## Archaeological Collections of the Ohio Historical Society

Dr. Kevin Smith (Middle Tennessee State University) recently visited the Ohio Historical Center archives in Columbus, Ohio, completing research on the early Tennessee expeditions of archaeologists Warren K. Moorehead and William E. Myer. During this trip, Dr. Smith was able to photograph one of the finest collections of Woodland period artifacts in the country. The Ohio Historical Center has one of the best exhibits of Hopewell (100 BC – 500 AD) platform pipes in the world. This presentation will highlight about 50 of these animal effigy pipes, including many that have rarely been widely published.




## Tullahoma Historical Society – August 25, 2009 – 7:00 PM
