Summary

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted June unemployment rate remained at 3.5 %.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted June unemployment rate decreased from 3.6% to 3.5% while the national rate declined from 4.3% to 4.0%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 13,000 jobs from May to June. The largest increases occurred in professional/business services, information, & leisure/hospitality.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 59,500 jobs. The largest increases occurred in accommodation/food services, administrative/support/waste services, & transportation/warehousing/ utilities.
