21 Day Waiver

Who Was the 21 Day Waiver for?

- Current Residents Requiring...
 - ❑ Intravenous or daily intramuscular injections or intravenous feedings;
 - ❑ Insertion, sterile irrigation and replacement of catheters, except for routine maintenance of Foley catheters; or
 - ❑ Sterile wound care

How Did the 21 Day Waiver Work?

- Allowed 21 days in facility
- Additional 21 days in facility must have approval from Commissioner of Health or designee



21 Day Waiver After Long Term Community Choices Act

- No more Resident Retention Requests submitted to Health Care Facilities
 - Responsibility of facility and physician
-

How the New 21 Days Works...

- Resident with following conditions...
 - Nasopharyngeal or tracheotomy aspiration;
 - Nasogastric feedings;
 - Gastrostomy feedings; or
 - Intravenous therapy or intravenous feedings
 - May remain in facility up to three (3) twenty-one (21) day periods
 - Resident's physician must certify the last two (2) twenty-one (21) day periods
