The meeting was called to order at 9:17 a.m. by Mr. Ed Bolden, Board Chairperson. Mr. Bolden welcomed everyone to the meeting and encouraged the students to attend the Board meetings and become an active part of the massage and body work profession. Mr. Bolden said the reason the Board exists is to protect the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of the state of Tennessee. Mr. Bolden congratulated Ms. Jagers on her re-appointment to the Board. Prior to conducting business, Lisa Lampley conducted a roll call to establish a quorum. A quorum was present.

**Minutes**

Upon review of the February 9-10, 2015 minutes and the March 30, 2015 minutes, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray, to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried.

**Conflict of Interest Policy**

Marc Guilford, Assistant General Counsel, reviewed the conflict of interest policy. The purpose of the policy is to assure that the individual interests of the board members do not conflict with their responsibilities to the Board to which they are appointed. Mr. Guilford requested that each Board member sign the Policy.

**Applicant Interviews**

### **Xiaozhu Hong, LMT**

The Board reviewed the establishment applications for Xiaozhu Hong, a licensed massage therapist who applied for establishment licenses for two separate locations of Hong Spa in Knoxville, TN. Ms. Hong was asked to attend the meeting as her applications were initially denied by the Applicant Review Committee because the establishments had been in operation before being approved for an establishment license. Mr. Guilford reviewed the application with the Board stating that an employee from the department called the establishment and was able to make an appointment for a massage in March. The Tennessee Massage Board administrative office provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for interview. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Ms. Hong's licensure applications that she submitted for Massage Establishments in Tennessee. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny both of Ms. Hong's establishment applications based on T.C.A 63-18-108 (1)(7) and T.C.A 63-18-104 (a)(b). Ms. Jagers seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

### **ZhiPing Cheng**

The Board reviewed the massage therapist application of ZhiPing Cheng. Ms. Cheng was not present, but was asked to attend the meeting because the Applicant Review Committee recommended that her application be denied on the basis that information contained in her application and her transcript didn't coincide with the information received from the Federation of State Massage Boards regarding the school she attended on her MBLEx scores. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny Ms. Cheng's application based on T.C.A 63-18-108(1)(7). Ms. Wray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

### **Sheng En Sun**

The Board reviewed the massage therapist application for Sheng En Sun. Mr. Sun's application was reviewed at the ARC meeting and was deferred to allow him and his attorney the opportunity to provide the final court documents regarding his arrest for impersonation a licensed professional. The Tennessee Massage Board administrative office provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for interview. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Mr. Sun's licensure application that he submitted to become a licensed Massage Therapist in Tennessee. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion seconded by Ms. Easterly, to defer the application to the August meeting. The motion carried.

### **Sancheng Zhang**

The Board reviewed the massage therapist application of Sancheng Zhang. Mr. Zhang was not present, but was asked to attend the meeting because the Applicant Review Committee recommended that his application be denied on the basis that information contained in his application and his transcript didn't coincide with the information received from the Federation of State Massage Boards regarding school he attended on his MBLEx scores. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny Mr. Zhang's application based on T.C.A 63-18-108(1)(7). Ms. Wray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

### **Hai Yan Fan, LMT**

The Board reviewed the establishment applications for Hai Yan Fan, a licensed massage therapist who applied for establishment licenses for Five Stars Massage and Panda ACU Massage in Knoxville, TN. Ms. Fan was asked to attend the meeting as her applications were initially denied by the Applicant Review Committee because Panda ACU Massage had been in operation before being approved for an establishment license. Mr. Guilford reviewed the application with the Board stating that Mr. Bolden had provided the department with pictures showing Five Stars Massage was currently open and operating. The Tennessee Massage Board administrative office provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for interview. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Ms. Fan's licensure applications that she submitted for Massage Establishments in Tennessee. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny both of Ms. Fan's establishment applications based on T.C.A 63-18-108 (1)(7) and T.C.A 63-18-104 (a)(b). Ms. Jagers seconded the motion, and the motion carried. After the administrative staff had further discussion with Ms. Fan regarding her application for Five Stars Massage, Ms. Cross made a motion to reconsider the application. Ms. Wray seconded the motion, and the motion carried. After a brief explanation by Ms. Hodge and a discussion by the Board, Ms. Cross made a motion to grant Ms. Fan a conditional establishment license. Upon paying a two hundred seventy-five dollar (\$275.00) civil penalty for owning and operating an unlicensed establishment, Ms. Fan's establishment license would be issued. Ms. Cross also emphasized to Ms. Fan that she needed to cease and desist all massages until her establishment license was approved. The motion was seconded by Ms. Easterly. The motion carried.

