Thank you for the submission of the Putnam County MSW Region's Ten-Year Plan revision. It would like to congratulate you on the preparation of an excellent plan revision. Before your plan can be approved, there are a few minor items that need additional attention.

- 1. 68-211-815(b)(13) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include a timetable for implementation of the plan.
 - a. In Chapter 1, page 9, you provide an implementation schedule which lists only one element to be accomplished during the next ten-year period. Has the Board determined that to be the only accomplishment to be achieved during the next ten years? Items such as landfill disposal contract review and renewal could also be included on this schedule. Please review plan for additional goals which could be included on timetable.
- 2. 68-211-813(b)(1) requires that members of the solid waste region board serve for terms of six (6) years except for the initial board which shall have approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of two (2) years, and approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of four (4) years, so as to stagger the terms of office.
 - a. In Chapter 2, on page 13, the confirmation dates for the list of board members indicate that they are all newly appointed. At the end of the current terms for newly appointed members, all members should be appointed or re-appointed for 6-year terms so as to keep the terms for each position staggered in accordance with the statue provided above.

- 3. 68-211-815(b)(7) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include a recycling plan, including a description of current public and private recycling efforts and planned efforts to enhance recycling within the county or region.
 - a. While the programs in the Putnam County Solid Waste Region are to be congratulated for their accomplishments, plans to enhance recycling within the county or region have not been discussed. Please reflect on improvements that could be made to enhance the recycling programs in the Region.
- 4. 68-211-815(b)(2)(C), (4), (5), (6) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include **disposal capability**, including an analysis of the remaining **life expectancy** of landfills or other disposal facilities, **anticipated** waste capacity needs, planned capacity assurance, including descriptions of planned or needed.
 - a. According to page 20 in Chapter 3, you have a projected growth rate of 3.5% over the next ten years. Was the potential impact of this growth taken into account when planning for the items above?

The items mentioned above are minor: however, the additional information will improve the 10-year plan and you are encouraged to give the comments thought and consideration. If you have questions or need assistance, contact me at (615) 532-0744.







WHEREAS, the Putnam County Solid Waste Authority has prepared and adopted a five year revision and updated the Solid Waste Management plan for Putnam County Solid Waste Region, has held a public hearing on the plan, and recommends its adoption by Putnam County and the cities.

Your letter pertaining to the Putnam County Solid Waste 5-Year Update was reviewed for comment. The responses to the four (4) listed items are discussed below. We have attached copies of additional information as needed.

1. Implementation Schedule


The original implementation schedule listed the renewal or rebid of the Putnam County Disposal Contract between Putnam County and BFI, Inc. at the Middlepoint Landfill in Murfreesboro to occur in 2001 (a copy is attached). As part of the renewal or rebidding process, the review and renewal/rebid of the landfill disposal contract are an obvious part of this process. During this fiscal year 2000-2001, Putnam County will be reviewing the disposal contract for options. The County Commission will make the final decision to renew or rebid disposal services for the solid waste collected at the County Transfer Station.

2. Putnam County Solid Waste Planning Board Members

The confirmation date for the list of current board members does indicate that all members are newly appointed as of March 2000. Their terms of office are indeed staggered as required by law. The original planning board members were appointed in 1992 and not reapponted by either the County or City Legislative bodies. A copy of the original members is attached from the Directory of Municipal Solid Waste Regional Planning Boards, compiled by the Tennessee State Planning Office, September 1993. More that six (6) years have passed since the first appointments were made. When the Putnam County Regional Solid Waste 5-Year Update was started, all original board members were no longer serving any terms of office. no original planning board member in Putnam County and its cities were appointed in March of 2000. Therefore, the newly appointed board members listed in the 5-Year Update for the Planning Region of Putnam County is valid representation of the requirement of TCA 68-211-813(b)(1).

3. Regional Recycling Programs

A copy of the regional recycling programs in Putnam County, and the cities of Cookeville, Algood and Monterey are attached. The County operates a material recovery facility and the City of Cookeville operates a solid waste processing facility for composting and mulching products. There are more than adequate public and private waste reduction programs throughout the region presently, according to requirements of Tennessee State Law. Maintaining the current level of recycling and waste reduction services in the Region during times of decreasing state shared revenues shall prove to be a sufficient challenge for the County and its cities to face for the future.

