

Drug Dependent Newborns (Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome)

Quick Facts: NAS in Tennessee

- 366 cases of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) have been reported since January 1, 2015
- In the majority of NAS cases (68.9%), at least one of the substances causing NAS was prescribed to the mother by a health care provider.
- The highest rates of NAS in 2015 have occurred in Sullivan County and the Northeast region.

NAS Prevention Highlight

On April 1, 2015, the 14 year-old Tennessee "Intractable Pain Act" was repealed by legislation and Public Chapter 26 will become effective on July 1, 2015. The Intractable Pain Act allowed patients to choose opiate medications as a first option for treatment, and if the doctor refused, required the doctor to inform the patients of other physicians who specialize in the treatment of severe chronic pain with opiates.

This policy change will provide another tool to prescribers as they work together with other health care professionals to prevent the misuse, abuse, and addiction to prescription drugs.

NAS Prevention Opportunities

Women of Childbearing Age

- Ask your health care provider about the risks of any medication you are taking
- Take only medications that are prescribed to you. Never use someone else's medication