#### **Long Ma, LMT**

The Board reviewed the establishment applications for Long Ma, a licensed massage therapist who applied for establishment licenses for Bamboo Massage in Sevierville, TN and Panda Foot Massage in Knoxville, TN. Mr. Ma was asked to attend the meeting as his applications were initially denied by the Applicant Review Committee because the establishments had been in operation before being approved for an establishment license. The Tennessee Massage Board administrative office provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for interview. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Mr. Ma's licensure applications that he submitted for Massage Establishments in Tennessee. Mr. Ma explained to the Board that he had recently purchased both locations from the previous owner. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny both of Mr. Ma's establishment applications based on T.C.A 63-18-108 (1)(7) and T.C.A 63-18-104 (a)(b). Ms. Wray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

#### **Ping Li**

Ms. Li's application for licensure as a Tennessee massage therapist was denied by the Board at the May 5, 2014 meeting. The Board based their decision on Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-108 (1), is guilty of fraud in the practice of massage or fraud or deceit in the licensee's admission to the practice of massage. The Board also based their decision on Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-107(12) is guilty of unethical or unprofessional conduct. Ms. Li's contested case hearing was dismissed by the Board with prejudice due to lack of sufficient evidence by the petitioner of a completed file for the Board to review and approve at the October 28, 2014 Tennessee Massage Board Meeting.

Ms. Li submitted a new application for licensure as a massage therapist to the administrative office. Upon completion of the file, it was reviewed by the Board at the May 5, 2015 Meeting. She also provided documentation that her charge for prostitution had been dismissed. The Tennessee Massage Board administrative office provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for interview. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Ms. Li's licensure application that she submitted to become a licensed Massage Therapist in Tennessee. Mr. Bolden informed the Board that Glamour Beauty College in California, the massage school that Ms. Li attended, was recently added to the California Massage Therapy Council (CMTC) unapproved list. Mr. Bolden also explained that Ms. Li's file was received in the Tennessee Massage Board Administrative office before the school was added to the CMTC unapproved list. Mr. Guilford discussed with the Board the educational requirements for licensure in Tennessee. Mr. Guilford also reviewed the evidence that was provided in the contested case regarding Ms. Li practicing without a license at Daily Massage. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion to deny Ms. Li's massage therapist application based on T.C.A 63-18-108 (1)(7) and T.C.A 63-18-104 (a)(b). Ms. Easterly seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Ms. Burke opposed.

#### **Candace Cherie Holder**

Ms. Holder appeared before the Board to explain a 2012 conviction for driving under the influence and a 2013 conviction for driving on a revoked license. Based on the information in Ms. Holder's file, she was requested to contact Lighthouse Professional Services for an assessment. Ms. Smithson provided a letter to the Board that stated that the assessment indicated no signs or symptoms of chemical dependency or other disorder. After a brief discussion, Ms. Wray made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to grant the license. The motion carried.

#### **Thomas Theodore Supulski**

Mr. Supulski appeared before the Board to explain a 2008 conviction for simple possession. Based on the information in Mr. Supulski's file, he was requested to contact Lighthouse Professional Services for an assessment. Ms. Smithson provided a letter to the Board that stated that the assessment indicated no signs or symptoms of chemical dependency or other disorder. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Jagers to grant the license. The motion carried.

#### **Tammie Diane Mclendon Campbell**

Ms. Campbell was asked to appear before the Board to explain why she answered "no" to her massage therapist application regarding any convictions other than a minor traffic offense. Ms. Campbell's criminal background check revealed a 2006 conviction for driving under the influence by allowing public intoxication. After a brief explanation, Ms. Easterly made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to grant the license. The motion carried.

#### **Aaron RM Duncan**

Mr. Duncan appeared before the Board to explain a 2011 conviction for reckless driving and a 2011 consent order from the Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Funeral,

Cemetery, and Consumer Services that placed Mr. Duncan's license on a one year probation. After a brief explanation, Ms. Easterly made a motion, seconded by Ms. Cross to grant the license. The motion carried.

### **Legislation Report**

Mr. Ben Simpson, Legislative Liaison with the Tennessee Department of Health, briefly discussed the following public chapters with the Massage Board that were passed in 2015 Legislative session.

