in question..."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.15(c)(1) states, "Sponsors shall maintain accurate records justifying all meals claimed and documenting that all Program funds were spent only on allowable Child Nutrition Program costs. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served and/or administrative costs claimed during the period covered by the records in question. The sponsor's records shall be available at all times for inspection and audit by representatives of the Secretary, the Comptroller General of the United States, and the State agency for a period of three years following the date of submission of the final claim for reimbursement for the fiscal year."

Recommendation

Sponsor should ensure all records are maintained and available upon request.

5. The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of operation

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

June 2020

0011 Richmond

The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the feeding site was not approved to serve supper meals on Wednesday or Sunday. According to meal count documentation, the Sponsor claimed for reimbursement 85 supper meals on Wednesday, June 24, 2020 and 85 supper meals Sunday, June 28, 2020.

0007 Youth Baptist Church

The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the feeding site was not approved to serve supplements or supper meals on Friday or Saturday. According to meal count documentation, the feeding site claimed 100 supper meals and 100 supplements on Friday, June 26, 2020. Additionally, the feeding site claimed 100 supper meals and 100 supplements on Saturday, June 27, 2020. The supplements were disallowed in Finding 4.

As a result, 370 supper meals claimed for reimbursement were disallowed for the month of June 2020.

July 2020

0005 Dunlap

The Sponsor claimed meals on unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the site was not approved to serve supper meals on Saturday. According to meal count documentation, the Sponsor claimed 62 supper meals on Saturday, July 4, 2020. The meals were disallowed in Finding 4.

0016 No Child Left Behind

The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the feeding site was not approved to serve supper meals on Saturday or Sunday. According to meal count documentation, the Sponsor claimed supper meals on Saturday dates of July 11th, July 18th and July 25th. Additionally, the meal count documents supper meals served on Sunday dates of July 12th, July 19th and July 26th. Each meal documents 80 meals served. The meals were disallowed in Finding 4.

0011 Richmond

The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the site is not approved to serve supper meals on Wednesday or Sunday. According to meal count documentation, the Sponsor claimed supper meals on Wednesday dates of July 1st, July 8th, July 15th and July 22nd. Additionally, the meal count documents supper meals served on Sunday dates of July 5th, July 12th, July 19th and July 26th. Each meal documents 85 meals served apart from July 5th where 75 meals were claimed. The meals were disallowed in Finding 4.

0007 Youth Baptist Church

The Sponsor claimed meals for unapproved days of the week. Per the TIPS feeding site application, the feeding site was not approved to serve supper meals on Friday or Saturday. According to meal count documentation, the Sponsor claimed supper meals on Friday July 24, 2020. The meals were disallowed in Finding 4.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.16 (c)(3) states, "Meals served outside of the period of approved meal service shall not be eligible for Program payments."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure only meal periods approved for meal service are claimed for reimbursement.

6. Delivery tickets did not support meal count records

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

Our review of the Sponsor's meal count records and delivery tickets revealed that Sponsor either did not maintain delivery receipts or the number of meals documented on the delivery tickets did not support the number of meals claimed. Deficiencies are as follows:

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 7 CFR 225.15 (c) states, "Sponsors shall maintain accurate records which justify all costs and meals claimed. ..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure the sites are properly trained on record keeping policies and procedures. The Sponsor should ensure that delivery tickets support the meal counts.

7. The Sponsor did not comply with training requirements

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

Our review of the Sponsor's training documentation found the following deficiencies:

- Site supervisors listed in the TIPS site applications for **0001 Millbranch Rd. and 0002 Graceland Farms** are not documented as attending the SFSP training.
- Site supervisors listed on the TIPS site applications for 0012 Jessica's Outreach, 0014 One Child
 at a Time, 0015 Youth Outreach, 0013 Giving Back, 0001 Millbranch Rd., 0002 Graceland Farms
 and 0016 No Child Left Behind are not documented as attending the Civil Rights Training.
- Site personnel other than the site supervisor listed in TIPS who signed meal count sheets was not documented as having the SFSP training for **0016 No Child Left Behind.**

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.15 (d) (1) states, "Each sponsor shall hold Program training sessions for its administrative and site personnel and shall allow no site to operate until personnel have attended at least one of these training sessions. Training of site personnel shall, at a minimum, include: the purpose of the Program; site eligibility; recordkeeping; site operations; meal pattern requirements; and the duties of a monitor. Each site shall have present at each meal service at least one person who has received this training."

