Highlights

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2022 Tennessee Occupational Employment & Wages

The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD), in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), produces annual estimates of occupational employment and wages. Using data collected by TDLWD from employers throughout Tennessee, data for May 2022 has been released.

Tennessee's May 2022 annual mean wage was \$52,820, up \$3,490 from \$49,330 in May 2021. The median wage in Tennessee also increased from \$37,700 in May 2021 to \$39,930 in May 2022.

Among the major occupational groups, the most jobs were in office and administrative support occupations. At 441,360 jobs, this was 14.1% of all jobs in Tennessee. The median annual wage in this group was \$38,220. Within this group, customer service representatives was the most common occupation at 72,620 jobs. This was the fourth highest employment of any occupation in the state. The median annual wage was \$36,630. The highest paying nonsupervisory occupation in this group was executive secretaries and executive administrative assistants with a median annual wage of \$59,380. Among the lowest paying occupations were hotel, motel and resort desk clerks (\$27,410) and receptionists and information clerks (\$29,930).

The occupational group with the highest median annual wage was management occupations (\$101,120), while food preparation and serving related occupations were the lowest at \$25,000.

The occupation with the highest median annual wage, across all occupations, was obstetricians and gynecologists at \$238,170. Healthcare practitioner occupations accounted for the eight highest median wages in Tennessee. As a group, healthcare practitioners and technical occupations represented 204,040 jobs statewide with a median annual wage of \$63,700. The lowest paying occupation in this group with more than

300 employment was psychiatric technicians (\$31,300), which is only 13.1% of the median wage for obstetricians and gynecologists. Dietic technicians had the lowest median wage across all occupations in this group at 27,710, but only had an employment of 140. At 60,840 employment, registered nurse was the most common occupation in this group, accounting for over 29.8 percent of its total employment. The median annual wage for registered nurses was \$65,800.

The most common occupation in Tennessee was laborers, freight, stock, and material movers (91,980 employment), followed by retail salespersons (82,610) and stockers and order fillers (75,050).

The occupations with the lowest median annual wages in the state were waiters and waitresses (\$20,340), and baggage porters and bellhops (\$20,990).


Production occupations had a total employment 267,540 and a median annual wage of \$38,360. Nuclear power reactor operators had the highest median wage at \$103,190 and a total employment of 330 statewide. Pressers, textile, garment, and related workers had the lowest median annual wage in the group at \$26,180 and a total employment of 270. Miscellaneous assemblers and fabricators was the most common occupation with an employment of 54,670. The mean wage for this occupation was \$37,980.

Across Tennessee's ten Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA's), only the Nashville and Knoxville MSA's had a median annual wage higher than the state median at \$44,300 and \$40,270, respectively. The Nashville MSA also had a total employment of 1,036,630, almost one-third of total statewide employment. The Cleveland MSA had the lowest median wage at \$36,400.




