Style and Variation of Projectile Points and Tools

The first colonists of the New World brought blade core lithic technology from the Old World, which we see here in Tennessee in unifacial blade tools associated with Clovis, Cumberland, and other Paleoindian projectile points. This technology changes through time as we see with the projectile points and tools of the Archaic, Woodland, and Mississippian periods.

Jackson Archaeological Society member Phillip Bradley will discuss the changes in projectile points and tools throughout Native American prehistory. Phillip will display a portion of his collection to better describe these technological changes.