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 109, states, "...If a site supervisor who has attended the sponsor's training session resigns during the summer, the sponsor is responsible for ensuring that the new site supervisor receives all necessary training before taking charge of the site..."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.7 (g)(1) states, "Each State agency shall comply with all requirements of title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and the Department's regulations concerning nondiscrimination (7 CFR parts 15, 15a and 15b), including requirements for racial and ethnic participation data collection, public notification of the nondiscrimination policy, and reviews to assure compliance with such policy, to the end that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under, the Program."

Recommendation

Sponsors should ensure all site and administrative personnel are trained prior to any SFSP duties.

8. The Sponsor reported the number of operation days incorrectly

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

The reported days of operation for multiple sites were incorrect. Deficiencies were as follows:

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.9 (d) (5) states, "In submitting a claim for reimbursement, each sponsor shall certify that the claim is correct and that records are available to support this claim."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should review meal count sheets to ensure that operating days are correct when submitting claim for reimbursement.

9. The Sponsor did not provide documentation of Racial/Ethnic Data information completion for any sites

Condition

The Sponsor did not provide documentation of the completion of Racial/Ethnic data information for any of the operating sites.

<u>Criteria</u>

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.7 (g)(1) states, "Each State agency shall comply with all requirements of title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and the Department's regulations concerning nondiscrimination (7 CFR parts 15, 15a and 15b), including requirements for racial and ethnic participation data collection, public notification of the nondiscrimination policy, and reviews to assure compliance with such policy, to the end that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under, the Program."

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 122, states, "The sponsor also must collect ethnic/racial category data each year by ethnic/racial category for each site under the sponsor's

jurisdiction. Sponsors of residential camps must collect and maintain this information separately for each session of the camp. For all other sites, the sponsor must count the participating children at least once during the site's operation. The sponsor may use visual identification to determine a participant's racial/ethnic category. For collection purposes, a participant may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded as a member of by the community."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure all sites in operation have the racial ethnic data information completed as required. Documentation should be maintained and available upon request.

10. The Sponsor did not conduct pre-operational site visits

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

The Sponsor provided a monitoring plan with dates of the planned pre-operational visits but did not provide documentation of the completion of the visits for any of the approved operating sites. The visits are required as this is a new Sponsor.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 7 CFR 225.14 (c) (6) states, Sponsors must certify "all sites have been visited and have the capability and the facilities to provide the meal service planned for the number of children anticipated to be served" before they begin operations.

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 42, states "Prior to approval, sponsors must visit new sites and any sites that had operational problems in the previous year...These visits are to determine that the sites have the facilities to provide meal service for the anticipated number of children in attendance and the capability to conduct the proposed meal service. Sponsors should record the date of the pre-operational visit to each site and the name of the person who visited each site."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure all pre-operational visits are completed prior to beginning site operations for sites that are required.

11. The Sponsor did not conduct monitoring reviews as required

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

The Sponsor provided a monitoring plan with listed dates of planned monitoring reviews but did not provide documentation of the completion of the first week or first four-week monitoring reviews for any of the operating sites.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 7 CFR 225.15 (d) (2) states, "Sponsors shall visit each of their sites at least once during the first week of operation under the Program and shall promptly take such actions as are necessary to correct any deficiencies."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 7 CFR 225.15 (d) (3) states, "Sponsors shall review food service operations at each site at least once during the first four weeks of Program operations, and thereafter shall maintain a reasonable level of site monitoring, Sponsors shall complete a monitoring form developed by the State agency during the conduct of these reviews."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure all sites are in compliance with the USDA monitoring guidelines.

12. The Sponsor expensed unallowable costs to SFSP

This is a Serious Deficiency

Condition

The Sponsor's receipts for the operating period of June 2020 and July 2020 disclosed unallowed cost totaling \$1,574.87. These costs were not included in the Sponsor's approved budget. In addition, prior approval from DHS was not obtained for the expenses charged to SFSP. This resulted in unallowable costs totaling \$1,578.87 (\$752.47 For June 2020; and \$22.40 for July 2020). Criteria

Per FNS Instruction 796-4, Rev. 4, Page 14 -16 Section D, titled (Unallowable Costs) states unallowable costs are costs for which SFSP funds may not be disbursed. They include the following:

- "... Entertainment, i.e., cost of amusements, social activities, and incidental related costs such as meals, beverages, lodging, rentals, transportation, gratuities, etc.
- Administrative costs not included in the sponsor's budget as finally approved.
- Any other cost incurred which program officials determine to be in violation of applicable laws and regulations".

