## Vintage 2022 U.S. and State Population Estimates

### About Population Estimates

The U.S. Census Bureau recently released its Vintage 2022 population estimates for the nation and all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. With each annual release of population estimates, the Population Estimates Program revises and updates the entire time series of estimates from April 1, 2020 to July 1 of the current year, which is referred to as the vintage year.

Among the uses for these estimates are federal funding allocations, as controls for major surveys including the Current Population Survey and the American Community Survey (ACS), community development, to aid business planning, and as denominators for statistical rates.

### **National and Regional Population**

Between July 1, 2021, and July 1, 2022, the total U.S. resident population increased 1,256,003, or about 0.4 percent. This left the total U.S. resident population for 2022 at 333,287,557. The South region was home to 38.6% of all U.S. residents and grew by nearly 1.4 million residents between 2021 and 2022. The Northeast and Midwest regions both lost residents while the West gained just over 153,000 residents.

### **Declining States**

Among the 50 states, 18 lost population between 2021 and 2022. New York lost the most population with a decline 180,341 residents. California lost the second most at 113,649, followed by Illinois at 104,437. These were the only states to lose over 100,000 residents. New York also had the highest percentage loss in population in 2022 at 0.9 percent. New York, Illinois, Louisiana, and West Virginia all lost over 0.5 percent of state population. Perhaps surprising to some, Hawaii followed right behind those four states with a decline 0.48 percent. Despite California's population decline it is still the most populous state having nearly 9 million more residents than Texas, the second most populous state.

### **Growing States**

Among the 32 states that experienced a population increase in 2022, Texas gained the most residents adding 470,708. Florida followed close behind adding 416,754. In percentage terms, Florida led the way with a 1.9 percent population increase. Florida and Texas were among six states to see increases of over 1.5 percent. The others being Idaho, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Montana. A dozen states grew at a rate over 1 percent, including Tennessee at just under 1.2 percent. Tennessee's growth rate was the 11<sup>th</sup> highest in the nation.

### **National Rankings**

Only four states saw its national ranking change due to population changes in 2022. Maryland's ranking dropped from the 18<sup>th</sup> most populous state to 19<sup>th</sup> while Missouri took its place moving from 19<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup>. Massachusetts dropped from 15<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> while Tennessee took its place as the 15<sup>th</sup> most populous state, moving up from 16<sup>th</sup> in 2021.

California's over 39 million residents places it as the most populous state in the nation. Texas, Florida, New York, and Pennsylvania round out the five most populous states. Over 37 percent of the national population resided in these five states. Wyoming's 581,381 residents was the lowest in the nation. Vermont, Alaska, North Dakota, and South Dakota round out the five least populous states in 2022. Just over 1 percent of the nation's total population resided in these five states.
