## **Annual Average Nonfarm Employment**

The Bureau of Labor Statistics cooperates with the state agencies in the Current Employment Statistics (CES) program, or establishment survey, to collect data each month on employment, hours, and earnings from a sample of nonfarm establishments. The CES sample is stratified by state, industry, and size. The strata, or groups, are composed of homogeneous units that include 13 NAICS industries and eight size classes. The sample is drawn from the universe of about 9 million business establishments covered by unemployment insurance. The data collected are classified in accordance with the 2007 North American Industry Classification System.

Employment data are collected for persons on payrolls who receive pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th day of the month. The data excludes proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid volunteer or family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers. Sala-

ried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees as military personnel are excluded. Persons on paid sick, holiday, or paid vacation leave are included. Persons who are laid off, on leave without pay, or on strike are excluded.

Page 2 shows a table with annual average nonfarm data spanning the last five years of the decade for the four major and the six smaller Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs).

#### **Current Data**

Of Tennessee's large metro areas, the Nashville MSA (732,900) has the most employment and the Chattanooga MSA (229,200) has the least.

Last year, the nonfarm employment increased in three of these large MSAs. This followed two consecutive years of decline. The largest increase occurred in Nashville (up 6,900 jobs). This included increases in professional and business services (up 5,300 jobs) and education and

health services (up 3,400 jobs).

Only the Memphis MSA declined in 2010. It was the third consecutive employment drop in the Bluff City. Memphis' employment has decreased by 54,100 jobs since 2007. This includes last year's decrease of 14,400 jobs. Last year's job losses were in trade, transportation, and utilities (down 3,600 jobs); leisure and hospitality (down 3,200 jobs); and manufacturing (down 2,200 jobs). Goodsproducing industries declined each successive vear in all four MSAs.

In the smaller MSAs, the area with the largest nonfarm employment was Kingsport-Bristol (116,600) and the smallest nonfarm employment was in Cleveland (39,300). In four of these smaller MSAs, the increase/decrease could have been due to rounding. Only Clarksville (up 1,300 jobs, or 1.6 percent) and Kingsport-Bristol (down 1,300 jobs, or -1.1 percent) had significant changes from the previous year.







## NONFARM EMPLOYMENT AND LABOR FORCE IN TENNESSEE

Total nonfarm employment increased by 5,700 jobs from May 2010 to May 2011. This includes increases in health care/social assistance (up 7,100 jobs), which includes increases of 2,900 jobs in nursing/residential care facilities and 2,500 jobs in ambulatory health care services; transportation/warehousing (up 6,800 jobs); mining/logging/ construction (up 4,700 jobs); food services/ drinking places (up 4,600 jobs); transportation equipment manufacturing (up 2,300 jobs); durable goods wholesalers and food/beverage stores (both up 1,800 jobs); and management of companies/enterprises (up 1,600 jobs). This was partially offset by decreases in federal government (down 12,500 jobs), local government (down 4,100 jobs), administrative/ support/waste management (down 3,500 jobs), retail trade (down 2,600 jobs), and accommodation and printing/related activities (both down 1,000 jobs).

During May, nonfarm employment increased by 7,600 jobs. This included seasonal gains in food services/drinking places (up 3,700 jobs), arts/entertainment/recreation (up 2,000 jobs), administrative/support/waste management and mining/logging/construction (both up 1,900 jobs), and other services and financial activities (both up 1,200 jobs). This was partially offset by declines in educational services (down 2,600 jobs), state government educational services and professional/scientific/technical services (both down 2,000 jobs), and clothing/clothing accessories stores (down 1,000 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for May 2011 was 9.7 percent, up 0.1 percent from the revised April 2011 rate.

The United States' unemployment rate was 9.1 percent in May 2011. In May 2010, the national unemployment rate was 9.7 percent, and the state's unemployment rate was 9.8 percent.

Across Tennessee, the unemployment rate decreased in 56 counties, increased in 24 counties, and remained the same in 15 counties. There were 30 counties with an unemployment rate less than 10 percent, and one county had a rate at or above 15 percent. In April, the lowest rate occurred in Lincoln County at 6.1 percent, down 0.5 percent from the previous month. The highest rate was Scott County's 20.8 percent, down from 22.1 percent in April 2011. Over the past 12 months, Dyer County had the greatest increase in its unemployment rate (up 2.6 percent).

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data is based on the 2010 benchmark.



Total nonfarm employment decreased by 700 jobs from April 2011 to May 2011. There were decreases in educational/health services (down 900 jobs), retail trade (down 300 jobs) and state government and professional/business services (both down 200 jobs). This was partially offset by an increase in leisure/hospitality (up 300 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 1,600 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 200, while service-providing jobs increased by 1,800.



Total nonfarm employment increased by 900 jobs from April 2011 to May 2011. There were seasonal increases in leisure/hospitality (up 800 jobs) and mining/logging/construction, educational/health services, and local government (each up 200 jobs). This was partially offset by declines in state government (down 700 jobs) and retail trade (down 400 jobs).

Over the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 3,800 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs declined by 400, while service-providing jobs increased by 4,200.



Total nonfarm employment increased by 1,300 jobs from April 2011 to May 2011. There were seasonal increases in mining/logging/ construction (up 1,400 jobs), administrative/ support/waste management (up 1,200 jobs), local government (up 500 jobs), leisure/ hospitality (up 400 jobs), durable goods manufacturing (up 300 jobs), and transportation/ warehousing/utilities, financial activities, and other services (each up 200 jobs). This was partially offset by decreases in state government (down 1,700 jobs), educational/health services (down 900 jobs), and retail trade (down 300 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 9,500 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,000, while service-providing jobs declined by 10,500.



Total nonfarm employment increased by 2,900 jobs from April 2011 to May 2011. There were seasonal increases in leisure/hospitality (up 1,100 jobs); financial activities (up 700 jobs); other services (up 600 jobs); administrative/support/waste management and mining/logging/construction (both up 500 jobs); and durable goods manufacturing and health care/social assistance (both up 400 jobs). This was partially offset by declines in state government (down 700 jobs), educational services (down 500 jobs), and retail trade (down 400 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 7,000 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,400, while service-providing jobs increased by 5,600.