4. Disposal Capability

A projected growth of population and economic activity for the Solid Waste Region of Putnam County was evaluated for the potential impact on planned solid waste disposal capacity for the Region. As was stated in the Update, the Remaining Life Survey, dated October 1999, provided by each Class I landfill in Tennessee to the Division of Solid Waste Management, states that the Middlepoint Landfill has approximately 10 years remaining life of disposal space based on projected increases in tonnages. Although the Region of Putnam County is projected to grow in population and economic activity at a rate of 3.5%, solid waste disposal tonnages will likely not increase at the same rate. The disposal tonnage for the Region in 1993 was 60,461 tons. The disposal tonnage for 1999 was 42,338.

The information provided on the four (4) items addressed above is subject to additional discussion if need be. If you need any other information from the Region, please do not hesitate to contact me.

From Putman Update, 2000 New Board

Chapter 2: General Information about the Region

Statutory Authority (edited) - T.C.A. 68-211-815(b):

Each plan shall include demographic information; and a current system analysis, including costs, using a full-cost accounting model; revenues; and adoption of uniform financial accounting systems; and an evaluation of multi-county solid waste disposal Regions with an explanation of the reasons for adopting or failing to adopt a multi-county Regional approach.

- Putnam County elected to become a single-county solid waste region. The Putnam County Solid Waste Planning Region is comprised of Putnam County and the municipalities of Cookeville, Monterey, Algood, and Baxter.
- 2. The total population of the Putnam County Planning Region projected for the year 2000 is 60,452 people. The source of information used for this statistic is the "Population Projections for Tennessee Counties and Municipalities 2000-2020," The University of Tennessee, Center for Business and Economic Research, January 1999.

No immediate changes for the existing disposal arrangement is planned for the Solid Waste Region. The contract was signed in 1996 and will either be renewed for an additional 5 years, or Putnam County will rebid disposal services at that time.
- 4. The BFI Middlepoint Class I Landfill in Rutherford County, TN has a disposal capacity of approximately 10 years according to the 1999 Remaining Life Survey prepared by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Division of Solid Waste Management.

Thank you for the submission of the Putnam County MSW Region's Ten-Year Plan revision. I would like to congratulate you on the preparation of an excellent plan revision. Before your plan can be approved, there are a few minor items that need additional attention.

- 1. 68-211-815(b)(13) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include a timetable for implementation of the plan.
 - a. In Chapter 1, page 9, you provide an implementation schedule which lists only one element to be accomplished during the next ten-year period. Has the Board determined that to be the only accomplishment to be achieved during the next ten years? Items such as landfill disposal contract review and renewal could also be included on this schedule. Please review plan for additional goals which could be included on timetable.
- 2. 68-211-813(b)(1) requires that members of the solid waste region board serve for terms of six (6) years except for the initial board which shall have approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of two (2) years, and approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of four (4) years, so as to stagger the terms of office.
 - a. In Chapter 2, on page 13, the confirmation dates for the list of board members indicate that they are all newly appointed. At the end of the current terms for newly appointed members, all members should be appointed or re-appointed for 6-year terms so as to keep the terms for each position staggered in accordance with the statue provided above.

- 3. 68-211-815(b)(7) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include a recycling plan, including a description of current public and private recycling efforts and planned efforts to enhance recycling within the county or region.
 - a. While the programs in the Putnam County Solid Waste Region are to be congratulated for their accomplishments, plans to enhance recycling within the county or region have not been discussed. Please reflect on improvements that could be made to enhance the recycling programs in the Region.
- 4. 68-211-815(b)(2)(C), (4), (5), (6) requires that at a minimum, each plan and revised plan submitted by a municipal solid waste region shall include **disposal capability**, including an analysis of the remaining **life expectancy** of landfills or other disposal facilities, anticipated waste capacity needs, planned capacity assurance, including descriptions of planned or needed.
 - a. According to page 20 in Chapter 3, you have a projected growth rate of 3.5% over the next ten years. Was the potential impact of this growth taken into account when planning for the items above?

The items mentioned above are minor: however, the additional information will improve the 10-year plan and you are encouraged to give the comments thought and consideration. If you have questions or need assistance, contact me at (615) 532-0744.
