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Dear State Board of Education and Dr. Nixon:

As the State Board considers the future of English as a Second Language education in Tennessee, it is important that we recognize the value of adopting the World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment (WIDA) standards with which the Early English Language Development (E-ELD) standards for dual language learners have been aligned.

The importance of this decision has significant ramifications for the youngest children in our State who are a critical and vital part of the next generations. Tennessee has adopted WIDA and the TN-ELS for four-year-olds have been revised, thus the next important step should be to further pursue the alignment of E-ELDs with these same standards.

Through UTC's work with a National Professional Development grant which focuses on preparing both pre-service and in-service educators, we have seen the confidence educators have in their own ability through better preparation.
