

### **Potential PCMH Funding Increase**

- To support the incredible work our PCMH practices continue to do,
   TennCare leadership has requested an average \$1.00 increase to all PCMH Activity Payments (Per Member Per Month payments).
- TennCare has presented this request for consideration and inclusion in the Governor's SFY 2025 budget
- If included, TennCare's budget will then be reviewed and approved by Tennessee's General Assembly in Spring 2024. (SFY 2025 begins July 1, 2024 and ends June 30, 2025)
- If you are in support of this increase, feel free to reach out to your state representatives




## **PCMH Program Stats**

# Glycemic Status Assessment for Patients with Diabetes (GSD)

#### **Description**

The percentage of members 18–75 years of age with diabetes (types 1 and 2) whose most recent glycemic status (hemoglobin A1c [HbA1c] or glucose management indicator [GMI]) was at the following levels during the measurement year:

• Glycemic Status <8.0%.

Threshold: > 47%

Applicable for Family and Adult practices only





# Appropriate Treatment for Upper Respiratory Infection (URI)



#### **Description**

The percentage of episodes for members 3 months of age and older with a diagnosis of upper respiratory infection (URI) that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event.

Threshold: ≥ 93%

Applicable for Pediatric practices only



# Breast Cancer Screening- Electronic (BCS-E)

#### **Description**

The percentage of members 50–74 years of age who were recommended for routine breast cancer screening and had a mammogram to screen for breast cancer.

Electronic measures allow health plans to use data from EHRs/PHPs, HIEs/Clinical registry, and case management systems in addition to the administrative claims data.

Threshold: > 47%

Applicable for Family practices only

## **2024 MCO Educational Offerings and Support:** Coaching and Collaboratives

- PCMH Coaching
  - MCO staff will continue to offer ongoing primary care transformation support to PCMH organizations.
  - For those organizations that receive coaching, primary coaches will conduct an annual review in December or January to assess the needs of the organization.
