# 339 Applications

total for both collaborative and noncollaborative projects were submitted for non-competitive SWIG funds



### **Timeline for Application Review**

# Application Submission Deadline November 1, 2022

Grant applicants submitted all proposals to TDEC by 4:30PM CT to be reviewed for non-competitive grant funding approval.

# Proposal Discussions Ongoing

TDEC and grant applicants will conduct proposal related discussions regarding individual projects, project timelines, terms and conditions, subcontracting, budget, and reimbursement processes.

# Application Review Completion January 30, 2023

TDEC reviews applications through Jan 2023. Most applicants will receive a decision regarding their application prior to this date.

# Final Contract Approval Target Date February 28, 2023

As applications are approved, they are put in the pipeline for contracts. All applications in the pipeline should be under contract by February 28.

# STATE STRATEGIC PROJECTS (PHASE 2) DISCUSSION

### **Phase 2 Overview – State Strategic Projects**

TDEC allocated \$269 million to State Strategic Projects across five key areas:

# Community Water Infrastructure

## **Competitive Grant Types**

Regionalization	Water Reuse	Resource Protection (Green Infrastructure)
\$100M	\$50M	\$50M
Strategically connecting rural Tennessee infrastructure to improve services and optimize capacity. Efforts to provide cooperative support across water and wastewater systems to enhance system capacity, reduce costs, or obtain a higher quality of service.	Practice of capturing water that would otherwise be discarded, treating it to an appropriate level, and reusing it for beneficial purposes.	Activities that protect water infrastructure assets, improve stormwater management, and provide water quality benefits through mimicking natural processes.
All regionalization projects should result in improving the sustainability, affordability, and/or reliability of systems included in the proposal.	Non-Potable Potable	Although flood control projects are not an eligible activity, resource protection projects often provide flood mitigation cobenefits.



### **Program Considerations and Eligibilities**

#### **Non-Competitive Grant Program**

- Only open to government entities
- A variety of projects are eligible if at least one critical need is addressed
- Collaborative and noncollaborative projects prioritized equally

#### **Competitive Grant Program**

- Expanded applicant eligibility
- Projects must fit within three priority areas
- Demonstration of addressing issues of significant non-compliance
- Collaborative projects will be prioritized
- Projects will be ranked for funding



### **Competitive Grant Target Dates**

**March 2023**: Release Grant Manual

**May 2023**: Open Application Solicitation

**August 2023:** Close Application Solicitation

**September 2023**: Review and Rank Applications

October 2023: Announce Awards

**November - December 2023**: Execute Contracts


