Labor Force & Nonfarm Employment, 2016-2020

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has two cooperating agreements with states to collect employment levels and unemployment data for states and sub-state areas. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program samples approximately 145,000 businesses and government agencies representing 697,000 worksites in the U.S. The survey is done on a monthly basis by asking for an establishment's employment, hours, and earnings for the pay period that includes the 12th of each month. This data is solicited using computer assisted telephone surveys. The result is monthly nonfarm employment estimates. These estimates provide total employment, by industry, for the state and metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). This data is compiled based on the employee's place of work.

The second cooperative agreement is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. The source data is obtained by the Bureau of the Census using a monthly phone survey of about 60,000 households. The data collected from this survey includes the number of persons who are currently working and/or unemployed and available to work. The results are the total employment and the unemployment percentages in the U.S., states, and sub-states areas. The LAUS program compiles data based on the employee's county of residence, rather than county of work. This is the primary reason why the total employment count differs in each program.

The monthly data for both programs are updated and revised to produce annual averages at the end of each year. Pages 2 and 3 of this edition show the annual averages for Tennessee and the four largest MSAs. The nonfarm employment provides a glimpse of growing and declining industries.

In Tennessee

The total nonfarm employment in Tennessee, from 2016 to 2020, increased by 29,500 jobs (1.0 percent). In the previous year (2019-2020) nonfarm employment decreased by 124,300 jobs. During the five year time period, Nashville MSA employment grew at a faster rate, 5.2 percent

(49,300 jobs) compared to the total growth rate for the state. According to the LAUS survey, which includes employees by place of residence, Nashville MSA employment grew by 6.2 percent (57,884 workers) while the state employment grew by 1.9 percent (56,215 workers). The nonfarm employment in the four largest MSAs increased by 43,100 jobs.

Tennessee industries with the highest growth were mining, logging, & construction (up 14,200 jobs, or 11.9 percent); financial activities (up 14,900 jobs, or 9.5 percent); other services (up 6,200 jobs, or 5.6 percent); and professional & business services (up 9,600 jobs, or 2.4 percent).

The LAUS data shows that the unemployment rate decreased every year in the state of Tennessee, except for 2020. From 2016 through 2019, nonfarm employment increased in every year in Tennessee and the four largest MSAs. The only exceptions occurred in two of the six smaller MSAs. Employment declined in the Cleveland MSA in 2017 and 2018, and in the Kingsport-Bristol MSA in 2017 through 2019. All MSAs had lower nonfarm employment in 2020. According to the labor force estimates, the MSAs with the highest and lowest unemployment rates in 2016 were Clarksville-Hopkinsville-KY (5.3 percent) and Nashville (3.8 percent), respectively. By 2020 the highest and lowest unemployment rates were Memphis (8.8 percent) and Knoxville (6.2 percent), respectively.

U.S. Comparisons

The most recent annual average unemployment rate in the U.S. was 8.1 percent. The unemployment rate in previous years was 4.9 percent (2016); 4.4 percent (2017); 3.9 percent (2018); and 3.7 percent (2019). During 2020, Nebraska had the lowest unemployment rate (4.2 percent). In 2020, the highest unemployment rate was in Nevada (12.8 percent).

Tennessee's ranking compared to other states' unemployment rates was 27th in 2020. The previous rankings for the state were 23rd (in 2019); 21st (in 2018); 17th (in 2017); and 25th (in 2016).





Nonfarm Employment & Labor Workforce Narrative

Total nonfarm employment increased by 269,700 jobs from April 2020 to April 2021. There were increases in leisure & hospitality (up 82,100 jobs), which includes increases of 64,500 jobs in food services & drinking places; trade/transportation/utilities (up 54,200 jobs), which includes increases of 31,400 jobs in retail trade; manufacturing (up 49,400 jobs), which includes increases of 40,800 jobs in durable goods manufacturing; professional & business services (up 44,000 jobs), which includes increases of 27,800 jobs in administrative/ support/waste management.

These increases were partially offset by decreases in nursing & residential care facilities (down 5,500 jobs); state government (down 700 jobs); heavy and civil engineering construction (down 500 jobs); truck transportation (down 400 jobs).

During the past month, nonfarm employment increased by 5,300 jobs. There were increases in leisure & hospitality (up 9,100 jobs), which include increases of 6,400 jobs in food services & drinking places; other services (up 1,300 jobs); mining/logging/construction (up 1,100 jobs), which includes increases of 1,000 jobs in construction; financial activities and government (both up 1,000 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by decreases in trade/transportation/utilities (down 5,300 jobs), which includes decreases of 4,600 jobs in transportation & warehousing; manufacturing (down 3,600 jobs), which includes decreases of 2,100 jobs in durable goods manufacturing.

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for April 2021 was 5.0 percent, down slightly from the revised March 2021 rate of 5.1 percent. The United States unemployment rate for April 2021 was 6.1 percent, up slightly from the revised March 2021 rate of 6.0 percent. In April 2020, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 14.8 percent while the state rate was 15.8 percent.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased in 87 counties, decreased in 6 counties, and remained the same in 2 counties. Williamson County had the lowest rate at 2.8 percent, down from the revised March rate of 3.3 percent. The highest rate was Maury County at 8.0 percent, up from the revised unemployment rate of 4.7 percent in March.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2020 benchmark.



Chattanooga MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Chattanooga MSA decreased by 1,100 jobs from March 2021 to April 2021. There was a decrease in local government (down 500 jobs); trade/transportation/utilities (down 400 jobs); educational & health services (down 300 jobs). These decreases were partially offset by increases in manufacturing, financial activities, and other services (all up 100 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 20,600 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 4,100 jobs while service-providing jobs increased by 16,500 jobs.

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
Knoxville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Knoxville MSA increased by 500 jobs from March 2021 to April 2021. There were increases in government (up 1,100 jobs), which includes increases of 900 jobs in local government; leisure/hospitality (up 500 jobs); mining/logging/construction (up 200 jobs).

These decreases were partially offset by a decrease of 700 jobs in both trade/transportation/utilities and educational/health services.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 31,900 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 2,600 jobs while service-providing jobs increased by 29,300 jobs.



There were increases in professional/business services (up 3,700 jobs), which includes increases of 3,600 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; leisure/hospitality (up 3,400 jobs); information (up 100 jobs)

These increases were partially offset by decreases in trade/transportation/utilities (down 1,400 jobs); mining/logging/construction (down 900 jobs); education/health services and government (both down 500 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 47,200 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 2,200 jobs, while service-providing jobs increased by 45,000 jobs.


Nashville MSA

There were increases in financial activities (up 1,000 jobs); retail trade (up 500 jobs); educational/health services (up 400 jobs), which includes increases of 300 jobs in educational services; information (up 300 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by decreases in manufacturing (down 1,500 jobs), which includes decreases of 1,400 jobs in durable good manufacturing; professional/business services (down 1,300 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 108,200 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 17,600 jobs, while service-providing jobs increased by 90,600 jobs.