Per 2 CFR 215 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Learning Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations, Section 215. 25 (b), titled Revision of Budget and Program Plans state "Recipients are required to report deviations from budget and program plans and request prior approvals for budget and program plan revisions..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should comply with federal regulations and only expense items to the SFSP program that is allowable and approved in their budget.

13. The Sponsor did not provide proof of an adequate financial system

Condition

The Sponsor did not provide a bank statement, general ledger or any other proof of an adequate financial system was provided.

<u>Criteria</u>

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 144, "To substantiate your claim for reimbursement, sponsors must keep all records of meal counts taken daily at each site, operating costs including food and other costs, administrative costs including labor and supplies, and funds accruing to the Program.

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.15 (c) (1) states, "... Sponsors shall maintain accurate records justifying all meals claimed and documenting that all Program funds were spent only on allowable Child Nutrition Program costs. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served and/or administrative costs claimed during the period covered by the records in question. The sponsor's records shall be available at all times for inspection and audit by representatives of the Secretary, the Comptroller General of the United States, and the State agency for a period of three years following the date of submission of the final claim for reimbursement for the fiscal year."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should maintain a general ledger to support the food and non-food purchases made with CACFP funds.

14. The Sponsor did not provide documentation of labor payments made to employees

Condition

The Sponsor provided time and attendance reports for some employees, but no other verifications were provided to ensure employees were paid or the amount paid.

Criteria

The <u>USDA Administration Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 143, states, "Records must be maintained that document the amount and purpose of all administrative costs attributed to SFSP."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.15 (c) (1) states, "... Sponsors shall maintain accurate records justifying all meals claimed and documenting that all Program funds were spent only on allowable Child Nutrition Program costs. Failure to maintain such records may be grounds for denial of reimbursement for meals served and/or administrative costs claimed during the period covered by the records in question. The sponsor's records shall be available at all times for inspection and audit by representatives of the Secretary, the Comptroller General of the United States, and the State agency for a period of three years following the date of submission of the final claim for reimbursement for the fiscal year."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that all SFSP funds are accounted for accurately.

OVERPAYMENT - RIGHT TO APPEAL

Disallowed Meals Cost

Based on the review, we determined that the Sponsor's noncompliance with the applicable Federal and

State regulations that govern the SFSP for June 2020, resulted in disallowed meals cost of \$41,784.01.

Unallowable Administrative Cost

Based on the review, we determined the Sponsor's noncompliance with the applicable Federal and State regulations that govern the CACFP resulted in total unallowable administrative cost of \$752.47 for June 2020, and \$822.40 for July 2020.

The procedures for submitting an appeal regarding the amount of overpayment are enclosed. Please note that the request for appeal <u>must be in writing</u> and must be received by our Department no later than <u>ten (10) calendar days</u> from your receipt of this letter. 7 C.F.R. § 225.13(a). The appeal must be submitted to:

If the Institution decides to appeal the amount of overpayment, all appeal procedures must be followed as failure to do so may result in the denial of your request for an appeal.

SUMMARY

The Department has determined that Alumni Music Incorporated is seriously deficient in its operation of the SFSP and that Gabriel Partee, Executive Director, is responsible for the serious deficiencies.

You may not appeal the serious deficiency determination itself. If the Department proposes to terminate Alumni Music Incorporated's SFSP agreement, you will be able to appeal those actions and you will be advised of your appeal rights and the appeal procedures at that time.

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:

- Log into the Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) and revise the claim submitted for June 2020, which contains the verified claim data from the enclosed exhibits. <u>Please note that, if</u> <u>the claim is revised</u>, TIPS will automatically deduct the overpayment from your next SFSP claim for reimbursement. <u>OR</u>
- If you are no longer participating in the SFSP program, remit a check payable to the *Tennessee Department of Human Services* in the amount noted in the report for recovery of the amounts disallowed in this report. *Please return the attached billing notice with your check*; and
- Prepare and submit a corrective action plan to address the deficiencies identified in this report. The corrective action plan template is attached. Please return the corrective action plan to:

If the Department does not receive the corrective action plan by the deadline date, or the Department determines that the corrective action plan does not provide for the full and permanent correction of the serious deficiencies and findings, the Department will propose to terminate the Sponsor's SFSP Provider Agreement and to disqualify you and the Sponsor from future SFSP participation by issuing a Notice of Proposed Termination.
