Re: Ballad Health's Submission of Revised Exhibit B Proposal for Tennessee and Virginia

Dear Mr. Levine,

We are responding to your letter dated November 5, 2021, formally requesting the modification to Exhibit B under Section 3.06(c) of the Second Amended and Restated Terms of Certification ("TOC"). We understand that you are simultaneously requesting a similar modification from Virginia under their Letter Authorizing a Cooperative Agreement ("CA") and desire that the States align required spending under the TOC and CA as closely as possible.

Your proposed Exhibit B modifies the timing of the spending commitments to cure shortfalls and to address delay caused by the COVID-19 public health emergencies but does not alter the total amount of the commitment, nor does it alter the relative amount required under each spending plan.

We find that the revised <u>Exhibit B</u> reasonably addresses the spending obligations under the TOC in view of Ballad's spend in the early years of the TOC and its commendable response to the demands of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Therefore, we approve the replacement of the present <u>Exhibit B</u> in the TOC with the attached <u>Exhibit B- Revised Tennessee Proposal</u>. In order to best coordinate with your obligations under Virginia's CA, we have determined that <u>Exhibit B-Revised Tennessee Proposal</u> shall be effective as of July 1, 2022, but any qualifying expenditures towards approved plan items under existing <u>Exhibit B</u> may be credited by the COPA Monitor towards <u>Exhibit B-Revised Tennessee Proposal</u> spending requirements.

We appreciate Ballad's timely efforts to pivot back to fulfilling its monetary commitments under the TOC and look forward to the benefit these expenditures have for the citizens of Tennessee.
