Updated PCMH application and selection timeline

Release PCMH application

PCMH applications due back to State

Selection of Wave 1 practices

Wave 1 practices activities begin

By July 1, 2016

- Finalize PCMH application
- Publish supporting information on website to provide context for potential applicants
- Open application to potential respondents

By August 1, 2016

Practices to submit applications, with State fielding questions as needed

By September 1, 2016

 State to synthesize results of application and announce Wave 1 PCMHs to practices and other stakeholders January 1, 2017

 20 – 30 practices begin Wave 1 of the TennCare PCMH Program

The application window for Tennessee's PCMH program has been shifted to accommodate the CPC+ schedule. CMS will announce selected regions for the CPC+ program on July 15. This does not affect the program's launch date of January 1, 2017.




Tennessee Health Link application available-Reminder

- Tennessee is working with providers to improve integrated and valuebased behavioral and primary care services for TennCare members with significant behavioral health needs.
- Tennessee Health Link will help providers to integrate care and build practices' capacity to transition to value-based payment and delivery in the future.
- The State is continuing to accept applications from providers interested in participating in the program.

PHIP Focus Group Feedback

- Regional Relevance of Health Topics
 - Obesity was #1 in 1/3 of cities
 - West & South TN, especially
 - Perinatal Health & NAS was #1 in 1/3 of cities
 - Middle & East TN, especially
 - Tobacco Use was only #1 in 1 city in NE TN
 - Twice the prevalence of state average
 - Missing Health Topics of Relevance:
 - Mental Health
 - Substance Abuse
 - Dental/Oral Health

Regional Recommendations

- There's still a struggle to access basic care in rural areas, much less preventive services.
- Social nudges work.
- Health is steeped in culture.
- Build up public/private partnerships.
- Flexibility is a must, because cultures are vastly different across (and within) communities.
- Missing pieces: Mental/behavioral health, oral/dental health, substance abuse, asthma, autism

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Request for Proposals- Practice Transformation Training contractor

- Tennessee issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on May 10,2016 to serve as the Practice Transformation Training contractor in support of the Tennessee Health Care Innovation Initiative.
- Through this contract, training and technical assistance services will be provided to primary care practices and behavioral health providers to assist them in participating in TennCare's Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) program and TennCare's Health Link program for members with acute behavioral health needs.
- All participating Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) and Health Link providers will be eligible for 2 years of practice transformation support from the Practice Transformation Training contractor.



Request for Proposals- Practice Transformation Training contractor

- The selected Practice Transformation Training contractor will be responsible for the following activities to include (but not limited to):
 - Develop PCMH training curriculum
 - Develop Tennessee Health Link training curriculum
 - Conduct initial and ongoing provider assessments
 - Conduct large format in-person training sessions
 - Conduct learning collaboratives
 - Conduct one-on-one coaching sessions
 - Conduct webinars
 - Produce recorded training sessions
 - Provide a compendia of resources

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Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 (MACRA)

- On April 27, 2016, the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was issued by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to implement key provisions of the MACRA.
- The MACRA replaces the Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) formula for paying clinicians with a framework called the "Quality Payment Program" beginning in 2019.
- The Quality Payment Program includes two paths: (1) the Merit-Based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) or (2) Advanced Alternative Payment Models (APMS).
