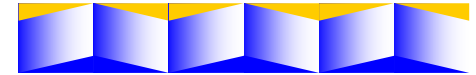

Services available to Crime Victims through TDOC

- μ Information regarding the status of offenders in prison with felony convictions.
- μ Community referrals and assistance with concerns related to offenders under the Department's jurisdiction.
- μ Registration for victim notification regarding any hearings, decisions, release dates, movement to a prison designated with a lower security level, escape of an offender, or pending execution.
- μ Assistance with threats, unwanted calls/

Other Victim Services Activities

- μ Community education programs.
- μ Coordinates with the Board of Probation and Parole, the Attorney General's Office, and the Tennessee District Attorney General's office to respond to victims' concerns.
- μ Provides education to Department staff to increase awareness of victims' issues.

Programs facilitated by the Victim Services Department

μ Victim Offender Dialogue

Victim Offender Dialogue is a process in which the victim of a violent crime and the offender who committed the offense meet. The focus is on the harm done to the victim and the offender's responsibility in the reparation of that harm.

μ Victim Awareness

Create awareness regarding the harm experienced from crime and victim issues to the community, victim advocacy agencies, universities, and to Department staff.

μ Victim Impact Classes for Offenders

Classes for offenders from research-based curriculum teach offenders about the impact of crime on victims, victim families, and the families of the offender. The class is taught in two formats:

- As a 1-3 day seminar class during pre-release classes in all institutions.
- As a 12-week 'stand-alone' class, in therapeutic communities or substance abuse programs.

Victims/survivors of crime who are willing to speak to an audience of offenders are invited to come into the prison and speak about the impact crime has had on his/her life, and the lives of their loved ones. Interested persons may contact the Victim

Frequently asked questions

As a crime victim, will I be notified of upcoming parole hearings or release dates for the offender?

To receive notification of upcoming parole hearings, release dates, escape of an offender, or pending execution, you must contact the Victim Services Department, or you can visit the website and fill out a form online at this address:

Can I let the Parole Board know how I feel about a possible release of an offender?

Anyone can send information to the Board of Probation and Parole at any time regarding his/her feelings about a potential parole. Those registered for notification receive information 30 days before the parole hearing, listing available options to let the Parole Board know your wishes. You may also contact them through the information listed on the reverse side of this form; or you may contact the TDOC Victim Services Director.

Why was the offender moved to a prison with a lower security designation?

TDOC moves offenders for many reasons. Lower Security Designation does not mean the facility is less secure; it refers to a prison that houses those with a lower custody level than where the offender was located before.
