New Data Puts Spotlight on Popular TN Occupations

NASHVILLE – Today, the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD), in cooperation with the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, released occupational employment and wage information for 2020. Using statistical data reported by employers across Tennessee, TDLWD analyzed information for 764 occupations in Tennessee, along with 14 metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas across the state.

Tennessee's average wage from May 2019 to May 2020 increased by more than \$1870. Tennessee's mean annual wage of \$45,653 in 2019 was topped in 2020 by the annual average of \$47,530. Tennessee's median wage in 2019 of \$35,909 also increased by \$1,531 to \$37,440.

Construction and extraction occupations had employment of over 99,000 workers in Tennessee, based on the latest information released in May 2020. This represents 3.4 percent of total state employment. Among the highest paying construction and extraction occupations with employment over 300 were elevator installers and repairers (\$73,150) and hazardous material removal workers (\$64,670). Included as some of the lowest paying construction and extraction occupations were paperhangers (\$27,780) and roofer helpers (\$27,850). The annual mean wage in Tennessee across all construction and extraction occupations was \$44,280, below the Tennessee average wage of \$47,530 and the U.S. average wage of \$56,310 for all occupations combined.

Metropolitan Statistical Areas

Metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) with the highest percentage of construction and extraction occupations were the Jackson MSA (4.0 percent) and Knoxville MSA (3.9 percent), compared with 3.4 percent of Tennessee employment.

Healthcare practitioners and technical occupations had employment of 196,770 and healthcare support occupations had employment of 98,700. Both healthcare occupational groups combined made up 10.2 percent of Tennessee employment. Registered nurses, with over 61,040 jobs, were the largest healthcare occupation. Twelve of the 15 highest paying occupations were healthcare occupations, including several physician and dental occupations with the highest annual wage reported for anesthesiologists (\$255,210). The lowest paying healthcare occupations were home health aides (\$23,130) and dietetic technicians (\$24,570).


Production occupations had total employment of 250,100 and an annual mean wage of \$38,880 across all industries in Tennessee.


2020 Median Annual Wages



Nonfarm Employment & Labor Workforce Narrative

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 82,000 jobs from March 2020 to March 2021. There were decreases in leisure & hospitality (down 43,200 jobs), which includes decreases of 27,900 jobs in food services & drinking places; educational & health services (down 19,700 jobs), which includes decreases of 14,300 jobs in health care & social assistance; government (down 13,700 jobs), which includes decreases of 11,300 jobs in local government; manufacturing (down 5,500 jobs), which includes decreases of 3,600 jobs in durable goods manufacturing.

These decreases were partially offset by increases in transportation & warehousing (up 13,300 jobs); professional/scientific/technical services (up 7,200 jobs); food & beverage stores (up 2,900 jobs); building material/garden equipment/supplies (900 jobs).

During the past month, nonfarm employment increased by 22,100 jobs. There were increases in leisure & hospitality (up 7,900 jobs), which include increases of 3,500 jobs in food services & drinking places; trade/transportation/utilities (up 5,200 jobs), which includes increases of 2,200 jobs in wholesale trade; government (up 4,200 jobs), which includes increases of 2,200 jobs in state government educational services.

These increases were partially offset by decreases in health care & social assistance (down 1,900 jobs), which includes decreases of 900 jobs in ambulatory health care services; food & beverage stores (down 500 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for March 2021 was 5.0 percent, up slightly from the revised February 2021 rate of 4.9 percent. The United States unemployment rate for March 2021 was 6.0 percent, down from the revised February 2021 rate of 6.2 percent. In March 2020, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 4.4 percent while the state rate was 4.0 percent.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased in 86 counties, decreased in 5 counties, and remained the same in 4 counties. Williamson County had the lowest rate at 3.3 percent, up from the revised February rate of 3.0 percent. The highest rate was Lake County at 8.9 percent, down from the revised unemployment rate of 9.0 percent in February.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2020 benchmark.



Chattanooga MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Chattanooga MSA increased by 1,800 jobs from February 2021 to March 2021. There was an increase in leisure/hospitality (up 600 jobs); trade/transportation/utilities (up 400 jobs); durable goods manufacturing and professional/business services (both up 300 jobs). These increases were partially offset by a decrease of 300 jobs in educational/health services.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 8,700 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs decreased by 500 jobs while service-providing jobs decreased by 8,200 jobs.

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
Knoxville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Knoxville MSA increased by 2,800 jobs from February 2021 to March 2021. There were increases in mining/logging/construction (up 800 jobs); professional/business services (up 700 jobs); leisure/hospitality (up 500 jobs); trade/transportation/utilities (up 400 jobs).

These decreases were partially offset by a decrease of 200 jobs in educational/health services, and a decrease of 100 jobs in local government.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 8,300 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs decreased by 1,400 jobs while service-providing jobs decreased by 6,900 jobs.


Total nonfarm employment in the Memphis MSA increased by 6,500 jobs from February 2021 to March 2021. There were increases in professional/business services (up 1,500 jobs), which includes increases of 900 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; mining/logging/construction (up 1,300 jobs); leisure/hospitality (up 1,200 jobs); local government (up 900 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by decreases in nondurable goods manufacturing and federal government (both down 100 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 15,000 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,700 jobs, while service-providing jobs decreased by 16,700 jobs.


Nashville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Nashville MSA increased by 8,900 jobs from February 2021 to March 2021. There were increases in leisure/hospitality and government (both up 2,600 jobs), which includes increases of 1,500 jobs in state government; trade/transportation /utilities (up 2,200 jobs), which includes increases of 1,400 jobs in wholesale trade.

These increases were partially offset by a decrease of 700 jobs in administrative/support/waste management, and a decrease of 400 jobs in management of companies & enterprises.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 29,400 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 2,100 jobs, while service-providing jobs decreased by 27,300 jobs.
