

Sexual Assault Services Program (SASP) Grants Statistics Summary

January – December

2011 / 2012 / 2013

SASP Grants provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment (e.g., accompanying victims to court, medical facilities, police departments, etc.), support services, and related assistance for adult, youth, and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims and those collaterally affected by the sexual assault. Each of the twelve nonprofit agencies serving sexual assault victims are providing, at a minimum, a core group of services including hospital accompaniment, hotline, personal advocacy, court advocacy, counseling/support groups and community education. SASP federal grant funds are supplemented by the State sexual assault collection fund that is supported by fines from sexual offense convictions.
