Summary

Tennessee's November seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased slightly to 3.1% from a revised October rate of 3.0%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased from 5.1% to 3.1% while the national rate declined from 4.6% to 4.1%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 1,800 jobs from October to November. The largest increases occurred in educational/ health services, leisure/hospitality, and mining/logging/construction.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 36,200 jobs. The largest increases occurred in education/health services, leisure/hospitality, and trade/transportation/utilities.
