Funds Requested and Applications Submitted

- The Non-Competitive Grant (Collaborative and Non-Collaborative) Application Period closed on November 1, 2022

Approximately
\$932 Million

in funds were requested for a variety of water projects throughout the state of Tennessee

339 Applications

total for both collaborative and non-collaborative projects were submitted for non-competitive SWIG funds

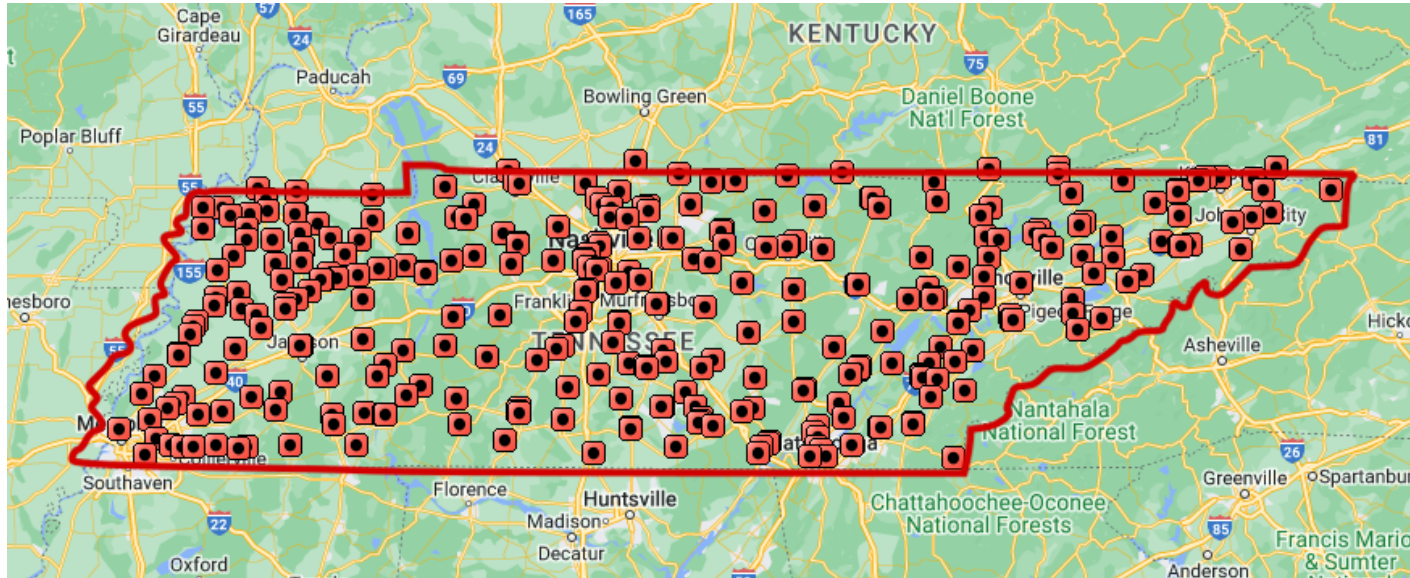

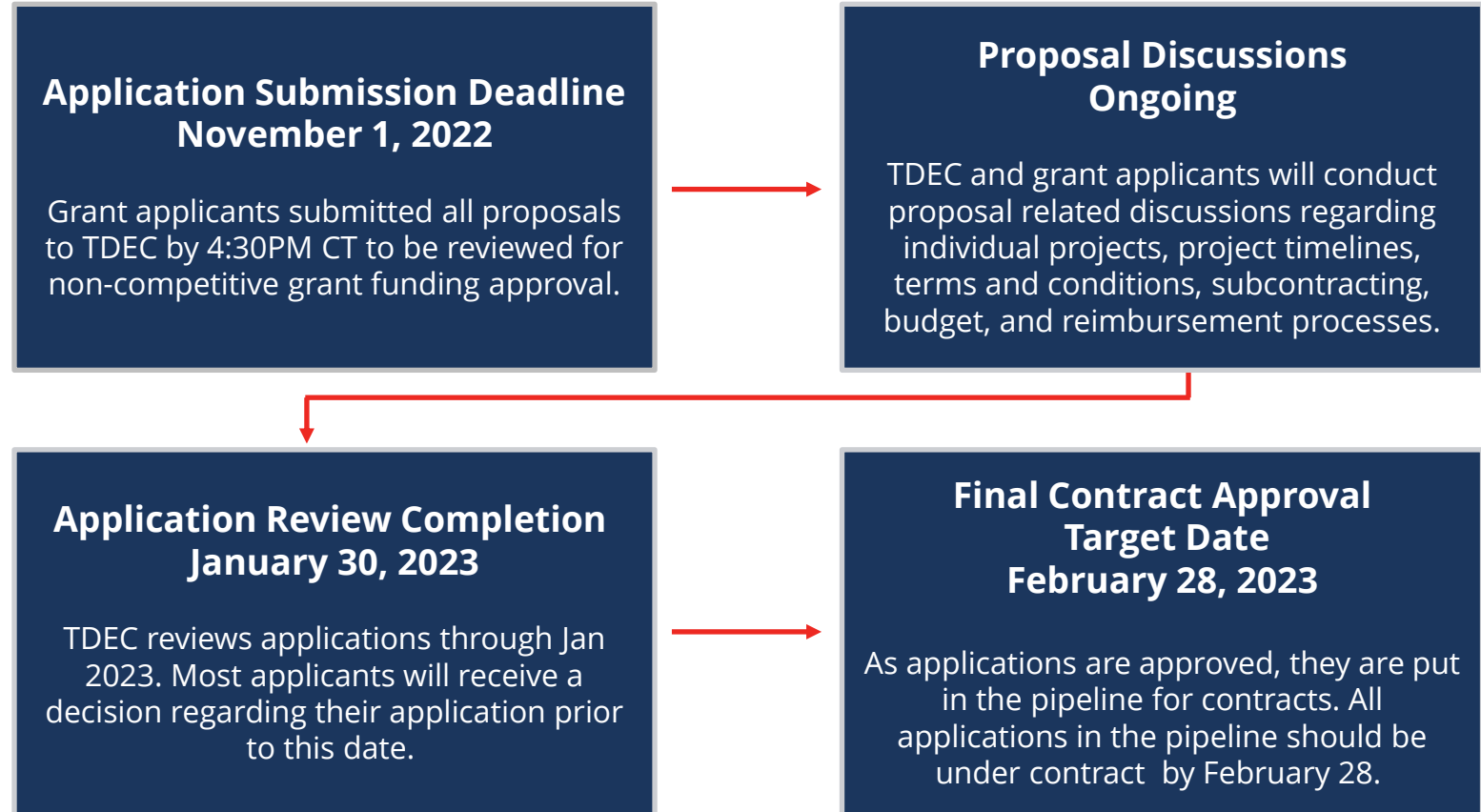

Phase 2 Overview – State Strategic Projects

- TDEC allocated **\$269 million** to **State Strategic Projects** across five key areas:

Community Water Infrastructure

\$200M

Grant Program

Focused on priority areas:

- Regionalization
- Water Reuse
- Resource Protection

Septic Management

\$6.5M

Grant Pilot Program

Septic system repair, replacement, and/or decommissioning

Enterprise-Scale Infrastructure Investments

Water, wastewater, and stormwater improvements for Tennessee State Parks and TDOT

Development of Technical Assistance and IT Solutions

Supplemental Funding for Non-Competitive Grant

\$3.5M

<p>Strategically connecting rural Tennessee infrastructure to improve services and optimize capacity. Efforts to provide cooperative support across water and wastewater systems to enhance system capacity, reduce costs, or obtain a higher quality of service.</p> <p><i>All regionalization projects should result in improving the sustainability, affordability, and/or reliability of systems included in the proposal.</i></p>	<p>Practice of capturing water that would otherwise be discarded, treating it to an appropriate level, and reusing it for beneficial purposes.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Non-Potable</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Potable</i></p>	<p>Activities that protect water infrastructure assets, improve stormwater management, and provide water quality benefits through mimicking natural processes.</p> <p><i>Although flood control projects are not an eligible activity, resource protection projects often provide flood mitigation co-benefits.</i></p>

Program Considerations and Eligibilities

Non-Competitive Grant Program

- ✓ Only open to government entities
- ✓ A variety of projects are eligible if at least one critical need is addressed
- ✓ Collaborative and non-collaborative projects prioritized equally

Competitive Grant Program

- ✓ Expanded applicant eligibility
- ✓ Projects must fit within three priority areas
- ✓ Demonstration of addressing issues of significant non-compliance
- ✓ Collaborative projects will be prioritized
- ✓ Projects will be ranked for funding

