Facts about U.S. Veterans

World War I officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919. However, seven months earlier, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, fighting between Allied nations and Germany ceased with an armistice, a temporary cessation of hostilities. That is why November 11.1918 was considered the end of "the war to end all wars." In November of 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed that November 11 would be the commemoration of Armistice Day. The day would be observed with parades, public gatherings, and a brief suspension of business at 11:00 am. Congress would eventually recognize the annual observance of Armistice Day on June 4, 1926, but it wouldn't be until May 13, 1938 that Congress would make it an official legal holiday. By 1954, after World War II and the Korean War, legislation was approved to have November 11 become a day to honor all American veterans. On October 8, 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the first "Veterans Day Proclamation." The following information is about these men and women who served our country.

Veteran Demographics

Among the 18.5 million U.S. veterans, 2.4 million (13.2 percent) were black or African American, 15.1 million (81.7 percent) were white, 1.5 million were Hispanic (7.9 percent), and 0.3 million (1.6 percent) were Asian. In 2021, 8.6 million veterans were 65 years and older while 1.8 million were under 35. Women accounted for 10.7 percent of all veterans. The states where the greatest share of the age 18 and older population were veterans were Wyoming and Montana (both 11.5 percent), Alaska (11.3 percent), Virginia (10.7 percent), New Mexico (10.4 percent), and South Carolina (10.1 percent). Texas had the most veterans with 1.7 million but ranked 35th in terms of percentage of population. Florida had the second most with 1.4 million veterans, but ranked 31st at 8.0 percent of the state's population. Tennessee had 474,000 veterans and ranked 19th at 8.9% of the population.

As of August 2021, 4.9 million veterans (27.0 percent) had a service-connected disability.

Among those with a service-connected disability, 23.3 percent reported a disability rating less than 30 percent, while 46.8 percent had a rating of 60 percent or greater. A higher rating represents greater severity of disability.

When Veterans Served

Veterans have served in both war and peacetime. Veterans who served during World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam era comprised about 35.6 percent of all veterans (6.6 million) in 2021. Veterans who served during the Gulf War era I (August 1990 to August 2001) or during the Gulf War era II (September 2001 to the present) made up about 42.5 percent (7.9 million) of all veterans. About 22 percent (4.1 million) served outside of the designated wartime periods.

Veterans in the Labor Force

Nationally, veterans were unemployed at a rate of 4.4 percent in 2021 and participated in the labor force at a rate of 47.7 percent. By contrast, nonveterans participated in the labor force at a rate of 64.1 percent, but were more often unemployed at 5.3 percent. In Tennessee, the labor force participation rate for veterans was 47.4 percent with an unemployment rate of 3.0 percent. This compares to 62.6 percent and 4.0 percent, respectively, for nonveterans in Tennessee. The states with the highest unemployment rates for veterans in 2021 were Washington (7.6 percent), Nevada (7.4 percent), Rhode Island (7.0 percent), New Mexico (6.8 percent), California and Massachusetts (both 6.4 percent). Those with the lowest rates were Kentucky (1.6 percent), Alabama (2.1 percent), Maryland (2.2 percent), Connecticut (2.3 percent), Minnesota and Nebraska (both 2.4 per-

Of the over 8.4 million employed veterans in the U.S., 22.9 percent worked in the public sector. The next largest share of employment was in manufacturing at 12.1 percent. Among employed women, 30.5 percent worked in the public sector and 24.0 percent worked in education and health services.




