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State SIM Population Health Improvement Update

- We are developing a common definition of population health and a way to measure population health and improvement in Tennessee.
- We are holding six public workshops across the state to develop a regional consensus on the key principles and indicators of population health.
- Workshops will be held in October & November in the following cities:



- We are also holding stakeholder-specific workshops for groups that we partner
 with to get their feedback on defining and measuring population health. We are
 starting with the Cumberland Pediatric Foundation, the Hospital Alliance of
 Tennessee, and the YMCA.
 - Other interest parties: THA, TCAAP, Methodist Le Bonheur, TDMHSAS, and others.
- The results and feedback generated during these workshops will be incorporated into the Tennessee State Health Plan, the state's main health policy tool, and eventually incorporated into a web-based dashboard.




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Episodes of Care- Stakeholder Feedback Sessions



On July 19, 2016, the feedback sessions took place simultaneously in six locations across the state linking clinicians, administrators, payers and other stakeholders by video-conference in Nashville, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Johnson City, Jackson and Memphis.

 This feedback session provided the opportunity for the public to comment on what is working well with each episode's clinical design and where providers would suggest changes for next year.



Eight episodes of care (Waves 1 and 2) were open for public feedback

Episodes of Care- Stakeholder Feedback Session Memo

- The feedback received was reviewed by the state and MCOs and a memorandum was released responding to the feedback and documenting the changes to Wave 1 & Wave 2 episodes.

Changes based on this year's feedback session

WAVE 1 EPISODES

- Episode: Asthma
- Expand the definition of the appropriate medications quality metric to include oral and/or injectable corticosteroids filled during the trigger window in the hospital setting (e.g. Emergency Department, Observation and/or inpatient stay) and the post-trigger window rather than just in the post-trigger window.
- Episode: Perinatal
- Remove the inconsistent enrollment business exclusion that excludes episodes with gaps in coverage totaling more than 45 days during the episode window.
- Episode: Total Joint Replacement (TJR)
 - Exclude codes not directly related to the hip and knee replacement from the episode spend in the post-trigger window.

WAVE 2 EPISODES

- Episode: Cholecystectomy
- Exclude episodes with chronic pancreatitis in the trigger window.

HHS Office of the Actuary projected a 5.5% national medical cost trend for 2015. Conservatively, if medical trend would otherwise have been 3%, then savings would have been \$11.1 million.
