

John Dowd to Receive Crabtree Award

Avocational archaeologist John T. Dowd has been chosen by the Society of American Archaeology to receive the 2012 Crabtree Award. The Crabtree Award was established in 1985 to recognize significant contributions to archaeology by an individual who has little if any formal training in archaeology and little if any wage or salary as an archaeologist. The award is named after Don Crabtree of Twin Falls, Idaho.
