Pursuant to T.C.A. §49-7-202(f), I am submitting to you the report on progress toward articulation between public institutions. Data for the 2006-2007 academic year are the most current available at this time. This year we used the Commission's Student Information System to take a data-intensive look at issues related to transfer. The report's highlights include the following:

- Transfer is a way of life for today's Tennessee college students. Forty-four percent of bachelor's degree graduates started at an institution other than the one from which they graduated.
- Hours to degree are generally lower for students who graduated from the same institution at which they started, with a substantial increase for students who began at a Tennessee for-profit or out-of-state institution.
- Transfer is multi-directional. Transfers from public universities to community colleges, between community colleges, and between universities account for almost as much activity as the traditional path of transfer from a community college to a university.

# Annual Report on Transfer and Articulation

#### **Tennessee Transfer Student Profile**

The General Assembly determined that a higher education system that failed to allow the transfer of seemingly identical or similar courses increased the time to degree and cost to the student and the state. It was also the perception of the General Assembly that public higher education was not taking adequate steps to remedy the problem. Therefore, the legislature passed Public Chapter 795, Acts of 2000.

Public Chapter 795 requires the Tennessee Higher Education Commission to work with the University of Tennessee and Tennessee Board of Regents to:

- Create and have in place by the 2001 fall semester, a university track program within UT and TBR consisting of sixty (60) semester hours of instruction within each major discipline that can be transferred and applied toward the requirements for a bachelor's degree, thus allowing a student who has successfully completed the track to enter the receiving institution as a junior.
- Create an atmosphere that is conducive to transferability of credits among Tennessee's public colleges and universities.
- Report to the Joint Education Oversight Committee and the chairs of the House and Senate Finance, Ways and Means Committees on the progress made toward full articulation on October 1 of each year.

Improving articulation, ensuring seamless transfer, and increasing the persistence to graduation of transfer students is an on-going process for the Commission, the University of Tennessee, and the Tennessee Board of Regents systems. While this coalition has made significant progress in achieving the aims of Public Chapter 795, it continues to refine major articulation measures and implement additional strategies for improving the transfer process.

In previous years, the Commission has reported on progress made by the coalition of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, the Tennessee Board of Regents, and the University of Tennessee system that addresses articulation agreements among the public institutions. With articulation agreements now in place and the university track program adopted by both systems, the Commission will begin assessment on the success of these arrangements. This report will focus on the transfer activity at public institutions and will create a baseline for trend analysis by

focusing on recent transfer activity at public institution: its volume, its directionality, and when it occurs.

## Fall 2006 Transfer Profile

In Fall 2006, there were 180,922 undergraduate students enrolled for college credit in Tennessee's public universities and community colleges. Of those students, 58,936 or 32.6 percent had transferred at some point in their collegiate career.<sup>1</sup>

Transfer Student Volume and Demographics

- Of Fall 2006 undergraduates enrolled for credit, 14,211 (7.9 percent) transferred that semester (**Table 1A**).<sup>2</sup>
- On average, transfers made up 8.6 percent of undergraduate enrollments in public universities and 6.8 percent in community colleges.
  - The percentage of fall enrollment represented by transfer students ranged from 25.5 percent at UT Medical Health Science Center to 4.5 percent at Walters State Community College (**Figure 1A**).
- Adult students aged 25 and up accounted for 37.9 percent of the undergraduate transfer population, compared to 30 percent of undergraduates overall (**Table 1B**).
  - Within public universities, adults were 32.9 percent of undergraduate transfers compared to 22 percent overall.
  - Within community colleges, adults were 46.6 percent of undergraduate transfers compared to 41 percent overall.
- Minority student representation among undergraduate transfers was almost identical to minority representation within the undergraduate population overall. African American students accounted for 17.8 percent of undergraduate transfers, and Hispanic students constituted 2.1 percent (**Table 1C**). These percentages varied little by system.

## Credit Hours and Academic Major at Time of Transfer

- More than double the number of students who transferred to a public university from a community college with 60 or more hours did so without an associate's degree. Of those that transferred from a community college with 60 or more hours, 2,429 (26.9 percent) did so without an associate's degree, while only 1,029 (11.4 percent) transferred with an associate's degree (**Tables 2A and 2B**).
- More than half of the students who transferred to a community college did so before earning 12 credit hours (**Table 2B**).
- Almost half of all transfers to public universities in Fall 2006 were accounted for by students in three areas of academic study; Undeclared (22.0 percent); Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services (14.0 percent); and Health Professionals and Related Clinical Sciences (10.3 percent). (**Figure 3B**)

Analysis of Sending and Receiving Institutions

- Transfer within Tennessee's public higher education system is multi-directional. In Fall 2006:
  - 4,054 undergraduates transferred from a community college to a university;
  - o 1,848 transferred from a university to a community college;
  - o 1,214 transferred from one university to another; and
  - 898 transferred from one community college to another. (Tables 4A and 5A)
- Middle Tennessee State University received the greatest number of public transfer students, with 1,223 transfers or 15 percent of all public transfers (**Tables 4A and 5A**).
- Most public universities received the majority of their community college transfers from one or two primary feeder schools. Universities that received over half of their community college transfers from a single college were the University of Memphis (77.3 percent of its transfers were from Southwest Tennessee CC) and UT Chattanooga (62.9 percent from Chattanooga State Technical CC). (**Table 4B**)
- Of the 4,952 undergraduates who transferred from a community college to another public institution in Fall 2006, 81.9 percent

transferred to a university and 18.1 percent to another community college (**Table 4C**).

- The community college that sent the greatest share of its Fall 2006 transfer class to public universities was Southwest Tennessee CC, at 93.3 percent. Southwest also had the most exclusive feeder relationships with a single university, as 78.2 percent of Southwest's Fall 2006 transfers went to the University of Memphis. Northeast State Technical CC was a close second in this regard, sending 75.5 percent of its transfers to ETSU (**Table 4C**).
- Among community colleges, Cleveland State CC sent the greatest share of its transfers to other community colleges (39 percent), with most of those transferring to Chattanooga State Technical CC (Table 4C).
- Nearly two-thirds (60.4 percent) of the public undergraduates who transferred from a university to another public institution transferred to a community college. The remaining 39.6 percent transferred from one university to another (**Table 5C**).
  - Universities that sent the greatest percentage of their transfers to community colleges were ETSU (73.1 percent) and the University of Memphis (70.4 percent). Austin Peay was the university that sent the greatest share of its undergraduate transfers to other universities (57.2 percent). (Table 5C)

## Institution of Origin for 2005-06 Baccalaureate Graduates


- Forty-four percent of bachelor's degree graduates in 2005-06 started at an institution other than the one from which they graduated (**Table 6A**).
  - However, the percentages vary by system. The University of Tennessee system graduating class was composed of only 32.1 percent transfer students while the Tennessee Board of Regents graduating class is comprised of 49.7 percent.
  - The graduating classes at individual UT campuses contained higher percentages of native students than any TBR university with the exception of Tennessee State University (**Table 6C**).
- Hours to degree were generally lower for students who graduated from the same institution at which they started. The highest average hours to degree was for students who began at out-of-state or Tennessee for-profit institutions (**Table 7**).




