The Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act of 2007 provides that the Commissioner of Education report annually to the Governor and General Assembly "concerning the prevalence of violent and disruptive incidents in the public schools, and the effectiveness of school programs undertaken to reduce violence and assure the safety and security of students and school personnel."

The attached report presents an update on the Department of Education's progress in implementing the provisions of the Act, a summary of available violent or serious incident data, and an overview of the promising strategies being implemented in Tennessee schools.

INTRODUCTION

Public Chapter 548 of 2007, the Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act, requires that the Commissioner of Education “report to the governor and general assembly on implementation and compliance” of the Act, as well as, the general progress of the state in providing a safe learning environment for students. The following report addresses the legislative mandate by providing a status report on the implementation of the Act, presenting a summary of available school safety data presented as a *serious incident index*, as well as highlighting special projects currently being implemented by the Department of Education.

SAVE ACT IMPLEMENTATION

Establishment of a State-Level School Safety Team and Template

The SAVE Act directs the Commissioner to establish a state-level school safety team that is specifically charged with publishing “a template for use by districts in preparing their district-level safety-plans and building-level emergency response plans.” The Department of Education has assembled a state-level safety team consistent with the parameters outlined in the public chapter. The team has developed a draft template with a targeted completion date of March 15, 2008. The State-Level Safety Team is also being utilized to marshal state and other resources to assist districts and schools in meeting the SAVE Act requirements.

District and Building-Level School Safety Plans

The Act requires every district to submit its school safety plan to the Departments of Education and Safety. Every school is required to submit its plan to local law enforcement and first responder agencies. District and building-level training on the new template will be conducted during the spring and summer of 2008 in anticipation of an August 1, 2008 due date.

The Act allows the Commissioner of Education to grant a two-year waiver to districts that have adopted a comprehensive school safety plan which is in substantial compliance with the requirements of the Act. Seventy-nine (79) districts have been granted a waiver until August 1, 2009. All other districts will be expected to submit their plans on or before August 1, 2008.

Enhanced Data Collection System

The SAVE Act also requires that “The commissioner (of education), in conjunction with the commissioner of safety, shall establish a statewide uniform violent incident reporting system which all LEAs shall follow.” In order to meet this mandate, the Department is working both internally and with the Department

of Safety, the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

Internally, the Office of School Safety and Learning Support, in conjunction with the Office of Data Services and School Approval, has broadened the scope of the Department's current data collection efforts. Previously, the Department collected the following incident types for students who had been suspended or expelled from school or remanded to an alternative school:

Previous Incident Types:

1. Attendance Related
2. Immoral, Disreputable Conduct
3. Violence, Threatened Violence
4. Fighting Among Students
5. Willful Damage of Property
6. Drinking Alcoholic Beverages
7. Possession or Use of Drugs
8. Theft, Extortion
9. Possession or Use of Tobacco
10. Possession or Use of Firearms
11. Possession or Use of Other Dangerous Weapons
12. Immunization
13. Battery Against a Teacher or Staff
14. Other

Beginning in the 2008-2009 school year, the Department will expand the data collected concerning serious incidents that occur during school. The expanded reporting system will also integrate zero tolerance offenses, thereby unifying both collections into a single reporting method. Below is a list of the new incident categories that school districts will use in reporting to the Department:

2008-2009 Incident Types

1. Possession, Use or Distribution of Illegal Drugs
2. Possession of Handgun
3. Possession of Rifle or Shotgun
4. Possession of Explosive or Incendiary Device
5. Non-Lethal Firearm
6. Possession of a Weapon Other than Firearm
7. Possession, Use or Distribution of Alcohol
8. Violation of School Rules
9. Theft of Property
10. Vandalism/ Damage of Property
11. Bomb Threat
12. Other Type of Threat
13. Bullying
14. Fighting

15. Sexual Harassment
16. Assault of Teacher or Staff
17. Assault of Student
18. Sexual Assault
19. Aggravated Assault of Teacher or Staff
20. Aggravated Assault of Student
21. Attempted Homicide
22. Homicide

Additional data that will be collected relevant to each incident includes the following: grade of offender, the school and district where the offense occurred, and the action taken by the district. Districts will also continue to collect and report information on victims of a violent crime as provided under the State Board of Education's Unsafe School Choice Policy. For a copy of the *Student Violent Crime Victimization Report Form* see Appendix I.

