





The MCOs are expected to have all contracting completed by the end of December 2022 for Program Year 2023. A full list of organizations will be released after all contracting has been completed.



PCMH Reporting Only Measures for PY2023

Measures to be added to Reporting Only

- *Breast Cancer Screening (BCS-E)
- Colorectal Cancer Screening (COL)
- Topical Fluoride for Children (TFC)
- Kidney Health Evaluation for Patients with Diabetes (KED)
- **Depression Screening and Follow-up for Adolescents and Adults (DSF-E)
- **Social Need Screening and Intervention (SNS-E)
- These measures will be added to Reporting Only Measures for program year 2023.
 - All measures will appear in the first PY2023 reports delivered in August 2023 except for TFC and SNS-E.
 - TFC and SNS-E will not appear until May 2024 reports.
- *BCS is a current reporting only measure but is being retired by NCQA, therefore we are transitioning to the BCS Electronic Clinical Data System (ECDS) reporting measure.
- **DSF-E and SNS-E will also be added to the THL reporting only measures.

Reporting Only Measures: DMH, TFC, SNS-E

- Because DMH, TFC and SNS-E are new measures with new specifications from NCQA, these measures will be delayed in their appearance in the quarterly provider reports.
- When new measures/specifications are released, the MCOs must have time to update to the new measure/specification before it can appear in a report.

Diagnosed Mental Health Disorders (DMH)

- New reporting only measure for Program Year 2022
- Announced during the 2022 Program Enhancements Webinar
- Replaces Mental Health Utilization (MPT)
- Will appear in May 2023 Provider Reports

Topical Fluoride for Children (TFC); Social Need Screening and Intervention (SNS-E)

- New reporting only measures for Program Year 2023
- Will appear in May 2024 Provider Reports

When calculating the value of redistributed stars, the complete number (50.00/total # of eligible stars) and not the rounded value (i.e., 8.33% or 16.67%) will be used in order to achieve the maximum 50% value.

Example:	Previous Calculation	New Calculation Calculation

PCMH Transformation Payments

- Beginning January 1, 2023 the \$1 PMPM transformation payment will no longer be paid to new organizations for their first year of participation in the program.
- There are no changes for 2023 to the PMPM activity payments to participating PCMH organizations.

2023 MCO Educational Offerings and Support: Coaching and Collaboratives

- PCMH Coaching
 - MCO staff will continue to offer ongoing primary care transformation support to PCMH organizations.
 - For those organizations that receive coaching, primary coaches will conduct an annual review in December or January to assess the needs of the organization.
 - Information garnered from the annual reviews will be used to compile a coaching plan for 2022 that focuses on improving performance or increasing primary care and behavioral health integration.