- **Senate Bill 98 - Public Chapter 154** - This act allows the Commissioner of Health or his designee to have electronic access to medical records in order to facilitate investigations when responding to an immediate threat to public health. Today the Commissioner of Health or his designee already has this authority but must go to the facility to review the medical records.
- **House Bill 88 - Public Chapter 94** - This act defines "abuse" and "neglect" for purposes of placing a person on the registry of persons who have abused, neglected, or misappropriated the property of vulnerable individuals specifically within the statutes that govern the Dept. of Health. It does not impact the definitions within the statutes that govern the Dept. of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities nor the Dept. of Human Services. It also increases the time within which placement on the registry may be appealed from 30 to 60 days.
- **Senate Bill 467 - Public Chapter 502** - This act allows the Joint Government Operations Committee (the legislative committee that reviews all rules) to stay a rule up to 75 days instead of 60 days. Present law authorizes the Joint Government Operations Committee to consider the following factors when reviewing rules: authority, clarity, consistency, justification, necessity and reference. This act adds arbitrariness and capriciousness as two new considerations.
- **Senate Bill 892 - Public Chapter 268** - This act makes disclosures of protected healthcare information permissible in medical malpractice lawsuits.
- **Public Chapter 124** - This act allows physical therapists to perform dry needling services.
- **Senate Bill 613 - Public Chapter 494** - This act allows the Board of Medical Examiner to create a medical spa registry and charge a fee to those registered to maintain the registry so that the public knows who is a registered medical spa.

### **Financial Report**

Ms. Lisa Tittle discussed the Tennessee Massage Board's actual revenue and expenditures thru December 31, 2014, and the Board's projection for fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. Ms. Tittle reviewed the report stating that there had been an increase in the Board's Salaries & Wages,

which includes salary and benefits are for the Board's support staff and per diem for Board members attending Board meetings and other Board business. Ms. Tittle stated that the Board's revenue for continuing education civil penalties had declined. The Board's projected expenditures are \$681,997.50 for FY 2015 and the projected revenue is \$712,407.72. The Board's projected year net is \$30,410.22; and a cumulative carryover of \$1,016,745.19. Ms. Tittle recommended that the Board defer decreasing application fees until the close of the 2015 fiscal year.

**Office of Investigation/Disciplinary Report**

Ms. Nichelle Dorroh, disciplinary coordinator, reported the Board currently has one hundred five (105) open complaints in Office of Investigations. Seventy-nine (79) of the complaints are against massage therapist and twenty-six (26) of the open complaints are against massage establishments.

**Administrator/Directors Report**

As of March 31, 2015 there were 4204 licensed massage therapists and 1646 licensed massage establishments.

**Office of General Counsel Report**

Mr. Guilford stated there are currently 150 open cases in OGC. He stated that this high number is mainly pertaining to continuing education cases. Mr. Guilford is currently working internally on the rulemaking packet.

Mr. Guilford also discussed the Supreme Court's Ruling regarding the North Carolina Dental Board. The Supreme Court's decided that in order to receive antitrust immunity, licensing Boards need to be actively supervised by the State. Mr. Guilford encouraged all Board Members when making decisions regarding Board business to remember that their main purpose is to protect the safety of the public.

### **Review approval request from Continuing Education Providers**

### **Fayelynn G. Latour, LMT – “Mastering Basic Massage to Improve Quality of Touch”**

Ms. Latour requested approval from the Board to be a Tennessee approved continuing education provider. The Board at the February 9, 2015 Meeting deferred their decision to the May 4, 2015 meeting to allow Ms. Latour an opportunity to submit additional information regarding the format and structure of her class. Ms. Latour contacted the Administrative Office and requested to be deferred to the August 10, 2015 Meeting. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray, to defer Ms. Latour’s continuing education approval request to the August 10, 2015 Meeting. The motion carried.

### **Board Correspondences**

#### **Calming Influence – Gene Elliott, LMT regarding Inspections**

Mr. Elliot wrote a letter to the Board supporting unannounced inspections for establishments, but wanted clarification on possible rule changes. He wanted to know if the Board was going to change the rules to reflect an automatic failure of the establishment if the inspector was unable to gain access to the premises. No action was taken by the Board since the current rule had not been changed.