The Department of Education is also working collaboratively with the Department of Safety via the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation to take advantage of the newly-created Tennessee Fusion Center. The Fusion Center will be a centralized repository of crime and incident data that could be a powerful tool for school crime prevention efforts as well as data collection.

Serious Incident Index

The SAVE Act states that "the commissioner shall report to the governor and the general assembly concerning the prevalence of violent and disruptive incidents in the public schools." Additionally, the Act calls for the Commissioner to "identify specifically the schools and school districts with the greatest and least violent incidents." To fulfill this legislative mandate on an interim basis until the new student management system is operational, the Office of School Safety and Learning Support has created a *serious incident index* based upon data collected under the *Unsafe School Choice* provisions of NCLB.

Currently, *Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-4216* requires all local education agencies to report zero tolerance violations to the Department of Education. This process also requires LEAs to report any incident involving "weapons other than a firearm." Additionally, the State Board's *Unsafe School Choice Policy* requires school districts to report students who are victims of a violent crime while at school or riding a school bus.

For purposes of the *serious incident index*, the following categories are included:

- 1) Possession of Firearms
- 2) Possession of Weapons Other than a Firearm
- 3) Battery Against a Teacher or School Employee

4) Student Victim of Violent Crime at School.

The sum of all incidents is weighed against the school's average daily membership to factor in variations in enrollment and arrive at an index. The attached Serious Incident Index Report ranks schools based on the index beginning with the lowest scores and ending with the highest. Schools that did not have any incidents to report for the 2006-2007 school year will not appear in the report. The report is attached as Appendix II.

CURRENT FUNDING FOR SCHOOL SAFETY

Safe Schools Act of 1998

The Safe Schools Act of 1998 (*Tenn. Code Ann. §49-6-4302*) provides state funding for school safety and violence prevention activities. Each school district is eligible to receive these funds that are allocated based on the district's relative share of BEP funding. A 25% local match is required.

Since 1998 the General Assembly has appropriated the following amounts for this program:

Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Program

Title IVA of the *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001* provides federal funding to school districts for drug and violence prevention activities. Funds are allocated on a formula basis and may be used for a variety of activities related to school safety and violence prevention. These funds have been reduced by 33.6 % at the federal level since 2001.

A listing of the 2007-2008 Safe and Drug-Free Schools allocations for each district may be found in Appendix IV.

Impact of BEP 2.0 on School Safety/At-Risk Students

It is telling to note that many districts decided to direct a significant portion of their BEP 2.0 resources to personnel directly related to school safety concerns. Expanded personnel directly resulting from the BEP expansion include the following functional areas:

- 95 school counselors
- 78 attendance
- 71 school safety
- 41 alternative
- 41 at-risk
- 16 social work
- 4 in-school suspension

SPECIAL PROJECTS

Efforts to Improve the Quality of Alternative Education in Tennessee

An area of significant activity for the Department of Education has been alternative education. Students placed in an alternative education program often exhibit behavior that disrupts the learning of others and otherwise interferes with the order of the school environment. During the 2006-2007 school year, 16,758 students were expelled from school. Many of these students are placed in an alternative education program. Acknowledging the unique opportunities these programs have to positively intervene in the lives of students, the Department is working with alternative education programs to better develop and utilize these potentially valuable resources.

Governor Phil Bredesen has established the Governor's Advisory Council on Alternative Education. The Council is currently working to revise alternative education program standards, build a model for programs to implement, and develop a self-evaluation instrument. In May of 2008, the Advisory Council will host a consortium on alternative education to stimulate dialogue and consensus around best practices for this often-neglected area. The Department has also established regional Study Councils composed of alternative educators from across the state. Together, Department staff and regional Councils will continue to identify best practices in the field and distribute that information to local education agencies. School/Law Enforcement Partnerships

Approximately 570 law enforcement officers are specifically assigned to Tennessee schools. In March of 2007, the Department of Education released *Recommended Standards for the Eligibility, Qualifications and Training of School Resource Officers: Guidelines for Successful Partnerships between Schools Districts and Law Enforcement Agencies* in an effort to foster collaborative relationships between the two. Also in 2007, the General Assembly codified employment and training standards for School Resource Officers. Currently, all districts in Tennessee report adhering to the requirements established by the General Assembly.

