



### **Background**

- In May 2020, FEMA released the COVID-19 Pandemic Operational Guidance for the 2020 Hurricane Season.
- This document provided actionable guidance to SLTT officials to prepare for response and recovery operations and encourage preparedness measures amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The COVID-19 Pandemic Operational Guidance: All-Hazards Incident Response and Recovery is an update to last year's document, illustrating how the emergency management community has operated in a pandemic environment over the past year and how we continue to adapt, apply best practices, and address current challenges.



# **Operational Guidance**

All-Hazards Incident Response and Recovery

May 2021





### What Did NOT Change

- Provides actionable guidance for SLTT officials to prepare for response and recovery operations amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Maintains an all-hazards focus as the nation enters the 2021 Atlantic and Pacific hurricane seasons and the peak Western wildfire season.
- Explains how FEMA plans to continue to adapt response and recovery operations to ensure prioritization for life safety, life sustainment, and workforce protection, and maintain the delivery of FEMA programs in a pandemic environment.
- Keeps the foundational emergency management concepts relatively unchanged from last year.
- Offers resource checklists for SLTT jurisdictions to use based on their most critical needs.



### What DID Change

- Describes continued challenges to disaster operations posed by COVID-19 and updated planning considerations for emergency managers that are based on the best available data.
- Outlines considerations for SLTT governments related to planning COVID-19 testing and vaccination operations – this includes providing an overview of how FEMA supports SLTTs in establishing and operating testing facilities and vaccination sites that ensure the fair and equitable distribution of vaccines to all individuals who want one.
- Provides updated resources reflecting current lessons learned for operating in a pandemic environment to enable emergency managers to best adapt response and recovery plans.





# Vaccination Campaign Support and Equitable Response and Recovery Operations

- FEMA continues to support SLTT partners in a vaccination campaign to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and to facilitate other response and recovery efforts following an incident.
- Equity remains a key priority for the Agency:
  - FEMA requires Recipients and Subrecipients to focus the use of FEMA funding on the highest-risk and underserved populations, and to prioritize limited resources to ensure an equitable pandemic response.
  - FEMA has developed resources to support SLTT partners in safe and equitable distribution of vaccines through resources such as the <u>Civil Rights Checklist</u> and <u>Data Collection Advisory</u>.

#### **FEMA's Posture**

- FEMA continues to support ongoing disaster operations in all 10 FEMA regions.
- FEMA's regions continue to **provide technical assistance and coordination** for a range of program areas across response and recovery operations with their respective SLTT partners.
- For disaster operations in the COVID-19 environment, FEMA has adapted its traditional field operations and program delivery model to expedite services, support, and assistance to SLTT partners while protecting the health and safety of employees. This includes:
  - Adjusting in-person and virtual deployments to meet the needs of disaster survivors;
  - Establishing document drop off centers in place of disaster recovery centers (DRC);
  - Utilizing public messaging to encourage online and phone registrations;
  - Providing for non-congregate sheltering support; and
  - Implementing a Virtual Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) process.



### **Response Planning - SLTT Planning**

- Review response plans and guidance to align and synchronize community response actions with Federal planning efforts.
- Ensure adequate protective measures are in place for the disaster workforce and survivors, including maximizing vaccinations of all community members who want one – especially emergency managers, critical infrastructure workers, volunteer organizations, and any other personnel critical to conducting rapid, effective disaster operations.
- Track vaccination rates in potentially impacted communities, especially among the most socially vulnerable, and adjust planning, response operations, and protective measures accordingly.



# Response Considerations for SLTT Partners

- Have you reviewed lessons learned from response operations conducted in the COVID-19 environment and incorporated best practices or recommendations into current plans?
- Do you have a plan to maximize vaccination efforts in advance of disaster activity periods? Have you established a system to track progress in vaccinating potentially impacted communities?
- Do you have plans in place to temporarily suspend operations at fixed or mobile vaccination or testing sites due to severe weather?
- Do you have a plan to determine which personnel will be physically deployed to the field and how they will be protected?
- Are you using data, such as the CDC's Social Vulnerability Index (SVI), to drive response planning and decision-making?

### **Recovery Planning - SLTT Planning**

- Many SLTT jurisdictions have successfully and effectively adapted their recovery operational plans, long-term recovery objectives, and pre-disaster recovery plans to account for this new operating environment.
- SLTT partners should continue to coordinate with FEMA regions
  if they have questions about implementing new policies or
  delivery methods for recovery programs.
- SLTT partners should continue to explore how to modify existing recovery and reconstitution plans and structures to support current COVID-19 recovery operations and accommodate for potential future disasters.



# Recovery Considerations for SLTT Partners

- Have you reviewed lessons learned from recovery operations conducted in the COVID-19 environment and incorporated best practices into current plans?
- Have you identified sufficient congregate shelter space to safely implement social distancing as well as sufficient non-congregate shelter space?
- Have you reviewed and incorporated guidance from Federal departments and agencies into sheltering plans and strategies?
- Have you planned for providing Personal Assistance Services and other support for populations seeking shelter?
- Can you hold effective public meetings while maintaining social distancing? Do you have mechanisms to reach isolated or underserved communities?


### What are the Objectives?