#### **American Massage Therapy Association Tennessee Chapter regarding Inspections**

The AMTA-Tennessee wrote a letter supporting the need to regulate massage therapy establishments with a registry. However, the Association recommended the fee be reduced to \$100.00 for initial applications and \$40.00 biannually for renewals to cover administrative costs. The Association also suggested that the rules change to reflect that inspections themselves would only be done for locations where a complaint has been filed. The Board Administrative Office sent a response letter to the AMTA-Tennessee Chapter that stated that the resumption of inspections is within the board’s authority and purview and a discussion regarding inspections was scheduled to be discussed at the May 4, Board Meeting. The letter went on to explain that any changes to rules would require a properly noticed rulemaking hearing at which public comments are invited and welcomed.

#### **Tennessee Massage Therapy Association – Phyllis Salyers**

The Tennessee Massage Therapy Association wrote a letter to Governor Bill Haslam and the Board in opposition to the Peer Assistance and Inspection Task Force decision that the Board approved at the February 2015 Meeting. The TMTA expressed concerns of only citizen members of the Board being on the task force instead of massage therapists, and that they felt that Lighthouse was a personal target for removal by two board members with underlying motives. Ms. Salyers stated that past inspections served no purpose and that very little unlicensed practice was found. She went on to explain that the TMTA is in support of maintaining an establishment “registry” at a much lower renewal rate and attached a petition of support to the letter sent to the Board. Ms. Salyers concluded her letter by stating that she had noticed that some of the Board members seemed to be intimidated by one or two of the other members, and encouraged those members to hold to their convictions, vote with their consciences, and not let someone else bully

them into voting to suit them.

The Director of Health Related Boards, Rosemarie A. Otto, sent a response letter to the TMTA. Ms. Otto responded by saying that the TMTA concern about citizen members tasked by the Board to consider the question of the resumption of massage establishment inspections is misplaced. The composition of the task force was a decision made (without dissent) by the full Board. Further, the recommendations of the task force must be agreed to by a majority of Board members in order to have any force or effect. She further explained that state law requires that each health-related board include at least one citizen or public member and that consumer members bring a highly valued and unique prospective to each of our health related boards, including the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board. Ms. Otto also addressed Ms. Salyers comments regarding Lighthouse Services. She explained that Ms. Salyer's view that the Board (or some of its members) "targeted" Lighthouse Professional Services ("Lighthouse") does not seem to be supported by the facts. The Board's peer assistance contract with Lighthouse was set to expire and the Board determined that it wanted to award its peer assistance contract to Lighthouse. Subsequently, the Board was notified by staff that a request for grant proposal (RFGP) was required prior to making such an award. Board staff prepared the RFGP and it was sent out for bid. Following the bidding process wherein Lighthouse was unsuccessful, the Board refused to award the contract to the winner, insisting that Lighthouse be awarded the peer assistance grant. This action was taken against legal advice and resulted in both the Attorney General and auditors from the Office of Internal Audit to opine that the action violated state law. Subsequently, a re-written RFGP (one that included significant input from a representative from the Board) went out for bid and Lighthouse chose not to bid on the peer assistance grant. That fact notwithstanding, a subsequent decision to award a short term grant extension to Lighthouse in order to "bridge any gap in services" was supported by a majority of the Board, following a healthy, robust discussion.

Ms. Wray expressed that she was a thoughtful person that had an opinion and was highly insulted and disappointed that someone would think that she could be bullied and base her opinion on someone else opinion. No further action was taken by the Board.

### **Changes Regarding Massage Establishment and Massage Therapist Applications**

#### **Initial Establishment Application**

1. Change the wording in question (b) on the Ownership or Proceeds Disclosure Form in the Establishment application to read: If you have applied for or held professional licensure/certification in any state, has any such application been denied or has the license/certification been disciplined, lost, conditioned or restricted?
2. Add onto the Establishment application that the responsible person/owner(s) must list all massage establishments that he/she has ever owned and list all massage establishments where he/she has ever been previously employed.
3. Add onto the Establishment application that the responsible person/owner(s) must list the days and times of operation.

4. Add the following question to the Establishment application: Has the establishment been open for business prior to the date of your application being submitted and approved?

After a brief discussion Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Easterly, to approve the list of changes to the Establishment application. The motion carried.

