#### **Summary**

Tennessee's September seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained the same as the previous month at 3.6%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased from 3.3% to 3.6% while the national rate declined from 4.2% to 3.7%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 8,600 jobs from August to September. The largest increases occurred in manufacturing, trade/transportation/utilities, & education/health services.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 63,900 jobs. The largest increases occurred in leisure/ hospitality, professional/business services, & education/health services.