Competitive Grant Target Dates

March 2023: Release Grant Manual

May 2023: Open Application Solicitation

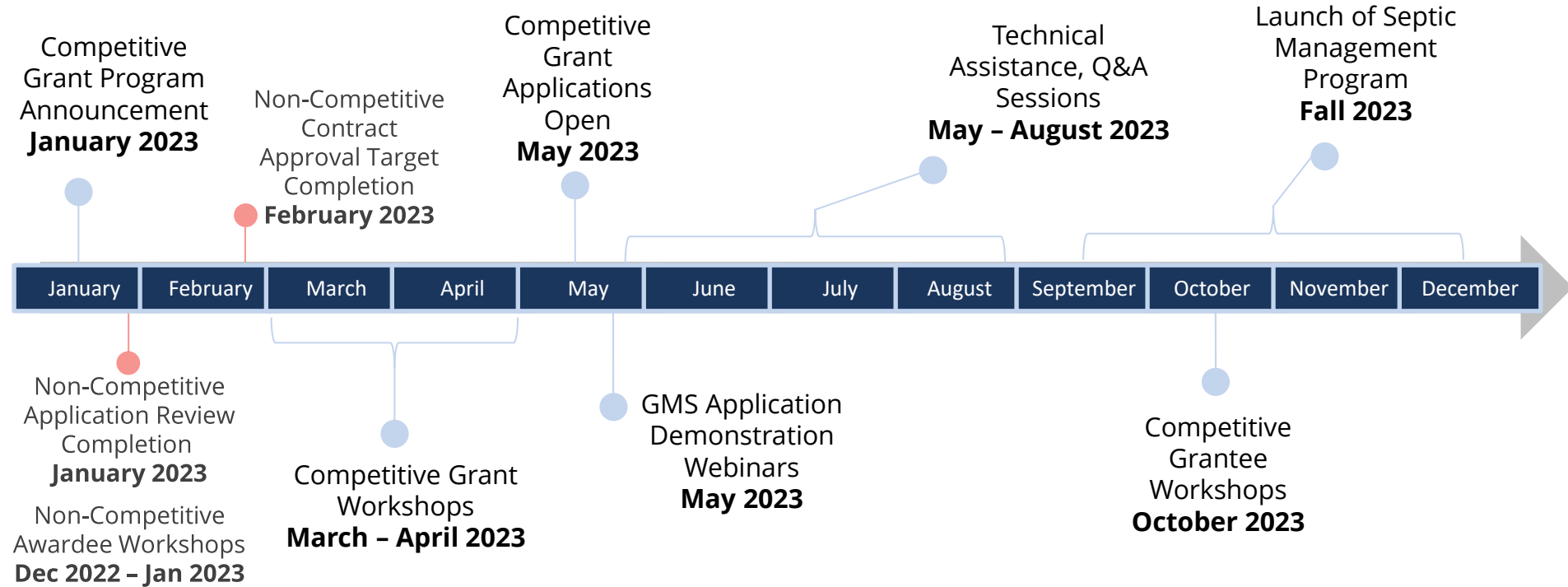
August 2023: Close Application Solicitation

September 2023: Review and Rank Applications

October 2023: Announce Awards

November – December 2023: Execute Contracts

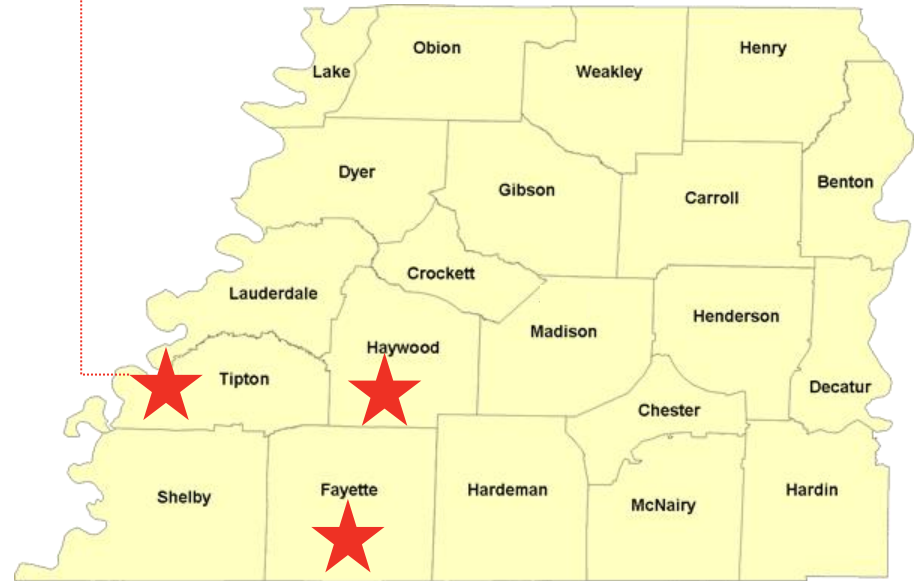
