	•	The proposed program will be targeted to newly graduated
		undergraduates without professional experience, and
		professionals engaged in managing complex projects and project
		life cycles in all industry sectors facing rapidly changing
		environments.
	•	Creating a dedicated MSPM in Project Management will allow
		students to develop hard and soft skills, knowledge, and abilities,

as well as sophisticated technological tools and techniques, to meet project requirements and lead teams. Students will acquire practical skills and theoretical knowledge through case studies, simulations, and practitioner-partnered projects. The program leadership will maintain a conduit between faculty, businesses, alumni, the Project Management Institute (hereafter, PMI), and other stakeholders to keep the interdisciplinary curriculum current and aligned with industry standards and needs. The proposed program will prepare students for the PMI certification. The 30-credit hour proposed program will be offered in an online Purpose and nature of academic program format to provide maximum flexibility for full-time professionals seeking to improve their existing or develop new skills toward their professional career development. Courses will be offered in the Jones College of Business (Departments of Management and Information Systems & Analytics) and the College of Basic and Applied Sciences (Engineering Technology and Concrete Industry Management) to expose students to multiple methodologies. The targeted populations include recent college graduates of all majors and experienced working professionals who desire to gain or advance project management positions. Students will not need project management experience to apply and be accepted. The proposed program will seek to meet industry demand, diversify MTSU's program offerings, offer an interdisciplinary approach to project management, provide professional development, and contribute research and innovation to the field. From the student perspective, the proposed program can offer career advancement, an in-demand skillset, training for complex projects, leadership and communication skills, and an industryrecognized certification. **Alignment with State** The proposed program aligns with the Tennessee State Master **Master Plan and** Plan for Postsecondary Education in several ways, including Institutional Mission developing foundational skills for the new digital economy, and providing stackable credentials. The proposed program aims to develop highly sought-after behavioral skills in students to become successful in project management and extend to other areas of leadership which aligns with the Tennessee Master Plan for Higher Education as a high demand foundational skill. MTSU also identifies five foundational skills within the THEC Master Plan that students will gain a working knowledge of during their matriculation through the proposed program including communication, analytical skills, collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity.
