Summary

Tennessee's January seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 3.5% from the December revised rate of 3.6%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased from 5.2% to 3.5% while the U.S. rate declined from 6.4% to 4.0%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 3,000 jobs from December to January. The largest increases were in retail trade, professional & business services, and durable goods manufacturing.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 110,400 jobs. The largest increases were in leisure & hospitality, trade, transportation & utilities, and professional & business services.
