Summary

Tennessee's September seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased slightly to 3.4% from the revised August rate of 3.5%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's unemployment rate of 3.4% has remained the same while the national rate declined from 3.7% to 3.5%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 3,700 jobs from August to September. The largest increases occurred in leisure/hospitality, professional/business services, and other services.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 48,200 jobs. The largest increases occurred in leisure/hospitality, professional/business services, and manufacturing.





Seasonally Adjusted - 2017 to 2019




Unemployment Rates - US & TennesseeSeasonally Adjusted - January 2012 to September 2019