On January 15, 2008, the Department released a report on the feasibility of allowing school districts to establish their own police department. The report entitled *School Police Departments: A report for the Tennessee General Assembly* is available at <http://state.tn.us/education/learningsupport/>.

Tennessee Department of Safety Commissioner Dave Mitchell has expressed his commitment to school and law enforcement partnerships by meeting with all of the directors of schools earlier this year. A one-day seminar on February 8, 2008 is being hosted by Rutherford County Schools and the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office bringing together directors of schools and their sheriffs and/or chiefs of police.

The *Annual Survey of School Resource Officers in Tennessee Schools* is attached as Appendix V.

Tennessee PREPARE Project (Mental Health Collaborations)

The Department of Education's School Counseling Director, in conjunction with Vanderbilt Community Mental Health Center, is currently training school counselors, social workers, psychologists and other appropriate school personnel on how to respond after a school crisis. PREPARE stands for Providing support, Reaching Educators, Parents/students And Restoring community with Effective interventions.

PREPARE was developed to support the creation of crisis response teams in each school district and to foster partnerships between schools and community-based mental health resources. Approximately 450 people attended one of the fall training sessions. Additional training is scheduled for the summer.

Youth Suicide Prevention

In 2005, 92 Tennesseans under the age of 25 took their own life. 3,665 high school age students attempted suicide and received services from an emergency

room. The first documented self-inflicted gunshot wound in a Tennessee school occurred during the 2006-07 school year. 18% of Tennessee students reported on the Youth Risk Behavior Survey that they had considered suicide at some time during the past 12 months.

The Jason Flatt Act of 2007 requires every Tennessee teacher and principal to receive in-service training on suicide awareness. The Department has worked closely with the Jason Foundation and the Tennessee Lives Count Project of the Tennessee Suicide Prevention Network to help schools meet the in-service mandate and address this important issue.

Olweus Bullying Prevention Pilot Project

For the last 3 years, Tennessee has implemented a pilot of the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program in 17 sites across the state. The Olweus program is a comprehensive, school-wide model designed for use in elementary, middle, or junior high schools. Program goals are to reduce and prevent bullying problems among school children and to improve peer relations.

In addition to its impact on reducing bullying, the program is designed to improve the social climate of classrooms and reduce related antisocial behaviors such as vandalism and truancy. Tennessee is one of a limited number of states that have hosted a training of trainers. As a result there is a cadre of 20 Certified Olweus trainers in Tennessee who are prepared to train schools in the strategies necessary to implement the program.

One shining example has been the successful implementation of the program in the Henry County School System. Director of Schools Rick Kriesky and all of his building administrators have launched a system-wide initiative. Every school in Henry County has a Bullying Prevention Coordinating Committee. These committees meet regularly to evaluate the progress of the program across the four areas of implementation: school-wide, classroom, individual and community.

Threat Assessment/Bullying Seminars

Assessing and responding to student threats of violence and preventing bullying and harassment continue to be areas of concern for many schools. The Department is hosting regional seminars related to threat assessment and bullying prevention for district-level administrators to facilitate an in-depth look at both of these issues.

The Methamphetamine Awareness Project

The Methamphetamine Awareness Project is a project supported by a Governor's Methamphetamine Initiative Grant received from the Tennessee Department of Finance and Administration's Office of Criminal Justice Programs.

The project is a three-year effort to insure educators remain aware and proactive in responding to methamphetamine abuse and/or exposure.

Participants receive an overview of the drug and are taught how to recognize the signs and symptoms of children living in a home where methamphetamine is being produced or used. Appropriate intervention strategies are also identified and discussed.