### **Massage Therapist Initial Application**

1. Add a # 6 on page four (4) of the application in order to add additional clarification to question # 7 regarding the meaning of “ever” being convicted of any felony or misdemeanor other than a minor traffic violation.
2. Add the following question to the Massage Therapist application: Do you as the applicant have the ability to read, write, speak, and understand English fluently, and have you read and understand the rules and regulations of the Tennessee Massage Board. Ms. Burke made a motion, seconded by Ms. Jagers that the language from the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy Application be adopted by the Tennessee Board of Massage. The motion carried.
3. Add the following question to the application: If English is not your first language, please list your first language.
4. Add the following question to the application: Is someone besides the applicant completing this application. If so, please provide your name, contact #, and address.
5. Add onto the Massage Therapist application that the applicant applying for licensure must list all massage establishments that he/she has ever owned.
6. Change question 10 on the application to read: If you have ever held a license or certificate in any profession, has it ever been reprimanded, suspended, restricted, revoked, or otherwise disciplined, curtailed or voluntarily surrendered under threat of investigations or disciplinary action?

After a brief discussion Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray, to approve the list of changes to the Massage Therapist application. The motion carried.

### **English Language Proficiency Test**

Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to defer the discussion and any action regarding an English Language Proficiency Test to the August Meeting. The motion carried.

### **Pictures on Licenses and Applications**

After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Jagers to defer the discussion and any action regarding Pictures on Licenses and Applications to the November

Meeting. The motion carried. Ms. Wray also suggested researching the possibility of having a picture of the licensee attached to the verification page.

#### **Approve Funding for Board Attorney to attend FARB Seminar**

After a brief description of the seminar by Mr. Guilford, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Easterly to approve funding for Marc Guilford, Massage Board Attorney, to attend the FARB Regulatory Law Seminar in Denver Colorado in October 2015. The motion carried.

#### **Designate and approve funding for attendance to 2015 FSMTB Conference**

Mr. Bolden requested that the Board designate three (3) Board members and staff to attend the 2015 Federation of State Massage Board Conference in Albuquerque, NM. After a brief discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to send Kimberly Hodge, Board Manager, to the Conference. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray to send Ms. Rosemarie Otto, Director of HRB, to the Conference. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Easterly to send Marc Guilford, Massage Board Attorney, to the Conference. Ms. Wray made a motion, seconded by Ms. Cross to send Ms. Marvis Burke, Board Member, to the Conference. Ms. Easterly made a motion, seconded by Ms. Cross to send Ms. Jagers, Board Member, to the Conference. The motion carried. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to allow funding to send all Board Members and Board Staff to the FSMTB Conference. The motion carried.

#### **Discuss School submitting approval for Tennessee Law Continuing Education Class**

The Board discussed if it was necessary for approved Tennessee Massage Schools to submit the two (2) hour Tennessee Law Class to the Board for continuing education approval. After a discussion, Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray to no longer require approved Tennessee Massage Schools to submit documentation and fees to be approved to teach the two (2) hour Tennessee Law continuing education class. The motion carried and is effective June 1, 2015. Ms. Burke recused herself from the vote.

#### **Discuss rulemaking hearing, rule amendments, and policies.**

Mr. Guilford requested that when the Board wavers from a Board policy, that a detailed explanation be given in the motion as to the reason for varying from the policy. Mr. Bolden requested that when a motion is made for denial of an application, that the Board members state the reason supported by the rule and statute for the denial.

#### **Discuss School Annual Report**

Ms. Sandra Hill reported that the Massage Board Administrative Office mailed the Annual Report to all approved Tennessee Massage Schools in November 2014, and received Annual Reports back from the majority of schools. As of May 4, 2015, seven schools had still not submitted their annual report. Rule **0870-02-.07** requires that every Board-approved program shall file an annual report with the Board on or before December 31 of each calendar year. The

Board requested that all seven (7) schools be contacted regarding submitting their annual report.

### **Reinstating Inspections of Massage Establishments**

Mr. Bolden expressed his support for all the Board Members involved on the task force and explained that the Task Force does not make decisions for the Board, but rather does research and then brings recommendations for the Board approve or deny. Ms. Cross clarified that the Inspection Task force recommendation for suspension of establishment license was only after an inspector had made multiple attempts and was unable to inspect the establishment or an owner/therapist refused to allow the inspector to inspect the establishment without just cause. Ms. Easterly felt the secret shopper suggestion would be helpful. Inspectors could make an appointment for a massage which would allow a blocked time to inspect the establishment. This would help in making sure therapist's sessions were not interrupted and that there would be an individual onsite so that the inspection could be completed. After further discussion, Ms. Burke made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray to appoint Ms. Cross to continue to work on the Inspection Task Force and bring further recommendations to the Board regarding re-instating inspections and RFP. The motion carried.

