Dear Ms. Anagnost,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) of Knoxville-Knox County Community Action Committee (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-042 during the period of August 31, 2020 through October 22, 2020. Our scope of the review was for reimbursement made to the Sponsor for July 2020.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID-19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via pick up, e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmissions of documents. We also, obtained confirmation from the feeding sites and Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the SFSP.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation, as well as to determine if the Sponsor complied with the applicable Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had 77 feeding sites operating during the review period. Cal Johnson Go, Cal Johnson Rec Center, Cecil Webb Go, Cecil Webb Rec Center, Christenberry Go, Christenberry Rec Center, Cumberland Estates Go, Cumberland Estates Rec Center, EV Davidson Go, EV Davidson Rec Center, Fort Sanders Shades, Lonsdale C&C, Lonsdale Emerald, Lonsdale Go, Lonsdale Rec Center, Milton Roberts Go, Richard Leake, Richard Leake Go, South Knoxville Community Center, Vestal Boys and Girls Club, West Haven Rec Center, and YMCA After School were selected as the sample. A meal observation was made at each of the sample sites during the month of July 2020. In addition, we reviewed all meal counts for all sites operating during the review period.

Background

SFSP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The SFSP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for July 2020 and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements.

Our review of the Sponsor's records for July 2020 disclosed the following:

1. The Sponsor did not provide documentation to support sufficient quantities of milk were purchased for all meals reported

Condition

Based on the number of meals served with milk as a required component, a total of 90,695 half pints of milk were required. However, the Sponsor could only document the purchase of 86,192 half pints of milk, resulting in a shortage of 4,503 half pints of milk.

As a result, 4,503 supplement meals claimed for reimbursement were disallowed. (See Exhibits A, C, E, G, I, K. L, P, R, U, V, X)

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.16 (d) (1) (2) (3) states, "Sponsors shall ensure that meals served meet all of the (meal pattern) requirements."

The <u>USDA</u> Administration <u>Guide Summer Food Service Program</u>, page 58, states that for a breakfast, lunch and supper to be a reimbursable meal, it must contain one serving of milk. Substitutions/Modifications may be made for participants with disabilities or with special dietary needs when supported by a statement from a recognized medical authority that includes recommended alternate foods, *7 CFR 225.16 (f) (4)*.

Recommendation

Sponsor should keep a milk inventory to ensure there is enough milk for each meal that requires milk and claimed for reimbursement.

2. The Sponsor did not maintain racial and ethnic data as required

Condition

The Sponsor did not complete the ethnic data of the racial/ethnic data form for the feeding sites at Cal Johnson Rec Center, Cecil Webb Rec Center, Cumberland Estates Rec Center, EV Davidson Rec Center, Fort Sanders Shades, Lonsdale C&C, Lonsdale Emerald, Lonsdale Rec Center, Richard Leake, Vestal Boys and Girls Club, West Haven Rec Center, and YMCA After School.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 225.7 (g) (1) states, "Each State agency shall comply with all requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and the Department's regulations concerning nondiscrimination (7 CFR parts 15, 15a and 15b), including requirements for racial and ethnic participation data collection, public notification of the nondiscrimination policy and reviews to assure compliance, with such policy, to the end that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under, the Program."

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) Summer Food Service Program 2016 *Administration Guide* for sponsors, page 122, states that "the Sponsor must collect ethnic/racial category data each year by ethnic/racial category for each site under the sponsor's jurisdiction..."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure racial and ethnic data forms are fully and accurately completed.

3. The Sponsor did not conduct monitoring of its feeding sites as required

Condition

The Sponsor did not use a monitoring form to capture the information required by DHS for the first week and first four (4) weeks monitoring at their sample sites.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations 7 CFR 225.15 (d) (2) states, "Sponsors shall visit each of their sites at least once during the first week of operation under the Program and shall promptly tack such actions as are necessary to correct any deficiencies."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations 7 CFR 225.15 (d) (3) states, "Sponsors shall review food service operations at each site at least once during the first four weeks of Program operations, and thereafter shall maintain a reasonable level of site monitoring. Sponsors shall complete a monitoring form developed by the State agency during the conduct of these reviews."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that monitoring forms capture the required review elements.

Note: Our meal observations at the sample sites during July 2020 revealed no significant deficiencies.

Technical Assistance Provided

Technical assistance was offered however it was declined by the Sponsor.

Disallowed Meals Cost

Based on the review, we determined that the Sponsor's noncompliance with the applicable Federal and State regulations that govern the SFSP resulted in a total disallowed cost of \$4,300.37.

Corrective Action

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:

- Log into the Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) and revise the claim submitted for July 2020, which contains the verified claim data from the enclosed exhibits.
- Remit a check payable to the *Tennessee Department of Human Services* in the amount noted in the report for recovery of the amounts disallowed in this report. *Please return* the attached billing notice with your check; and
- Prepare and submit a corrective action plan to address the deficiencies identified in this
