Engineer Intern

(For individuals who are graduates of an EAC/ABET accredited undergraduate engineering curriculum of four (4) years or more or one that has been determined to be substantially equivalent)

You may fill out the application online. The application must then be printed because it must be signed by the applicant and the applicant's sponsor/reference.

Exam Process

There are two steps in the exam registration process:

- STEP 1** — Submit the application and the \$15.00 application fee to the Tennessee Board office. An application and application fee must be submitted to the Board office each time you wish to sit for the exam.
- STEP 2** — Following approval by the Tennessee Board to sit for the exam, candidates must register with NCEES at www.ncees.org to pay the exam fee and schedule the exam. Effective January 1, 2014, the Fundamentals of Engineering exam will only be offered via computer-based testing at Pearson VUE testing centers, and will be administered during four testing windows throughout the year. Once approved by the Board, candidates may register to sit for the exam at the earliest available opportunity at a location of their choice. A list of test center locations is available on the NCEES website.

Fees

Application fee -- \$15

Make checks payable to the **Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance**. Payment must be made at the time of application and the fee is not refundable. Submit the completed application and fee to the address on the application form.

Exam fees are paid to NCEES when registering on the NCEES website.

Exam Disciplines

Beginning in 2014, the FE exam will be seven freestanding discipline-specific exams: Chemical, Civil, Electrical and Computer, Environmental, Industrial, Mechanical, and Other Disciplines. Candidates must declare a discipline when registering with NCEES.

Notice Regarding Disclosure of Social Security Numbers

Federal and state laws, including 42 U.S.C. § 405(c)(2)(C)(i), 42 U.S.C. § 666(a)(13), T.C.A. §§ 36-5-711 and 36-5-1301, require disclosure of the social security number for the purpose of administering the state child support program. The social security number will be redacted prior to making your record available for public inspection.

Eligibility Verification for Entitlements

If you are a natural person applying for a license, registration, certification or other benefit you must "Attest, under penalty of perjury, to your status as either a United States citizen, a qualified alien as defined in Tennessee's Eligibility Verification for Entitlements Act, or a foreign national not physically present in the United States..." **Specific instructions are on the three (3) pages following the application.**

Submit the appropriately signed form and documents, if required, with the application.

Application Form

- ◆ Type or write your name on the application as you want it to appear on your certificate and in your permanent record.
- ◆ Fill out the application completely online or after downloading it.
 - Sign the application and obtain the required signature from a sponsor/reference.
 - An employer, company official, or former professor must sign your application as a sponsor or reference.
 - Relatives or Board members are prohibited from serving as references.
- ◆ Submit the application and fee (payable to the **Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance**) to the Tennessee Board. Any major modification of state approved forms may cause the Board to reject your application.
- ◆ A new application and application fee must be submitted to the Board office each time you wish to sit for the exam.

Transcripts

Official transcripts are required for all educational credit claimed. Request an *Official Transcript* from the college/university registrar's office. The college/university **must mail** the transcript **directly to the Board office**.

Applicants with Non-Accredited Foreign Degrees

Rule 0120-01-.10 states that engineering degrees that are not accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) shall be referred at the applicant's expense to a person or an entity approved by the Board and qualified to evaluate equivalency to an ABET-accredited engineering program for evaluation and recommendation. The Board has approved NCEES Credentials Evaluations to evaluate non-accredited foreign undergraduate engineering degrees. Degrees accredited by the Canadian Engineering Accreditation Board (CEAB) that were awarded in or after 1980 are considered substantially equivalent and do not require evaluation.

Applicants with Non-Accredited Domestic Degrees

Rule 0120-01-.10 states that engineering degrees from programs that are not accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) shall be referred at the applicant's expense to a person or an entity approved by the Board and qualified to evaluate equivalency to an ABET-accredited engineering program for evaluation and recommendation. The Board has approved a former engineering professor to evaluate domestic undergraduate engineering degrees. The cost for such evaluations is \$50 per hour; an invoice for this service will be sent to applicants requiring an evaluation following receipt of the evaluation.

A person who willfully makes a false, fictitious or fraudulent statement or representation of United States citizenship may be prosecuted under 18 U.S.C. § 911 and/or the False Claims Act, T.C.A. §§ 4-18-101, *et seq.*

¹ Qualified alien means "A qualified alien as defined by 8 U.S.C. § 1641(b)" or "An alien or nonimmigrant eligible to receive state or local public benefits under 8 U.S.C. § 1621(a)." Pursuant to those statutes, this includes, but is not necessarily limited to:

- An alien who is lawfully admitted for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act [8 U.S.C. § 1101 *et seq.*];
- An alien who is granted asylum under section 208 of the Immigration and Nationality Act [8 U.S.C. § 1158];
- A refugee who is admitted to the United States under section 207 of the Immigration and Nationality Act [8 U.S.C. § 1157];
- An alien who is paroled into the United States under section 212(d)(5) of the Immigration and Nationality Act [8 U.S.C. § 1182(d)(5)] for a period of at least 1 year;

- An official birth certificate issued by a state, jurisdiction or territory of the United States, including Puerto Rico, United States Virgin Islands, Northern Mariana Islands, American Samoa, Swains Island, or Guam; provided that Puerto Rican birth certificates issued before July 1, 2010, shall **not** be recognized;
- A United States government-issued certified birth certificate;
- A valid, unexpired United States passport;
- A United States certificate of birth abroad (DS-1350 or FS-545);
- A report of birth abroad of a citizen of the United States (FS-240);
- A certificate of citizenship (N560 or N561);
- A certificate of naturalization (N550, N570 or N578);
- A United States citizen identification card (I-197, I-179);
- Any successor document of those listed at Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 4-58-103(c)(4)-(9); or
- **A social security number that may be verified with the Social Security Administration in accordance with federal law (if you provided your social security number as part of your application for licensure, no additional documentation is required; however, please be aware that efforts may be made to verify any such number).**

Part C. If you are claiming qualified alien status, you must present two (2) forms of documentation of identity and immigration status, as determined by the United States Department of Homeland Security to be acceptable for verification through the SAVE program. Such forms of identification may include:

- I-327 (Reentry Permit);
- I-551 (Permanent Resident Card);
- I-571 (Refugee Travel Document);
- I-766 (Employment Authorization Card);
- Certificate of Citizenship;
- Naturalization Certificate;
- Machine Readable Immigrant Visa (with Temporary I-551 Language);
- Temporary I-551 Stamp (on passport or I-94);
- Unexpired Foreign Passport;
- WT/WB Admission Stamp in Unexpired Foreign Passport
- I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant (F-1) Student Status);
- DS-2019 (Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor (J-1) Status);
- Any other document determined by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to be acceptable through the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) program created pursuant to the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.