Ms. Burke made a motion, seconded by Ms. Cross to adjourn the meeting at 4:14 pm.

**Contested Case Hearings**

**Tiezhu Ni, LMT - 10454**

Mr. Marc Guilford, Assistant General Counsel, represented the Tennessee Department of Health. The proceedings were presided over by Administrative Law Judge, Michael Begley. Mr. Ni was present but was not represented by an attorney. The Office of General Counsel provided an interpreter from the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute for the contested case hearing. The interpreter, Ms. Elizabeth Huang, translated the Board's questions and concerns regarding Mr. Ni's education and MBLEx scores.

Mr. Ni took and initially received a passing score on the Massage and Bodywork Licensure Exam (MBLEx). By a letter dated July 14, 2014, the Board was notified that Mr. Ni's MBLEx scores had been invalidated and that he would have to wait a period of twelve (12) months from the date of the invalidation before reapplying to take the exam. Based on the invalidation of Mr. Ni's scores, he has not met the requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-105(b) (3). Therefore, Mr. Ni has not met the statutory requirements to hold a massage therapy license in Tennessee, which constitutes a violation of Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-108 and Rules & Regs 0870-01-.04(1)(f).

Kimberly Hodge, Massage Board Manager, testified for the Department of Health regarding Mr. Ni's massage application file. After a discussion and review, the Board found that Mr. Ni had violated the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board statutes and regulations by not meeting the requirements to hold a massage therapy in Tennessee. Mr. Ni's conduct constitutes grounds for discipline. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wray, to amend # 11 of the proposed order to read: Respondent may reapply for licensure in Tennessee at such time that he has passed the MBLEx exam. The motion carried with Ms. Burke opposed. Mr. Ni license is revoked, and he is required to pay all civil penalties and costs in full within 12 months from the issuance of the Assessment of Costs. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Burke to adopt the amended order. The motion carried.

### **Tongshe Li, LMT - 10320**

Mr. Marc Guilford, Assistant General Counsel, represented the Tennessee Department of Health. The proceedings were presided over by Administrative Law Judge, Michael Begley. Mr. Li was not present nor represented by an attorney. Mr. Guilford introduced evidence that a Notice of Hearing was sent to the respondent and was signed. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Easterly, to proceed with the hearing in Mr. Li's absence. The motion carried.

Mr. Li took and initially received a passing score on the Massage and Bodywork Licensure Exam (MBLEx). By a letter dated July 14, 2014, the Board was notified that Mr. Li's MBLEx scores had been invalidated and that he would have to wait a period of twelve (12) months from the date of the invalidation before reapplying to take the exam. Based on the invalidation of Mr. Li's scores, he has not met the requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-105(b) (3). Therefore, Mr. Li has not met the statutory requirements to hold a massage therapy license in Tennessee, which constitutes a violation of Tenn. Code Ann. 63-18-108 and Rules & Regs 0870-01-.04(1)(f).

Kimberly Hodge, Massage Board Manager, testified for the Department of Health regarding Mr. Li's massage application file. After a discussion and review, the Board found that Mr. Li had violated the Tennessee Massage Licensure Board statutes and regulations by not meeting the requirements to hold a massage therapy in Tennessee. Mr. Li's conduct constitutes grounds for discipline. Ms. Cross made a motion, seconded by Ms. Easterly, to accept the proposed order as written with the amendment of Federation of State Massage Boards in the Reasons For The Decision. The motion carried. Mr. Li's license is revoked, and he is required to pay all civil penalties and costs in full within 12 months from the issuance of the Assessment of Costs.

**Cheryl D. Butler, LMT - 6668**

Mr. Devin M. Wells, Assistant General Counsel, represented the Tennessee Department of Health. The proceedings were presided over by Administrative Law Judge, Michael Begley. Ms. Butler was not present nor represented by an attorney. Mr. Wells submitted an affidavit of service by Ashley Fine, who is Mr. Wells' paralegal, and introduced evidence that a Notice of Hearing was sent to the respondent and signed for by Ms. Butler. Ms. Butler's massage license is revoked and she is required to pay all cost in full within 12 months from the issuance of the Assessment of Costs.
